

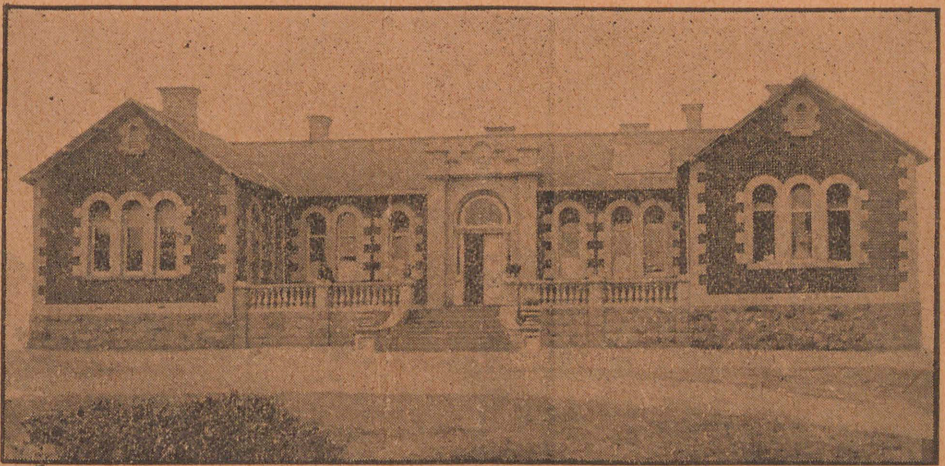

ANNUAL REPORT.

TO THE SUBSCRIBERS—

AT this, the forty-seventh annual meeting of the institution, your committee beg to place before you the financial statement for the year ending 30th June, 1906, showing the receipts and expenditure for that period, and the position as to assets and liabilities at the closing of accounts.

The financial statement is fully and clearly set out in the attached balance-sheet.

For your information, and in order the more easily to arrive at the position of the year just ended, as compared with the financial transactions of past years, a tabulated statement has been made out under the various headings of ordinary receipts and expenditure for the last and two former years:—

In expenditure there has been an all-round reduction, £162 less than 1904-5, and £258 less than 1903-4.

In receipts the Government grant (£1010) includes £210 belonging to 1904-5; this grant was reduced by £30 from 1904-5, and £110 from 1903-4. Other sources of revenue may be deemed satisfactory, though showing a slight reduction on former years.

ENDOWMENT FUND.—This fund has been reduced by £500, withdrawn at the request of the Honorable the Treasurer of Victoria in order to obtain £250 special grant to effect necessary improvements. The fund now stands at £1750, represented by Government securities.

BUILDING FUND.—For alterations, renovations and improvements, the sum of £341 10/- has been expended, leaving a balance of £158 10/- still available, besides the promised £250 special grant which will be paid over on the expenditure of £500.

BEQUESTS AND SPECIAL DONATIONS.—A bequest of £100 was received from the estate of the late W. H. Richards, and placed by request to endowment fund. The principal items under the heading of special donations were as follows:—Stawell Athletic Club, £105; trustees of the Edward Wilson estate, £40; executors of the late Alexander Dennis, £25; Amalgamated Miners of Austrslia (annual conference), £7 10/-; Loyal Wimmera Lodge I.O.O.F. (general session), £6 13/4; Victorian Railways Mutual Benefit Society, £5; Ancient Order of Druids Gala, £5.

LIFE GOVERNORS—The executors to the will of the late William Henry Richards, namely, the Reverend James Rickard and Mr R. J. Donelan, were made Life Governors, also Messrs Frederick Crouch and G. T. Robertson as representatives of the Stawell Athletic Club.

Deep regret is felt in recording the death of the late Mr Joseph Cawley. By the demise of Mr Cawley the Hospital has lost an energetic committeeman, and one who always took a deep and lively interest in the management and affairs of the institution. Regret is also sincerely expressed at the death of Mr Andrew Selkirk, late of Minyip, who represented the hospital as a member of the Country Committee in that district for many years.

During the past year several important vacancies have been filled on the hospital staff. Dr. Alexander Cook was appointed Resident Surgeon to fill the position last held by Dr. W. L. Aitken, and Miss I. Robertson was appointed Matron after the resignation of Miss D. Couden.

At your last annual meeting mention was made of an exhaustive report being received from the Central Board of Health treating on alterations necessary to the hospital; since then, at the request of the committee, a further inspection was made by an officer from the Public Health Department, and on the strength of these reports, concurrent with your approval, considerable repairs have been effected. As a commencement of a thorough overhauling of the hospital on modern lines, No. 1 and 2 wards and the committee room had the whole of the ceilings taken down and replaced with fibrous plaster, new ventilators were fixed and the walls cleaned down and re-painted. In the kitchen the old range was removed and one of more modern make built in, which has been found to be more suitable, consumes less firewood, and greatly minimises the heat that was formerly almost unbearable. A complete new hot water service in connection with the kitchen range has been installed and carried to various parts of the building, and has proved effective. Several minor works

were done, making up the sum of expenditure shown in the building fund. A further contract, on the same lines, has been let at the sum of £366—covering the re-plastering of the ceilings in the passages, corridors, and rooms of the front building, and the male ward of the Benevolent Asylum, a thorough system of ventilation in all wards and rooms, re-painting, supplying and fixing three enamel baths, and erecting two sun shades for convalescents in the grounds. The present bath rooms have been reported on most unfavorably, therefore it will be necessary to erect new ones conveniently attached to several wards. It is contemplated to have the operating theatre enlarged by taking in the adjoining bath room and carrying out the front somewhat in the shape of a bow window. A suitable electric bell or telephone service is deemed necessary in the various wards, and to the doctor's residence.

In the report of the Board of Health before mentioned, and by the Inspector of Charities, the present laundry has been condemned; this will require consideration on some early date.

Your committee are of opinion now the alterations have been undertaken no expense should be spared to make the Stawell Hospital a thorough up to-date institution, and furnished with all modern appliances.

FURNISHING—For the operating theatre a new sterilizer and a number of new instruments were obtained, at a cost of £27 14/6. A portable standard enamel bath and an Alfred bed carriage were bought for £14 and £6 respectively. Several other articles were purchased, making a total cost of new furnishings £68 4/10.

During the year the garden in both its departments has ministered to the efficiency and comfort of the hospital. During the warmer months, patients, when approaching the convalescent stage, enjoy the freshness of the well kept lawn and flower garden, and from the vegetable garden a never failing supply of vegetables is provided for the use of the hospital staff and the patients.

In conclusion your committee beg to sincerely thank all those who have so generously contributed towards the support of your institution.

The Resident Surgeon reports as follows :—

IN reviewing the work of the hospital for the year 1905-6 it will be noticed that the total number of in-patients was slightly behind that of the previous year. This was due mainly to two facts. Firstly, the great decrease of infectious cases, more particularly as regards typhoid fever, and secondly, the closing of the consumptive ward tended to still further decrease the number. On the surgical side there have been performed fifty odd operations, and if it were possible to still further equip and enlarge the operating room, the performances of operations would be greatly facilitated.

Two of the trainees of this hospital were successful in passing the examinations conducted by the Royal Victorian Trained Nurses' Association, held at Ballarat. The other trainees have acquitted themselves well at examinations held at the hospital during the year. They have also been regular in their attendance at course of lectures and demonstrations delivered by the staff at the hospital.
