The President's Report

To the Life Governors and
Contributors
Ladies and Gentlemen,



I am pleased to present to you the 114th Annual Report and Audited Financial Statements for the year ended 30th June, 1973.

There were two highlights during the year. Firstly, the tremendous, spontaneous support given by everyone to the 1972 3LK Hospital Appeal held in Stawell, which raised over \$16,000 for our own Syme Ward, as well as a considerable sum by other communities for their own particular Hospitals. The Second, was when we opened the doors of Syme Ward for patients on 25th June, 1973.

Increased use of the Hospital Service enabled us to end the year in a reasonable financial position even with an increased wages bill of some \$33,500.

SERVICE TO THE PUBLIC

This year has been a record year in so far as the number of in-patients is concerned. We treated 1658 people as inpatients, compared with 1242 last year. Our daily average number of inpatients increased to 30.09 and the average length of stay was 6.6 days per patient. There were 1359 outpatient attendances, 143 births, and 666 operations.

Just before the end of the year we commenced taking patients into the remodelled Syme Ward. By utilizing five of the nineteen beds available, as short term beds, we have been able to render assistance to a number of patients who, although seeking long term accommodation, would not otherwise have been accommodated because of the demand for long term beds being in excess of the available beds.

FINANCE

Our Maintenance expenditure for the year was \$300,743 and our income \$298,267 leaving a deficit of \$2476. On the income side the increase over the previous year was almost entirely due to the increased daily average number of inpatients. The same factor also contributed to some degree in the increased cost of food, laundry and medical supplies as well as price rises. Salary and wage increases, including equal pay for women under the Hospital and Benevolent Homes Board, increased the wages bill by \$33,500.

The Hospitals book debts amounted to \$32,650 after providing \$3926 for doubtful debts — this compares with a net figure last year of \$31,108. Many patients are now authorising the Hospital to claim benefits on their behalf, and this has three advantages — It takes most of the "paper work" away from patients, it means the patient does not have to pay his account before a claim is made, and it means generally a more rapid payment of fees. When it is considered that 75% of the Hospitals expense. i.e. — Salaries and Wages — has to be met each fortnight, it means the Hospital enjoys only 14 days credit terms for 75% of its expenditure. It is therefore obvious a quick return from fees is imperative.

BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT

Payment of \$79,306 towards the Syme Ward building was the major building expense for the year, whilst the provision of equipment and furnishings, chiefly for the new ward cost a further \$12,878.

Further representations have been made to the Hospitals and

Charities Commission for the Day Center Building, renovations to the Nurses Quarters, and remodelling to the Female Ward bathrooms to be carried out.

Drawings are being prepared for a covered way between the Kitchen and the Syme Ward, and other works under consideration include sealing of the courtyard, new access roadway, modifications to the existing driveway, and painting work.

On your behalf I thank Mr O'Driscoll for his long period of service during which time he contributed much to welfare of the Hospital.

No other changes in the Committee occurred during the year.

HONORARY MEDICAL AND DENTAL STAFFS

Dr Wendy Macdonald was appointed to the Honorary Medical Staff on 19th September 1972, otherwise there has been no change in these Staffs. Once again, I record thanks to the Honorary Medical and Dental Officers for their service to the public.

3LK HOSPITAL APPEAL

"It couldn't be done!" But it was — over \$16,000 raised for our Hospital Appeal. Where do you start to say "Thank You" to all those who contributed time, talents and money in such a magnificent achievement? Perhaps it is best to say to everyone concerned — "We really appreciated the wonderful support we received, and we hope you will be as proud of the "Syme Ward" as we are ourselves." To the 3LK Appeal Committee and the management and staff of Radio 3LK, I record our appreciation of the support given to us, which ensured the success of the Appeal and the broadcast from Stawell.

APPRECIATION

Valuable assistance was given by the Hospital Ladies Auxiliary, the Honorary Solicitor, Ministers of Religion, Wimmera Base Hospital, Wimmera Ambulance Service, 3LK Radio, 3LK Hospital Appeal Committee, Hospitals and Charities Commission, the Stawell "Times-News" and by many individuals and other organisations. To all these "Thank you very much for your support".

From district school students too we received outstanding support both during the 3LK Hospital Appeal and earlier during our annual Schools Egg Appeal. To the Schools themselves, and to all those who assisted them in their varied efforts, "Thank you very much".

STAFF

After serving the Hospital for twelve years we lost the services of Matron Joyce Forsythe. I am sure the public of Stawell will join with the Committee in recording its appreciation of her service, and to wish her every happiness in the future. Matron Lola Hoare took up duty on 30th April and we wish her a happy association with our Hospital.

During the interim period between appointments, we were fortunate to have the services of Matron F. J. Pontt, a Relieving Matron made available by the Hospitals and Charities Commission, and we thank her for her assistance.

Again, may I express my sincere thanks to our Secretary-Manager Mr Jim Lindsay for the ways in which he has administered the Hospital over many years and also for the guidance and friendship given to me during my term of office. I would also say "Thank you" to all members of the staff for the work done for the Hospital during the year.

Lastly, I would like to thank all members of the Board of Management for their work and for the help given to me over the past two years, I hope that my successor will receive as much satisfaction from working with the committee as I have.

HISTORIC MARKER UNVEILED

On Saturday, 18th November, 1972, a large gathering of interested people attended the unveiling of a memorial on the site of the original Hospital at Doctor's Hill.

An enthusiastic meeting chaired by Mining Warden Fenwick, and held at the Olympic Theatre, Deep Lead on 7th August, 1858, resolved to establish a Hospital. The need was great. With but meagre shelter from the elements, a restricted diet mainly of meat and flour, inadequate and often polluted water supply, people succumbed to disease, and accidents were common. Many suffered and died because there was no Hospital to provide shelter and to care for them.

An appeal was launched, and the miners of Pleasant Creek and the settlers in the Wimmera, west to the South Australian border and north to the Mallee, responded generously. The canvass yielded 500 pounds.

The Committee decided to erect a temporary Hospital immediately, and on 26th February, 1859, the first Hospital of calico and bark, on Doctor's Hill, was opened free of debt. A Government grant of 3 pounds for one pound of local contribution was made.

The monument is situated just off the Western Highway a few yards beyond the 147 mile post between Stawell and Deep Lead. It was designed and erected by Mr M. M. Robson on behalf of the Rotary Club of Stawell, and was officially unveiled by a former member of the Committee of Management, Mr G. P. Frencham.
