71st ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

STAWELL & DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

To Life Governors and Annual Subscribers.

Ladies and Gentlemen.—

In presenting the seventy-first Annual Report and Balance Sheet, the Board of Management notes with pleasure the splendid support which has been so consistently given by all sections of the community, and desires to express thanks to all those who have assisted the Hospital during the year.

The year opened with a debit balance in the Maintenance Account of £131/16/2. The Receipts from all sources for the Maintenance Account amounted to £2,708/12/4, and the Expenditure to £2,590/15/3, leaving a credit balance at the Union Bank of £11/10/6.

The Stawell Brass Band contributed £154/18/8 from their appeals, and the Ladies' Auxilliary £34/14/5.

Receipts for the Building Fund amounted to £1,289/4/7, and Expenditure to £52/12/8. We invested £1,550 on fixed deposit during the year (including 1929 credit balance at Savings Bank of £400/9/), and have a balance at the Savings Bank of £86/11/ on 30th June. This, with all other investments, totals £8,136/0/11 for the Building Account.

During the year 395 In-patients and 62 Out-patients were treated.

HOSPITAL BUILDING FUND

The New Hospital Building Committee did good work during 1929, and closed the Appeal on December 30th. The Building Fund now stands at £8,136/0/11. The contributions thereto are shown in the report. The Board of Management has definitely decided to build an entirely new single storey Hospital on the present site, but facing Thornfedt Street. It is proposed to build the essential service block, maternity and special

wards as soon as the Charities Board can provide portion of the cost. During the year Mr. C. L. McVilly—Inspector of Charities—visited and inspected the building. He expressed himself in approval of what has been done, and was of the opinion that an entirely new structure was necessary.

WOOD BEE

A wood-bee was held during March, 1930, and every arrangement possible was made for its success. The number attending was a cause for disappointment. There is a great number of young men who in the past have been well served by the Stawell Hospital, who could have given their assistance to so worthy an object. Were it not for work done by some twenty helpers from Navarre and district, the whole affair would have been a failure. The organisers are particularly grateful to the Navarre contingent for what they did, and to the following for trucks of wood donated:—Messrs. Trickey Bros., G. P. McKay and D. S. Morris, Glenorchy; Mr. J. Bennett, Stawell; Messrs Burton and Bush, Pomonal; Mr. P. Repper, Stawell.

COMMUNITY HOSPITAL

On May 1st., 1930, with the approval of the Charities Board, the Stawell District Hospital was declared a Community Hospital, conditional that no indigent patient was denied admittance through paying patients occupying the beds. The position varies but little from what was done previously. In the past in a State aided institution, the intermediate or private patient had no legal right; to-day the hospital can be legally made use of by all sections of the community, and a medical officer can make his own arrangements in regard to charge with the intermediate or private patient. As the community scheme become more popular the Board of Management is hopeful

of the annual income being strengthened and the hospital functions being enlarged.

LADIES' AUXILIARY

The members of the Ladies' Auxiliary have continued their good work and interest in the welfare of the Stawell Hospital, contributing during the year £100 to the Building Fund, and providing all linen and crockery requirements for the past twelve months.

RESIGNATIONS

During the year Rev. J. Walsh resigned as a member of the Board of Management owing to being absent overseas for twelve months. For twenty-five years he has been a zealous and energetic member and in accepting his resignation the members elected him a Life Governor for services rendered.

Owing to ill-health Mr. R. M. Sewell, vice-president, resigned. Members accepted his resignation with regret, and expressed the hope that when restored to health he would again join the Board of Management.
