# 77th ANNUAL REPORT

## OF THE

### STAWELL DISTRICT HOSPITAL

For the Year ended 30th JUNE, 1936

To Life Governors and Subscribers,  
Ladies and Gentlemen,

In presenting the 77th Annual Report and Balance Sheet, the Board of Management wishes to again express pleasure that the year has closed with a credit balance in the Maintenance Account.

#### MAINTENANCE

The receipts amounted to £3646/13/8, and expenditure to £3515/7/6, leaving a credit balance at the Union Bank of £352/1/7. Receipts increased by £681/10/2, and expenditure increased by £430/3/3 on last year's figures. The Government Grant was £202 less than last year, owing to no special claim being made for relief camp workers, and the June quarterly instalment not being received before the close of the financial year.

#### BUILDING

Special receipts for the Building Fund were £51 from the Charities Board for proportion of cost of glazing in the four verandahs and £4/6/8 from the Executors of the Estate of the late Albert Barnes.

Payments on account of the Building, Equipment and Interest Fund amounted to £26/19/4. The refrigerator installed at a cost of £117/10/- was paid from Maintenance account, as also were the glazing in of verandahs and minor alterations at a cost of £132/17/11, towards which the North Western Woollen Mills made a special donation of £150 from the £265 handed over to the Board of Management. A special appeal for meeting interest and sinking fund on the £1500 loan for equipment has been

inaugurated with a 10/- Debenture issue, non-redeemable and non-interest bearing. To date £24/16/6 has been received and £50 more is required before September. We commend the appeal to our charitable minded people.

#### BOARD OF MANAGEMENT

No changes in the personnel of the Board of Management took place during the past year, but Mr. Sharpley has now resigned, and we express appreciation of his services throughout the six years he has been a member and Vice-President of the Institution.

#### LADIES' AUXILIARY

Splendid work has been done throughout the year by this organisation. The sum of £79/11/6 has been expended on linen requirements, and the Auxiliary still has a credit balance of over £100.

The Great Western Ladies' Auxiliary has met our crockery requirements throughout the year, and has also bought us an electric bronchitis kettle at a cost of £4/1/10.

Relief was accorded 625 patients during the year, this being 35 more than last year. Of this number 211 were Private or Intermediate patients, as against 147 last year.

#### SPECIAL ASSISTANCE

The Annual Hospital Ball held on 23rd May, 1935, was a great success. £82/19/2 was the profit handed in and in recognition of the splendid work done by the committee, three Life Governors were appointed, viz., Mrs. J. G. Macdonald, Miss Mary Hutchings and Mr. Stewart Webster.

During the year the Stawell Brass Band visited Pomonal and Glenorchy, and on Easter Sunday, in conjunction with the Hawthorn City Band and the Boys' Band, gave a recital in the Central Park. The amounts received through the bands being £53/4/7. The Horsham Choir visited Stawell in October, and a profit of £7/6/9 from a concert was made for the Hospital funds. The Victorian Police Concert run in aid of Ararat and Stawell Hospitals returned us £5/19/6. A dance at Hall's Gap returned us £1/10/11 per Mr. Taylor.

#### THANKS

Your thanks are due to the members of the Stawell Brass Band in connection with their services at the Hospital Sunday Appeals, to the various car owners for free conveyance of the bandsmen and committeemen, to the ladies of the country centres for afternoon tea provided for bandsmen and visitors, to Mr. E. T. Hutchings, of Green's Creek, Mr. J. C. Hutchings, of Callawadda, Mr. J. May, of Joel Joel, Mr. C. Leslie of Landsborough West, and to Mr. W. H. Arnold, of Wallaloo for undertaking collection of donations in their own districts; to the members of the Stawell Male Choir for services in connection with wireless set, to the members of the Ladies' Auxiliary for the good work done, and to the local Press for free copies of their issues for the institution and valued publicity given all matters pertaining to the institution.
