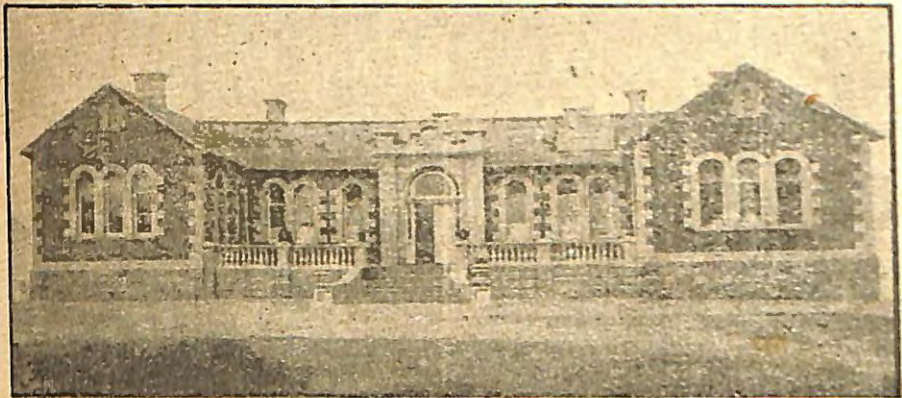

Annual Report.

TO THE SUBSCRIBERS—

The Committee of Management have the honor to submit to the contributors of the Stawell Hospital & Benevolent Asylum their Fifty-Seventh Annual Report and Balance-Sheet for the Year Ended 30th June, 1916.

The Financial Statement, which is printed herewith, duly audited and certified, shows receipts as £3149/16/6-. Proceeds of Entertainments have increased by £1502/9/5. This has been brought about by the Stawell Friendly Societies holding a Gymkhana and donating £685/8/2 to our fund, also having a Wheat Appeal which realised £183/3/10; the Stawell Athletic Club's Easter Carnival, this institution receiving half the profits—£640 3/3 being donated; Mrs. Bennett's Concert bringing in £16/15/6; the Great Western Race Club donating £12; the Pomonal Progress Association, £10; the Great Western Red Cross Society, £4 11/-; Hospital Sunday—under this heading the Landsborough Brass Band contributed £70, the Stawell Brass Band £53/14/5, and £42/15/6 was taken at the Central Park, Stawell, both the Royal Park Recruiting Military Band and the Stawell Brass Band assisting. We have also received £50 from the late Mrs. A. Anthony's Estate, £50 from the late R. Quine's Estate, £40 from the Edward Wilson Trustees, £34/2/9 from the Stawell Amateur Turf Club, £30 from the Felton Bequest Fund, and £5 from the late Sir W. A. Zeal's Trustees.

The Expenditure amounted to £2008/1/11, which is slightly less than last year, the principal saving being in Medical Fees £68, and Milk £29. The expenditure on Meat increased by about £120, and Wages by £35.

The present Credit Balance is £1525/2/2. Against this, accounts amounting to £247/2/1 owing June 30th, 1916, have to be deducted. We hold £448 face value of Government Inscribed Stock three per cent. (1917 optional) the present market value being £285. Since the year expired we have received £83/2/1, balance of Government Grant, this increasing the credit balance by that amount.

The agreement made with the three local doctors to carry on the work of the Institution during the continuance of the war will effect a saving of £125 per annum.

Last December the Matron (Miss A. E. Taylor) resigned. We appointed Sister M. I. Lang to the position and she has proved to be a very capable Matron. We were fortunate in securing the services of Miss C. Wren as sister.

The grateful acknowledgement of the Committee are tendered to the members of the Stawell Friendly Societies, for the splendid donations received; to the Committee of the Stawell Athletic Club, for the large donation from their Easter Carnival, and to all who assisted at the Carnival; to the District Farmers who contributed wheat and all the contributors whose names appear in this book; to Mrs. Bennett, for the splendid Entertainment given; to the members of the Landsborough and Stawell Brass Bands; to the Stawell Amateurs Turf Club and the Great Western Race Club, for their donations; to the Pomonal Progress Association and the Great Western Red Cross Society, for donations; to the Railway Employees; to the Hospital Staff, for the efficient manner in which they have carried out their duties; and to all others who have in any way helped to promote the good and great work of the Institution.
