87th ANNUAL REPORT: STAWELL DISTRICT HOSPITAL

To the Life Governors and Subscribers
Ladies and Gentlemen—

In presenting the eighty-seventh annual report and balance sheet, the Board of Management records its appreciation of the support received from the people of Stawell and District.

Maintenance:

The receipts for the year amounted to £10,838/14/8 which is £915/18/1 more than last year, accounted for by increase in Government Grants, donations, and entertainments.

£6270/11/- is the total amount received for Patients' fees for the year.

Expenditure:

Expenditure for Maintenance amounted to £11,417/2/3 which is £2093/12/10 more than expended last year, which was brought about by the increase in salaries, and ordinary expenditure generally.

Building:

An amount of £350 was received from the Charities Board as a grant towards Building Development. This amount has been invested in long dated loan.

Bequests:

From the executors of the estate of the late Miss A. Beaglehole £225, from the estate of the late Miss Jane Gardiner £20, estate late Mrs S. Campbell £50, estate late J. R. Macpherson £50, estate late Miss M. Esplin £30.

Donations:

A further amount of £150 was received from Mr A. V. Phillips making a total amount of £300. A ward has been named the "Jessie Phillips Ward" in recognition of this handsome donation.

From the Officers and Men of "H.M.A.S. Stawell" we received the sum of £100. Four beds will be endowed in recognition of this gift.

Patients:

Eight hundred and fifty-three patients were treated during the year. Three hundred and nineteen were Public Patients and Five hundred and thirty-four were Paying Patients.

Ladies' Auxilliary:

This splendid body of women has consistently raised funds throughout the year and their balance sheet is submitted herewith. They have raised £265/13/7 during the year and members have helped the Hospital in many other ways.

They have put £200 into Reserve Account and bought items at a total cost of £103/5/- on the Auxilliary's behalf.

Medical and Nursing Services:

During the year the Hospital lost the services of a valued honorary medical officer in Dr M. Snow. We are pleased to place on record our keen appreciation of his work for Stawell District Hospital.

During the year we gained the services of two new honorary medical officers in Dr J. E. Thomas and Dr D. Wise.

The services of Matron D. E. Cameron were also lost to the institution during the year. The valuable services of Matron Cameron during her term of Matron at this Hospital were much appreciated.

During the year the services of Matron H. Hamilton were gained to replace Matron Cameron.

The best thanks of the Board, the subscribers and the Public generally are due again to Matron Cameron and Matron Hamilton and the Nursing and Domestic Staffs for faithful work during the year.

The resignation of Mrs Wright (nee Green) who had held the position of Secretary and Manager of this Hos-

for 21 years was received and accepted. The services rendered by Mrs Wright during her term of office were most praiseworthy in that at all times her duties were carried out cheerfully and in the best interest of the Hospital. We are keen to place on record our keen appreciation of her work and extend the best thanks of the Board, Subscribers and public generally.

On the retirement of Mrs G. R. E' Wright, Mr Thomas J Crossman was appointed to the position of Secretary and Manager and commenced duties on the 4th March, 1946
