# The President's Report



To the Life Governors and  
Contributors

Ladies and Gentlemen,

I am pleased to present to you the 113th Annual Report and Audited Financial Statements for the year ended 30th June, 1972.

The year generally, saw the Hospital maintaining its services, and work commence on the first stage of the Geriatric Complex. Because of increased Fees brought into effect in August of last year coupled with an increased daily average number of patients, our financial position improved considerably despite an increased wages bill.

## SERVICE TO THE PUBLIC

One person in every seven residing in Stawell Town and Shire was an inpatient for just over one week during the year. Inpatients totalled 1242 who spent 9724 days in Hospital — daily average of 26.6 patients with an average stay of 7.8 days each.

Pensioner patients totalled 344 and these spent 3606 days in Hospital, or about 37% of the total patient days.

There were 549 operations, 1163 outpatients treatments and 124 births.

## FINANCE

For the first time our expenditure exceeded a quarter of a million dollars, and similarly our receipts. The actual figures were: Expenditure \$250,192 and Income \$260,603, thus leaving a surplus for the year of \$10,411.

Compared with the previous year the main increase in expenditure was \$28,687 in the wages bill and on the income side an increase of \$54,056 in fees. The increased wages bill was the entire reason for the daily bed cost rising from \$23.01 last year to \$25.63.

Patients fees owing to the Hospital amounted to \$31,108 after making a provision of \$2,802 for doubtful debts. This figures compares favourably with last year's total of \$25,852, when it is remembered that fees rose steeply early in the year. Most patients have taken out sufficient Hospital Benefit Insurance to pay for the category of accommodation they want should they need to enter Hospital at any time, and, as these benefits may be assigned and collected by the Hospital payment of accounts can be completed shortly after discharge — thus accounts are "off the books" quickly. It may be opportune at this time to remind people to check their benefit cover with their Lodge Secretary or Benefit Agency to make sure they are adequately covered. Families on middle or low incomes are reminded that they may apply to the Commonwealth Department of Social Services for assistance in paying Hospital Benefit Premiums — forms are available from the Hospital Manager, Post Offices, or direct from Department Offices.

## BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT

In the latter part of the year a contract was signed for the first stage of our Geriatric Complex which includes the provision of a new Stores buildings, conversion of the present store into a Linen Exchange and Workshop, and additions and alterations to "Syme Ward" to provide accommodation for 19 frail elderly people.

The successful tender was that of Messrs P. & A. Coutts Pty. Ltd. of Horsham at a cost of \$100,230. \$75,200 of this sum will be met from Government Grants. Successful sub-contractors for electrical work was G. & C. Cashin of Stawell and for Mechanical Services, G. K. & L. E. Strange of Ballarat.

Work is well advanced, and this first stage of the overall project is expected to be ready for patients in a few months time.

We spent \$2402 on equipment and furnishings in the Hospital during the year as detailed —

Obviously an Appeal of this magnitude needs the active assistance of a large number of people to organise and run it. I am happy to say that we have received this support and it is now up to the public of Stawell and District to accept the challenge and give generously to our appeal — by direct cash donations, and by supporting the various functions being conducted for the appeal.

### APPRECIATION

During the past year valuable assistance has been given to the Hospital by the Ladies' Auxiliary, Ministers of Religion, the Honorary Solicitor, Wimmera Base Hospital, Wimmera Ambulance Service, 3LK Radio Appeal Committee, the Hospitals and Charities Commission, the Stawell "Times-News" and many individuals and other organisations.

The support given by these, and by students from district schools during their annual egg appeal is very much appreciated.
