### THE PRESIDENT REPORTS

#### To the Life Governors and Contributors

#### Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is my very pleasing privilege to present to you the 107th Annual Report and Audited Financial Statements for the year ended 30th June, 1966.

This year I believe has been successful in many ways and I am very happy to report the commencement of Capital Works—the new Outpatient and Theatre Block — which should be completed by the end of 1966 and will be a great help in improving the service offered to the residents of Stawell and District.

Other improvements are envisaged and initial discussions for plans have commenced.



From reports in the daily press from time to time it is obvious to the public that Hospitals generally are in financial difficulties in so far as their general operating funds are concerned.

In our own case we have seen our position deteriorate by \$9563 during the year — from a surplus of \$2674 last year to a deficit of \$6889 this year, mainly due to an increased wages bill of some \$15,000 which was compensated to the extent of approximately \$5500 by increased income (mainly fees) and reduced expenditure in other accounts.

The Committee was responsible for the commencement of Occupational Therapy at the Eventide Homes and the Elderly Citizens' Club. My thanks to Miss C. Williamson for her leadership and her helpers for the voluntary work they are doing in a very successful venture.

Once again thanks go to the members of the Ladies' Auxiliary who have continued to work so assiduously for the benefit of the Hospital and provided many useful items of equipment and furnishings.

The Annual Ball held by the Navarre Ladies was again very successful and I thank those loyal supporters for their continued interest.

Others to whom my thanks are due include the Manager-Secretary, Mr J. C. Lindsay, for his guidance and the efficient manner in which he has carried out his duties and to his Staff for a job well done, Matron and Staff for the smooth running of the Hospital, members of the Committee of Management for their support and encouragement during my term of Office, the Honorary Medical and Dental Officers, Ministers of Religion, Honorary Solicitor, proprietors of the Stawell Times-News, and of course the Contributors for their continued support and the many donors of goods.

Thanks also go to the Hospital & Charities Commission for the help given in planning the new building project, to 3DB/LK Radio Appeal Committee and the Wimmera Base Hospital for services rendered during the year.


# FORM OF BEQUEST
