THE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To the Life Governors and
Contributors
Ladies and Gentlemen,

I have much pleasure in presenting to you, the 110th Annual Report and Audited Financial Statement of your Hospital for the year ended 30th June, 1969

SERVICE TO THE PUBLIC

During the year 1180 inpatients spent a total of 8090 days in Hospital. Of these 341 (or 29 per cent) were pensioner patients who spent 3429 days (or 42 per cent of the total bed days) in Hospital.



Although 34 more inpatients were treated during the year the average stay of patients fell from 7.6 days to 6.9 days, resulting in a lower daily average number of patients in Hospital. The Hospital has continued to give service to all Medical, Surgical and Obstetric patients who require care.

The Regional Physiotherapy Service re-commenced in February when Miss Lynette Lee took up the position at the Wimmera Base Hospital.

The Committee has also looked at the possibility of establishing Visiting Radiology and Pathology Services. Both of these services will be reviewed from time to time.

FINANCE

The costs of running the Hospital continue on an upward trend but the increase of \$5753 for the year is considered reasonable. The greater portion of this increase was Salary increases granted by Wages Boards during the year.

Increased costs and a reduction in the number of inpatient days resulted in the daily average cost per patients rising by nearly \$2 - from \$18.45 per day to \$20.40 per day. The fact that each patient spent 6.9 days in Hospital compared with 7.6 days in the previous year benefitted the patient in that his Hospital bill was so much less (in fact if assessed at Public rates this meant a saving of \$8260 to patients over the whole year) — but it had the effect of reducing the Hospital income from fees

BUILDING AND EQUIPMENTS

The major project this year was the completion of the second stage of our building program — this included the complete renovation and remodelling of the kitchen and installing new equipment, alterations and renovations to provide a new Children's Ward with toilet and bathroom facilities, and a new comfortably furnished waiting room.

Rubber floor coverings were provided in Private and Intermediate wards in the Female Section and the Air Conditioning equipment previously used in the Operating Theatre was reconditioned and installed in part of the Male Section. Other items provided during the year in-

cluded a Korona Electro Surgical Unit, a "Bird" Mark 8 Resuscitator both of which have proved of immense value in the treatment of patients and a mortuary Refrigeration Unit. The total sum spent on Building, Plant and Equipment for the year totalled \$29,463.

It is hoped to proceed shortly with stage three of the Building program which includes erection of a new Store and Workshop, renovation of the present Store for conversion to a Linen Exchange and renovations to the Infectious Diseases Ward.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

It is with deep regret that I record the deaths of two members of the Committee — Mr Leslie L. Smith who died on 7/8/68 and Cr. Herbert L. Schultz who died on 26/2/69.

Also during the year a former Member of the Committee Mr Walter Gordon Sharpley passed away. Mr. Sharpley gave many years of valuable service to the Community through his association with the Hospital and I convey sincere condolences to Mrs. Sharpley and family.

Changes in the Committee were the retirement of Cr. F. H. Thomson who did not seek re-election, whilst we welcomed Rev. A. D. Hodgson and Mr. J. Bool who were appointed to fill casual vacancies on 12/11/68 and 14/1/69 respectively.

This service has proved very valuable and I record my sincere thanks to these ladies.

To District School Children for their Annual Egg Appeal effort to our Ladies Auxiliary, Ministers of Religion, the Honorary Solicitor, Wimmera Base Hospital, Wimmera Ambulance Service, 3LK Appeal Committee, the Hospitals and Charities Commission and the Stawell Times-News, I record the appreciation of the Committee for their support, guidance, and assistance in many ways.
