# The President's Report



To the Life Governors and  
Contributors.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

I have much pleasure in presenting to you the 118th Annual Report and Audited Financial Statements for the year ended 30th June, 1977.

I feel the year has been very satisfactory. The high standard of patient care we have come to expect in our hospital has been maintained, thanks to the visiting Medical Staff, Matron and the Nursing Staff. These people have been very capably supported by our Office, Domestic and Maintenance Staff. All deserve our truest praise for their loyalty and dedication.

Your Committee has endeavoured to continue with their plans to bring the buildings and equipment up to the best possible standard. This has not been easy due to restrictions on finance at both Federal and State levels. However, I am pleased to report that the Day Hospital building has been completed and reception of patients commenced early in November 1976. Since then, and up to the end of June 1977, 229 patients registered an aggregate attendance of 1468. This section of our hospital is now working to full capacity. It is providing a great variety of services for the care and re-habilitation of patients of all ages. We are very grateful to the Wimmera District Ambulance Service who provide and operate a specially equipped bus for the transport of patients to and from the Day Hospital.

The re-furnishing program has continued with the second batch of 12 beds, 12 lockers and 12 over-bed tables being purchased. This means that one half of the Hospital has now been completed, with 24 units still required to complete the program.

The Administration/Ward Building Project has been advanced to the stage where final plans and specifications are now being prepared by the Hospital and Charities Commission. This project covers work which is urgently required for the efficient conduct of our hospital. The extension and renovation of the Administration section is required to employ more office staff to service the Geriatric Ward, Day Hospital and increased Pathology, Radiology and Out-Patient services. More space is required for records, admissions, etc., which follow these increased facilities. The plans include room to house a new telephonic communications system within the hospital, improved bathroom and toilet facilities for patients, enlargement of the nursing staff's dining room and re-modelling of the wards now located in the verandahs. It is hoped that grants will be available from the Hospital and Charities Commission to enable the work to be carried out.

Planning, in conjunction with two interested firms, has been carried out for the provision of a water sprinkler system for the whole hospital grounds — the first requirement in the overall grounds beautification plan drawn up by Mr Kevin Heinze. A satisfactory layout has been settled and quotations are expected shortly.

The Gas & Fuel Corporation, Stawell Town Council and Mr Porter have provided filling material which has enable us to extend our parking facilities and to redesign our entrance driveway. When

the area consolidates, it will be sealed and parking bays marked out for approximately 70 cars.

Payments towards the Day Hospital building during the year amounted to \$37,158 bringing the total building cost to \$157,022. Furnishings and Equipment for the Day Hospital totalled \$18,266. Other major items purchased included a DSL Sterilizer \$3900, Portable Cardiac Unit \$3900, X-ray Film Processing Unit \$4722, Orthopaedic Operating Table \$2080, Motor Vehicle \$4009, and \$8300 for Ward Furniture.

## FINANCE

Hospital expenditure from the Operating Account was a record \$1,131,726 whilst receipts totalled \$1,063,067, leaving a deficit of \$68,659. This deficit is of concern and was mainly due to reduction of normal operating grants from the State Government for the months of May and June.

I would like to briefly explain to you the way our hospital is financed. There are two main accounts — Operating Account for normal running cost and Capital Account for costs incurred for new and replacement buildings and equipment. The Hospital and Charities Commission through the Commonwealth/State cost sharing agreement, usually grants our Hospital sufficient funds to cover any operating deficiency after we collect normal fees for services provided to patients. Therefore, our operating account is not our main problem in normal circumstances.

Our main problem is through our Capital or Reserve Funds. These appear to be good at present but our contribution to the cost of the new buildings and equipment being planned could use up all of these funds over the next two or three years. Grants from the Hospital and Charities Commission for capital items only covers three quarters of building costs and one half of equipment costs. The remainder has to be provided from our own Capital and Reserve Funds. These are the funds which are contributed almost entirely from bequests and donations from individuals and local organisations. So you can see how much we rely on your generosity and the contributions of Stawell and District organisations to maintain progress in our Hospital.

I would urge you to continue your support and also, for those of you in a position to do so, to give consideration to giving a bequest to the Stawell District Hospital in accordance with the form in the rear page of this report.

## ACCREDITATION

Following a survey late last year your Hospital was granted a Certificate of Accreditation for a period of two years. The survey covered all aspects of the Hospital Service — Medical, Nursing, Para-Medical, Food and Domestic Service, Buildings and Grounds, its Governing body and general Administration.

The Certificate is worded as follows —

Certificate of Accreditation.

This is to certify that the Australian Council on  
Hospital Standards has accredited  
Stawell District Hospital.

This Certificate is granted by the Authority of Council in recognition of compliance with the Standards approved by Council for patient care with respect to:  
diagnostic and treatment facilities, qualifications and organisation of staff, departmental performance and attitude, clinical care review and assessment, safeguards concerning medical staff ethics and competence.

This accreditation is valid for the period to 6th October, 1978.

The granting of Accreditation was a great compliment to the work of all our staff.

## COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

Mr R. J. Lewis resigned on 10/8/76 because of his transfer in his employment, and Mr V. C. Nielsen retired as Government Nominee on 14/12/76 when he did not seek re-appointment when his term expired. Mr Lewis served for 5 years and Mr Nielsen for 13 years. Mr R. K. McMullin was subsequently appointed Government Nominee, and three new members were appointed during the year — Mr William O'Driscoll, Mrs Marilyn Blake and Mr Gordon Wade all filling casual vacancies. Mr T. W. Sainsbury, currently overseas, was granted leave of absence for the period he will be away. I would like to record our appreciation of the services of Mr Lewis and Mr Nielsen, particularly the latter who was our Treasurer for 13 years.

We are fortunate to now have five members on our visiting Medical Staff, two of whom are surgeons. This has resulted in more patients being treated at our hospital due to fewer cases having to be sent to larger centres.

The committee expresses its appreciation for services rendered by many people and organisations throughout the year. District Schools, the Honorary Solicitor, Ministers of Religion, Service Clubs, Wimmera Base Hospital, Wimmera Ambulance Service, the Hospitals and Charities Commission, Stawell Times-News, 3WM Radio, our Ladies' Auxiliary and Younger Set are some who regularly assist the Hospital.
