### SEVENTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

### STAWELL AND DISTRICT HOSPITAL

To the Life Governors and Subscriber

Ladies and Gentlemen,—In presenting the 78th Annual Report and Balance Sheet, the Board of Management wishes to again express pleasure that the year has closed with a credit balance in the maintenance account.

#### MAINTENANCE

The receipts amounted to £4133/4/2, and expenditure £3742/5/11, leaving a credit balance at the Union Bank of £442/19/10, which includes £200 of the late Mrs Celia Tayler's bequest of £500. The balance, £300, is on fixed deposit at the Union Bank.

#### BUILDING

Building Receipts were £65/14/5, which includes £55 for sale of hot press.

Special expenditure from maintenance account during year comprised the re-making and sealing of the approach roadway at a cost of £108, and the replacing of enamel ware, etc., with Monel metal equipment costing £72.

#### LADIES' AUXILIARY

The Board stresses the wonderful work that has been done by the Auxiliary during the year in making available equipment, blankets, linen, etc., to the value of £194/11/9. Too much credit cannot be given to the Stawell ladies and the Wallaloo, Landsborough and Marnoo branches for their excellent service.

The Great Western Auxiliary, as is its usual custom, supplied all the crockery needed by the Hospital during the year, and its continued efforts are greatly appreciated.

The Annual Hospital Ball heid on 28th May, 1936, resulted in a profit of £81/15/8, and in recognition of the work done by the High School ExStudents in the decorating of the hall, Miss L. McCracken was appointed a Life Governor, as were also Mrs R. Middleton and Mr Seymour Larkan for their valued services.

At the Easter Sunday Hospital Appeal, the Stawell Band, in conjunction with the Yallourn Band, gave a programme of music in the Central Park, and a collection of £20/12/3 was received.

In October, Landsborough West held a Dance and Euchre Party, and very generously forwarded the proceeds— ±8/5/—through Mr C. Leslie.

#### PATIENTS

532 patients received treatment during the year. Of this number 179 were paying or intermediate patients.

To the Life Governors and Subscribers

Ladies and Gentlemen,—In presenting the 78th Annual Report and Balance Sheet, the Board of Management wishes to again express pleasure that the year has closed with a credit balance in the maintenance account.

#### MAINTENANCE

The receipts amounted to £4133/4/2, and expenditure £3742/5/11, leaving a credit balance at the Union Bank of £442/19/10, which includes £200 of the late Mrs Celia Tayler's bequest of £500. The balance, £300, is on fixed deposit at the Union Bank.

#### BUILDING

Building Rece pts were £65/14/5, which includes £55 for sale of hot press.

Special expenditure from maintenance account during year comprised the re-making and sealing of the approach roadway at a cost of £108, and the replacing of enamel ware, etc., with Monel metal equipment costing £72.

### LADIES' AUXILIARY

The Board stresses the wonderful work that has been done by the Auxiliary during the year in making available equipment, blankets, linen, etc., to the value of £194/11/9. Too much credit cannot be given to the Stawell ladies and the Wallaloo, Landsborough and Marnoo branches for their excellent service.

The Great Western Auxiliary, as is its usual custom, supplied all the crockery needed by the Hospital during the year, and its continued efforts are greatly appreciated.

The Annual Hospital Ball held on 28th May, 1936, resulted in a profit of £81/15/8, and in recognition of the work done by the High School ExStudents in the decorating of the hall, Miss L. McCracken was appointed a Life Governor, as were also Mrs R. Middleton and Mr Seymour Larkan for their valued services.
