The President's Report



To the Life Governors and
Contributors.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

I have much pleasure in presenting to you the 117th Annual Report and Audited Financial Statements for the year ended 30th June, 1976.

Throughout the 117th year the very high standard of patient care we have come to expect was maintained. There were anxious times due to lack of senior nursing staff and supporting facilities etc., but these were overcome by the dedication of all concerned with the well being of the hospital.

The Day Hospital building is all but complete, the furniture has been ordered and basic staff trained to operate this extension to the hospital services. The concept of a day hospital linked to a geriatric ward is new and will be watched with interest. Geriatric patients are not ill, they are handicapped in various ways by age and those using the day hospital will be the handicapped of all ages, so there is a common bond linking them together.

The Committee has spent much time deliberating the requirements of the hospital to bring the facilities and equipment up to the best possible standard.

To attract nursing staff, seven bedrooms, lounge, kitchen and dining room in the Sisters home were completely refurbished and the success this has achieved means we must consider bringing the rest of the home up to this new standard. A comprehensive inspection outside and inside the hospital buildings showed the main structure now 43 years old to be completely sound. A priority programme of maintenance work was undertaken and has culminated in the re-letting of a contract for external painting to the hospital. The increase in patient numbers and the expansion of pathology and radiology services has led to an increase in the administration and other hospital staff and this in turn has led to a series of consultations with Mr Thomas, Deputy Chairman of the Hospitals and Charities Commission, Mr Armstrong, Chief Architect, and other senior members of the Commission on ways and means of providing adequate space for them. The front of our hospital is architecturally pleasing and we want to keep it that way. Plans for the extension of the administrative area are well advanced and the front verandah will be re-vamped and completed in bricks in keeping with the rest of the buildings. The nursing staff's dining room is to be enlarged and a workshop provided for the maintenance staff. Improvements to patients accommodation and facilities are also under active consideration.

A programme of re-equipping all the wards is now under way. 12 new Joyce Hi-Lo beds, bedside cabinets and cantilever bed tables have been ordered as well as new beds and cots for the children's ward. I thank all those organisations and individuals who have undertaken to sponsor the finance required for a unit comprising a bed, locker and table. Our programme calls for 12 beds etc. to be replaced each 6 months and the hospital completely re-equipped within 2 years.

Early in the year the Board appointed a sub-committee to look

at the beautification of the grounds in conjunction with a complete replanning of the entrance to the hospital, parking facilities, walk ways etc. Mr Kevin Heinze made himself available and the banks and approaches to the hospital were inspected and the basis of a long term beautification project discussed. We have been fortunate in obtaining filling from the Gas and Fuel Corporation and others to extend the area near the day centre. The more filling we can get the more we will be able to plan better car parking facilities. Anyone knowing any filling available now or in the future should contact the Manager Mr Lindsay.

During the year the Rev. A. D. Hodgson and Councillor A. W. McCracken resigned from the Committee. Both gave of their best for the hospital and I and other members of the Committee were sorry to see them go. Their contribution in time and ability to hospital offices over the years gave them satisfaction to the benefit of the hospital and those who required its services.

Mr Lindsay our Manager was absent for four months on well deserved annual leave and long service leave and we were very fortunate to have the services of Mr Mulgrew as relieving Manager. His enthusiasm and knowledge enabled the Board to maintain a high level of activity in day to day affairs and forward planning, and for his help we thank him sincerely.

FINANCE

Since 1-8-75 under the Commonwealth/State cost sharing agreement Hospital finances have been calculated on a cash basis. This financial year there are two financial statements, one under the "old" system for the period 1-7-75 to 31-7-75 and the other under the "new" system for the period 1-8-75 to 30-6-76.

Increase in awards has resulted in a substantial increase in salary and wage payments, and this, coupled with payments to Visiting Medical Officers. Ambulance transport charges and chemist charges for drugs etc., to Private patients, charges not previously met by the Hospital has been largely the reason for the daily bed cost per patient rising from \$31.74 last year to \$50.98.

Commonwealth and State payments to the Hospital have been the main means by which during the cost sharing period the Hospital had a surplus of \$12377. A deficit of \$8752 was shown for the month of July 1975.

BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT

Payments for the year towards the Day Hospital building totalled \$115420.

Renovations and alterations to Sisters Home and Boiler House cost \$2740, and a sum of \$29083 was spent on Plant and Equipment. Major items of Plant and Equipment were X-Ray Unit \$9074. Analgesic Machine \$820. Fire Fighting Equipment \$1137, Labour Ward Lights \$998, Dishwasher \$1175, Flyscreens \$839, Maternity Section Floor Coverings \$1706, Drink Vending Machine \$742, Sisters Home Floor Coverings, Furnishings, Equipment, and Insulation \$4140, and Laboratory Equipment \$649.
