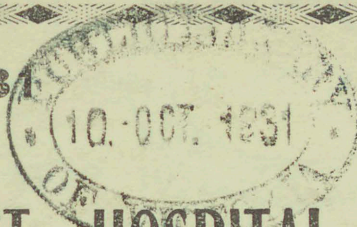


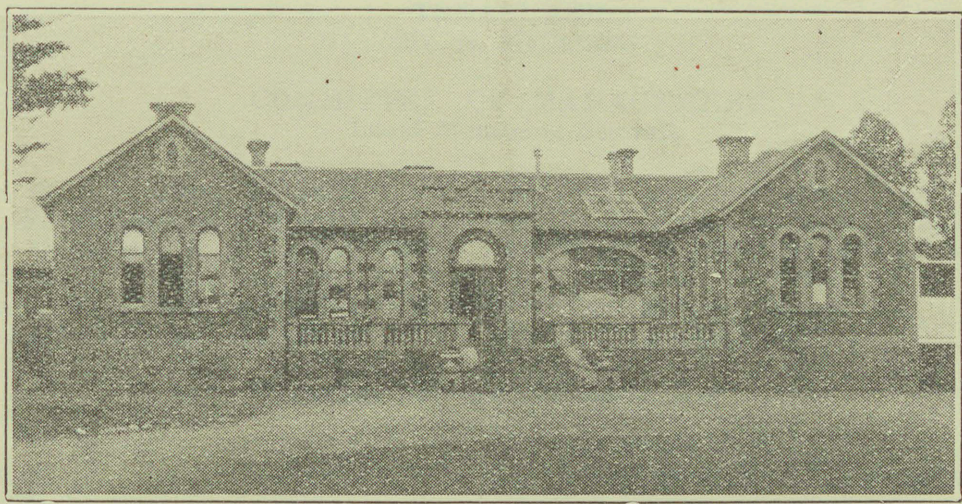

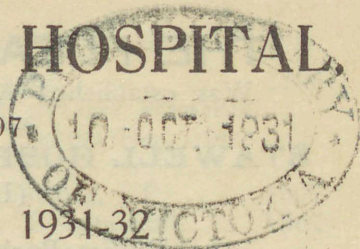

Ladies and Gentlemen—

In presenting the 72nd Annual Report and Balance Sheet, the Board of Management wishes to acknowledge with pleasure the splendid support that has been so consistently given by all sections of the community, and desires to express its thanks to those individuals, societies, and institutions who have so ably assisted the hospital during the year under review.

FINANCE

The year opened with a credit balance of £11/16/9 in the Maintenance Account and closed with a credit balance of £42/0/1. The receipts amounted to £2501/18/8, and expenditure to £2474/12/1.

BUILDING

Receipts for the Building Fund totalled £597/6/6, and expenditure £82 5/-. We bought Commonwealth Bonds of face value of £4750 with the Fixed Deposits of £3500 and £1000 which matured on 23rd January. The Bonds will fall due in December of this year. The total amount held on behalf of the Building Account is £8823/16/3.

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT
CHANGES

During the year Messrs. J. Dalziel, I. H. Short, P. A. Gill, and G. A. Bone resigned from the Board of Management, and their places were filled by Messrs. W. G. Sharpley, N. Spring, A. H. McMurtrie, and N. McCallum. We wish to place on record the good work the former members have at all times done for the Institution, and to congratulate ourselves on securing the assistance of the latter-named gentlemen.

LADIES' AUXILIARY

The members of the Ladies' Auxiliary have continued their good work and interest in the welfare of the Hospital. They provided all linen and

crockery requirements for the year, as well as a number of medical and other comforts. The amount handed over totalling £59/15/7 and also the sum of £16/9/6 profit from the Ball run for the maintenance account last year, and £5 for Christmas Cheer through the Matron for the patients. We wish to acknowledge with gratitude the good work of the president (Mrs. J. Young), secretary (Mrs. A. Neil), treasurer (Mrs. J. Bennett), and the splendid committee and band of helpers who have worked so consistently for the benefit of the sick.

ACTING MATRON

During the year leave of absence was granted to Matron M. I. Lang for nine months, in order to obtain further nursing qualifications. We are pleased to state that she was most successful and will recommence duty during July. During her absence her place was filled in a most capable manner by Miss I. Hall who has carried out all duties to the entire satisfaction of the medical officers and Board of Management.

BENEFACTIONS

During the year the following benefactions were made to the funds of the Institution. The "Home to Stawell" committee donated £100 of its profits to the Institution, Mr. William Dixon, £25; Mrs. Jean McMurtrie Chadwick, £50. Members of the A.W.A. Lodge per Miss H. Calder, £15/11/11 towards the cost of fly wiring the women's verandah; Miss Helen Good, £3/10/- doll competition; executors late Patrick Ballard, £11/7/-.

SPECIAL ASSISTANCE

Members of the Male Choir were instrumental in raising £10/5/- by a series of concerts. Mr. A. Whiteside, by throwing open his wonderful Begonia Hot house, to the public, secured by means of a Hospital Box, £12

13/8 for the maintenance account. The Nhill Brass Band and the Stawell Brass Band formed the nucleus for raising £27/2/- at the Easter Sunday Hospital appeal whilst the latter Band as in past years, held Hospital Sunday Appeals at District centres with splendid success. The total amount collected being £114/17/5. Mr. C. Ridd sent in £3/13/- from a concert held at Wal Wal. The Stawell Football Club contributed the sum of £3/4/9 from their charity match, whilst an amount of £2/10/- was forwarded from the Great Western Race Club per Mr. L. H. Grellet, secretary.

INTERMEDIATE PATIENTS

We are pleased to report that this side of the Institution undertaken almost experimentally, has proved a huge financial success. Were it not for the admission of this class of patient, the Hospital would not be in the fortunate financial position that it now is.

BUILDING ACCOUNT

The amount in hand for building and reconstruction is now £8823/16/3. On the advice of the Charities Board, at a special meeting of Life Governors and Subscribers, the motion agreed to on the 8th May, 1928, was rescinded. This means that instead of undertaking a completely new building, the members of the Board of Management will attempt to re-construct the present building in order that it may function as a thoroughly efficient Community Hospital, complete in all respects. Provided the Charities Board can secure from the Treasury the necessary additional money, this work should be commenced before the end of the present year.

GENERAL

In the history of the Hospital, never has the need been greater for a resolve on the part of each individual that the Hospital services must not be curtailed in any respect, rather should they be strengthened and expanded. The large amount of un-employment is necessarily responsible for increasing the numbers who are dependent on the Hospital for nursing and medical

attention. Patients, who previously were able to pay in full are now able only to pay in part for medical treatment and many of those who hitherto contributed something towards their up-keep are now not in a position to pay anything. This can be readily seen from the following comparison: In 1929-30, average weekly contributions of Public Hospital In-patients for treatment was 14/2. In 1930-31 the amount was 10/6 per week at our hospital. As well, the public purse is being drained more than ever for other charitable appeals, to such an extent that the claims of the hospital are in danger of being overlooked. In common with other hospital committees, we feel that it was doubly wrong of the Government to cut down the annual grant, rather should it have been increased at a time when so many can pay little or nothing for hospital treatment.

Your thanks are due to the members of the Stawell Brass Band in connection with their services at the Hospital Sunday Appeals, to the various car-owners for free conveyance of bandsmen and committeemen, to the ladies of the country centres for afternoon tea provided for bandsmen and visitors, to Messrs E. Potter and J. A. Punchard of Campbell's Bridge, to Mr. E. T. Hutchings, of Green's Creek; Cr. J. C. Hutchings, of Callawadda; Mr. J. May, of Joel, for undertaking collection of donations in their own districts; to the members of the Stawell Male Choir, to Mr. A. W. Whiteside for revenue raised, to the members of the Ladies' Auxiliary for the good work done since its inception, and to Mr. J. Bennett for organising a Fruit Appeal whereby 89 tins of fruit were secured for the Stawell Hospital; to the local press for free copies of their issues for the Institution, and valued publicity given all matters pertaining to the

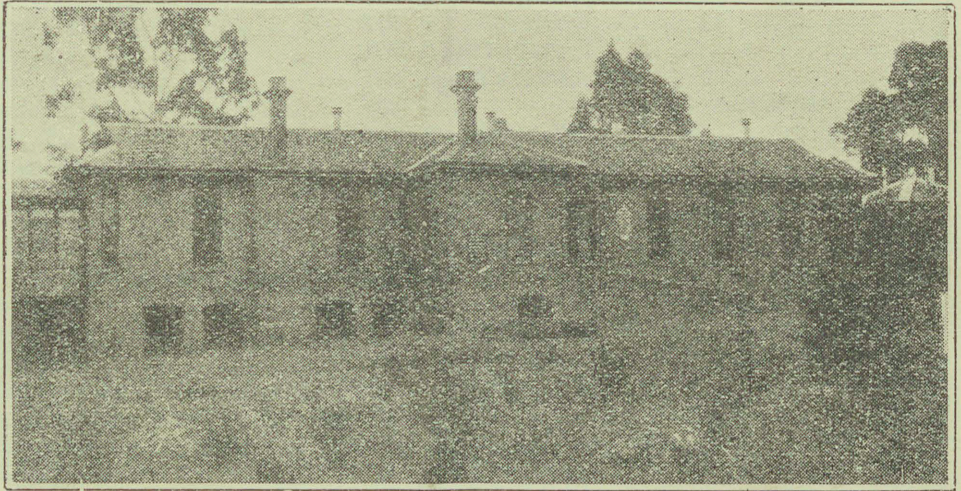
