# Committee's Annual Report.

## TO THE SUBSCRIBERS:

**T**HIS, the forty-fourth annual report submitted for your information has closed a year, the annals of which from drought and misfortune to the farming community and general public of Victoria have never since the inception of your institution been experienced. With this great disadvantage we still have pleasure in stating that the appeals for assistance have been generously responded to, and the voluntary contributions are well up to the average. The statement of receipts and expenditure—the audited copy of which we now place before you—shows for the past year ending 30th June, 1903, a considerable increase in the cost of maintenance, and a corresponding decrease in revenue. The total amount of ordinary revenue amounts to £1617 6s 7d, and that of ordinary expenditure to £1978 19s 9d, thus showing a loss for the year of £361 13s 2d, to which sum may be added the extraordinary expenditure of £193 17s 8d, principally caused through the necessity for removal of a large portion of the roof of the hospital and relaying same with mostly new material. This would bring your total loss for twelve months to £555 10s 10d. This is a marked falling off in comparison with the transactions of the year ending 30th June, 1902, which resulted in the gain of a sum of £45 7s 11d ordinary revenue clear of all expenditure. It does not take long to account for the past year's loss of revenue. A reduction of £210 from the Government subsidy, £25 (or half the usual amount) from the Stawell Borough Council grant, and the contribution from the Stawell Shire Council, *nil*, together with a deficiency in the proceeds from entertainments and the collections on Hospital Sundays, make up a loss in ordinary revenue of £354 17s 7d. Before closing this paragraph we must certainly record our regret that the local municipalities, those to whom we naturally look for efficient support, have been so far unable to subscribe to your charity as generously as in previous years. On the other hand it gives us pleasure to state that the Danmunkle and Avoca Shire Councils have forwarded the usual annual grant without reduction, viz., £32 and £7 7s respectively.

The relief afforded from the 1st July, 1902, was as follows:—In-patients, 349; out-patients (new cases), 363; number of attendances of out-patients, 1757. The daily average of in-patients was 42, and the average cost per head per annum was £40 13s 3d. The cost of new outdoor cases was 7s 4d per head, or a fraction over 1s 6d per visit. Death has carried off forty-one, including a number of the old inmates in the benevolent ward.

One of the oldest members of committee has been taken from our midst. We refer to the death of the late Mr Thomas Kinella (who held the office of president in the year 1878). By his death your institution has lost an able and generous supporter, an energetic committee-man, and a deep sympathiser in all matters connected with your charity. The hospital has also lost a friend by the death of Dr. W. H. Syme, who—though not at the time of his death—acted for many years as one of your honorary surgeons, and his memory is adorned with many kindly acts to your institution.

Though death has been the means of carrying from us the living interest of many who resided in Stawell, still the memory of a few is kept green in your annals, and the good displayed in life has been perpetuated by monetary bequests that will help in building up a fund which will be a stand-by in seasons of dire distress. It gives us pleasure to record the receipt of the following:—£500 from the late Mrs. Mary E. Hobbs' estate; £100 from that of the late Mr. John Humphreys, which covers further benefits; £50 from the late Mr. Thomas Kinsella; £20 from T. Casey's estate, through the Rev. Father Howell; and £60 from the Edward Wilson Charity Fund. For the first item, in accordance with your bye-laws, Messrs Albert, William and George Hobbs have been created life governors, and the executors of the will of the late John Humphreys, Messrs H. Henderson and L. C. Phillips, have also been added to that honored list.

It has been suggested that the voluntary subscriptions and donations be advertised in the local press each month. This suggestion we deem good, and consider the publicity thus given will be an excellent check on each month's takings, instead of—as at present—waiting until the annual report is issued to verify each item subscribed.

The annual printed report, we consider, would bear curtailment. The cost is considerable for so many pages, and the information given is not an equivalent. We would suggest that the list of officers, committees' report, balance-sheet, and individual subscriptions be sufficient to have printed and to issue to the subscribers.

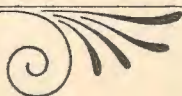
We deem it necessary that a revision of the bye-laws of your institution be undertaken by the incoming committee with a view of simplifying their construction.

You will be called upon to elect a president, two vice-presidents, and honorary treasurer, those at present holding office retiring by effluxion of time, but are eligible for re-election. During the past year the vacancy on the committee caused by the death of Mr Thomas Kinsella was filled by the election of his son, Mr. W. Jennings Kinsella. You will be asked to confirm the appointment, as also that of Mr Ainslie, who was appointed auditor in lieu of Mr P. Q. Kempson resigned. It will be necessary to take a ballot of the names of those gentlemen who have been longest in office on the committee to determine who are to retire, and who, together with Mr Kinsella, who also retires, are eligible for re-election.

We have again to record our appreciation of the work done during the year in connection with the hospital by the honorary surgeons and the staff generally. The whole work has been done with such efficiency as to commend itself to all the members of your committee who have been brought into close contact with it during the year.
