EIGHTIETH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE STAWELL DISTRICT HOSPITAL

To the Life Governors and Subscribers
Ladies and Gentlemen,

In presenting the 80th Annual Report and Balance Sheet, the Board of Management wishes to record gratification with the support the Hospital receives from the people of Stawell and District.

MAINTENANCE

The Receipts amounted to £4158/15/2, and Expenditure to £4542/11/3, which includes £381/2/10 to Builders and Architects, and £60 for Interest payments, leaving a debit balance at the Union Bank of £308/15/7 at the close of the financial year.

BUILDING

During the year the additions to the Nurses' Quarters were completed, the total cost being £1747/10/-. Owing to the Nurses' Award introduced last December with the subsequent shortening of hours and increase in staff, our accommodation is still inadequate, and arrangements had to be made for two nurses to sleep out.

LADIES' AUXILIARY

£60/12/2 has been expended by the Auxiliary in the purchase of linen and other requirements for the Hospital for the year, and members have made and mended various articles as required. We thank the members for their help and continued support, and also the members of the Great Western Auxiliary to whom we look for our Crockery supplies year by year.

The Younger Set gave us £4/6/9 during the year for the purchase of a Bedside Locker and Tray, and we thank them for their practical help. Welcome donations of £25 each from Mrs J. Nicholl and Mr A. J. Pawsey were received this year, and three bequests were made, viz.: the late Mr T. J. Allen, £25; the late Mr J. R. Allison, £21/5/-; and the late Mr F. M. Tickner, £10.

SPECIAL EFFORTS

£67/15/11 was received from the Annual Ball held on the 16th June, 1938. The Dickens-Burns Concert, arranged by Cr Alex McDonald, M.L.A., brought in £15/14/9, and we are grateful to the Militia for a donation of £5/5/- to Miss Lemin for £1/6/-, from the Musical Recital held at Mrs James Gibson's; to St. Matthew's Dramatic Society for a donation of £1/1/-; and to Revd. H. L. Hawkins for £1/2/8 from United Churches Service.

PATIENTS

541 patients were treated during the year. Of this number, 186 were paying or Intermediate patients.

COMMITTEE

Mr McCallum, our Treasurer, resigned during the year owing to transfer to Bendigo, and his successor, Mr W. M. Thomson, was appointed to fill the vacancy which he has done very ably. Mr Knipe, our Senior Vice-President, also resigned during the year, and Mr Bull was appointed to that position. To fill the vacancy thus caused on the Committee, Mr Frank West was appointed. We are indeed fortunate in having the services of such men at our disposal.

STAFF

Matron Cox who was appointed to the position of Matron in March of last year, resigned to take up a position in London, and will leave in July of this year. We appointed Miss Phyllis Lee and feel sure that the high standard of the Hospital will be maintained by her. We have a full staff of fourteen Nurses, three D.C. Sisters, and Matron. All have given loyal service throughout the year, and the public has voiced its approval.

Your thanks are due to the Stawell Band for co-operation with the Malvern Municipal and Tramways Band which through the Easter Sunday Afternoon brought in a collection of
