EIGHTY-FIRST ANNUAL REPORT for Year Ended 30th June, 1940

To Life Governors and Subscribers.

Ladies and Gentlemen,—

In presenting the 81st Annual Report and Balance Sheet the Board of Management again records its gratification with the support the hospital receives from the people of Stawell and district.

MAINTENANCE

The receipts amounted to £4880/0/6, being £897 1/8 more than last year; and expenditure amounted to £4650 3/10 which is £549 5/10 more than last year. Nevertheless the debit balance has been reduced from £308 5/2 to £78 8/6 at the Union Bank at the close of this financial year.

The increase in receipts was accounted for in increase in grant £357 Patients' fees £392 increase, and Bequests increased by £251.

The main increase in expenditure is staff salaries and wages, which increased by £333 owing to the full 12 months being worked under the Nurses' Award.

LADIES' AUXILIARY

£120 14/6 has been expended by the Auxiliary in the purchase of linen and other requirements for the hospital for the year

We thank the members for their help and continued support, also the branches at Great Western, Wallaloo and Landsborough.

BUILDING

Tenders will shortly be called for extensions to the hospital to provide a Maternity wing, and to this end the Charities Board has made us a grant of £2500 and a loan of £2500.

We acknowledge with pleasure the gift of £100 by Mr McLennan from the estate of the late Mrs Annie Pot-

ter; £100 from estate of W. Anthony Esq.; £80 from late R. McMurtrie Esq.; £50 from late G. L. Thomson; £50 from late Mrs Agnes Midgley, and £25 from late Mrs Eliza Reading, all of whom were loyal and consistent supporters of the hospital in their life time and we are deeply grateful for their remembrance

PATIENTS

585 patients were treated this year as against 541 last year. Of the number 214 were paying patients.

COMMITTEE

Mr S. T. Webster was promoted to Horsham in December of last year. and Mr J. G. Macdonald was then appointed as president of the Board of Management. Mr Berger was appointed to the vacancy on the committee.

Your thanks are due to the Stawell Band for co-operation with the Caulfield Band on the Hospital Easter Sunday afternoon, and for recitals given at the hospital throughout the year.
