76th ANNUAL REPORT

**To Life Governors
and Subscribers**

Ladies and Gentlemen—

In presenting the 76th Annual Report and Balance Sheet the Board of Management wishes to again express gratification that the year has closed with a credit balance in the maintenance account.

MAINTENANCE

The receipts amounted to £2965/3/6 and expenditure to £3083/4/3, leaving a credit balance at the Union Bank of £192/8/1. Receipts increased by £593/3/11, and expenditure increased by £619/6/1 on last year's figures.

The Government Grant was increased by £173 (part of this amount in recognition of the maintenance of the 73 sustenance workers who were in hospital for a total of 600 days in 1934).

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT

During the year we accepted the resignation of the President (Mr O'Connor) owing to his promotion to Castlemaine. This was a great loss to us as Mr O'Connor was a tireless worker in the interests of the hospital. Mr Pickersgill also resigned as a committee-man, owing to his acceptance of a position in Geelong, and the Rev G. Paterson Campbell accepted a call to Yarrawonga and resigned in consequence. To fill these vacancies Mr Bennett was appointed president by the Board of Management, and Mr A. P. Spring was appointed as vice-president, and Messrs H. Ferrier, J. G. Macdonald and J. H. Webb were appointed to the vacancies on the committee.

LADIES' AUXILIARY

This organisation was re-formed this year with a very enthusiastic committee retaining the help of many of the past loyal workers. Mrs Spring was appointed president, Mesdames S. P. Freeland, J. Bennett, J. G. Macdonald and A. Neil as vice-presidents, Mrs N. W. McCallum as treasurer, and Mrs L. H. Cook as secretary. £48/18/2 was expended on our requirements last year.

PATIENTS

Relief was afforded 590 patients during the year, this being 64 more cases than last year. Of this number 147 were paying or intermediate cases, as against 83 last year. Fifteen paying obstetrical cases and 32 public obstetrical patients are included in the numbers for this year.

SPECIAL ASSISTANCE

The annual Hospital Ball held on 21st June, 1934, in aid of maintenance funds, was a very great success. The sum of £88/0/1 was handed in. Special thanks are due to the committee for their interest and hard work. In recognition of the effort, Mrs Freeland (Maire) and Mr E. O'Driscoll were appointed Life Governors of the Institution. The Stawell Brass Band on its visits to country centres and in conjunction with the Hawthorn City Band at Stawell at Easter time, was instrumental in £72/13/1 being added to our funds. Mr Spiller gave us the proceeds of a night with his Merry-go-round, which resulted in a profit of £6/14/6. Green's Creek Junior Red Cross Circle, through L. Stewart, forwarded £2/1/9 in May, and a further 9/- was received this month from the same source. The Great Western

Hospital Auxiliary presented us with a Hospital overbed table costing £2/15/-. It is suitably inscribed in recognition of the work done by the late Miss Eliza Porter—their first secretary. A dance held at the 'Overdale' wool shed in October last, brought us £1/15/6 per Messrs A. and M. Holden, for all of which the Board expresses satisfaction.
