# The President's Report

## 1980-81

TO THE LIFE GOVERNORS AND CONTRIBUTORS

Ladies and Gentlemen and Guests,

It is my honour to present to you on behalf of the Committee of Management of the Stawell District Hospital, the 122nd Annual Report including the Financial and Statistical Statements for the year ended 30th June 1981.

We regret that we have been deprived of the services of our President Mr T. Sainsbury who has been seconded for special duty to the New Guinea Government for several months.

The past twelve months have again been difficult ones due to the continuing severe economic restraints imposed by the State and Federal Governments.

The Hospital has been as busy as ever but despite the difficulties the staff of the Hospital have worked wonders to maintain a high standard in Medical and Nursing care.

The Board of Management is acutely aware of much that needs to be done to improve the quality of the accommodation available but we have been frustrated by the financial restrictions.

We have achieved one thing though in making the Health Commission very much aware of our problems and after consultation with a visiting team of Senior Officers of the Hospital Division of the Health Commission in March of this year, a general plan of action has been formulated.

- 1) Build an extra 11 beds on to the present Geriatric Ward.
- 2) Remodel the kitchen and extend its facilities to provide for meals on wheels service, and provide a new dining area.
- 3) Remodel the present acute wards with new bathroom facilities.
- 4) Extension of the outpatients radiology and pathology services.

We would like to proceed with Stage 1 within the next six months and have it completed within the next twelve months. Estimated cost would be approximately \$250,000 of which we expect a Commonwealth Grant of half.

We will be very dependent on the help of the people in the area to bring these changes to fruition. Obviously these changes will take time, so in the meantime renovation of Children's ward, bathrooms and general repainting will take place.

During the past twelve months the following works and equipment have been completed:

- Replacement of new boilers
- Electric wiring — re-wiring of the whole Hospital
- New incinerator
- Completion of Ward furnishing project
- Car park and Drive-way sealing.

Consequent on these projects — repairs of ceilings can be completed and repainting can commence. Also the insulation of the Hospital can be completed.

**Services** — Accommodation available: 53 Hospital beds and 19 Nursing Home Beds, a total of 72. Daily average of inpatients was 38.31 in Hospital and 18.69 in the Nursing Home compared with 38.72 and 18.12 last year — the occupancy rate for the combined Hospital and Nursing Home was 79.38%.

It is regretted that with reduction of the Radiographer visits from Horsham from two days per week to only one day, a number of patients have been required to attend Ararat or Horsham for X-Rays.

**Management Study** — A 22 week work study was conducted by the Health Management Services at the request of the Committee. Reports have been prepared for four areas — Nursing, Administration, Catering and Cleaning. The Committee has appointed Sub-Committees to examine the reports in detail prior to submitting comments to the Health Commission.

**Finance** — The Financial Reports printed in this report shows total payments for the year were \$1,918,388 and receipts \$1,879,904 leaving a deficit of \$38,484 — The Hospital \$28,190 and the Nursing Home \$10,294.

The daily bed cost per Hospital patient was \$91.01 and \$57.79 for the Nursing Home patient. The differences in costs are because the Hospital has expenses not associated with the Nursing Home — i.e. Payments to Doctors, Renovations and Replacements, and Ambulance charges and also due to the occupancy of the beds — 72.3% in the Hospital and 98.4% in the Nursing Home.

**Appreciation** — We are deeply grateful for the high level of continued support given to our hospital by many individuals, organizations, district schools, service clubs, sporting clubs and many others. Our heartfelt thanks to all who have contributed.

Special thanks is due to the Apex Club who donated \$8,000 towards the purchase of a new Cardiac Monitor.

Also to the Town Hall Hotel Cork Club for their further generous support.

The Ladies Auxiliary have again worked hard and deserve our special thanks.

The Younger Set has also continued to help in the Provision of Equipment for the Hospital.

Matron raised money to provide a special baby resuscitation trolley which has proved invaluable.

Special thanks is also due to the Town Hall Hotel Bingo Committee and a special thank you to Sister Jerram who has worked hard for this.

The Stawell Athletic Club provided funds for a special weighing chair for Syme Ward.

Air conditioning units which were provided by Stawell Progress Association have been very beneficial to the patients.

**Staff** — Following the cessation of the Nursing Aide Training School the Nursing Staff establishment was amended by the Health Commission to increase the number of Sisters from 15.8 to 21.8 and Trained Nursing Aides from 18 to 21 and eliminating 9 Trainees. The number of nursing staff remained unaltered at 52.2 but included trained staff in place of trainees. Representations are still being made for an increase in the Nursing Staff.

**Radio Appeal** — The 1980 Radio Appeal again a very successful one — the sum of \$15,778.55 was raised. The appreciation of the Committee goes to all those people who contributed so generously to the appeal. Money is continually needed to meet costs of buildings, equipment or furnishings where part, or all, of the cost is met from Committee funds.

**Committee of Management** —

Resignation Mr R. K. McMullin (2-2-81) 18½ years Service.

Resignation Mr W. O'Driscoll (5-5-81) 4½ years Service.

Resignations reduced the number on the Committee to twelve members as required as from December 7, 1980, all members are now appointed by the Governor in Council.

Graduates received their Certificates in an impressive Ceremony followed by a most enjoyable concert by the Australian Boys Choir.

**Conclusions** — In concluding I extend my personal thanks to:

- 1) Matron Hoare and all her staff who have worked hard under difficult circumstances.
- 2) The Manager Mr J. Lindsay and his over-worked office staff — we hope that relief will be afforded to them very shortly.
- 3) The Maintenance, Domestic and Catering staff for their continued concern and help.

Finally I would like to thank all members of the Board of Management for their continued efforts. There have been many frustrations but I would urge you all to greater efforts in this forthcoming year for I believe the rewards of your labours are dawning on the horizons.

We were sorry to lose the services of Mr Robert Hemley during the year. He has gone to the Camperdown Hospital and I believe he has a bright future in the field of hospital administration. We extend our best wishes to him.

Mr K. McMullin replaced him. Mr McMullin served well for eighteen years on the board of Management and we extend our thanks to him. We have been fortunate to acquire his services in the office especially with his experience in hospital administration.

We were sorry to lose the services of Mr W. O'Driscoll from the Board of Management. We need persons of his ability to replace these members who have served a long time and will be retiring through age soon.
