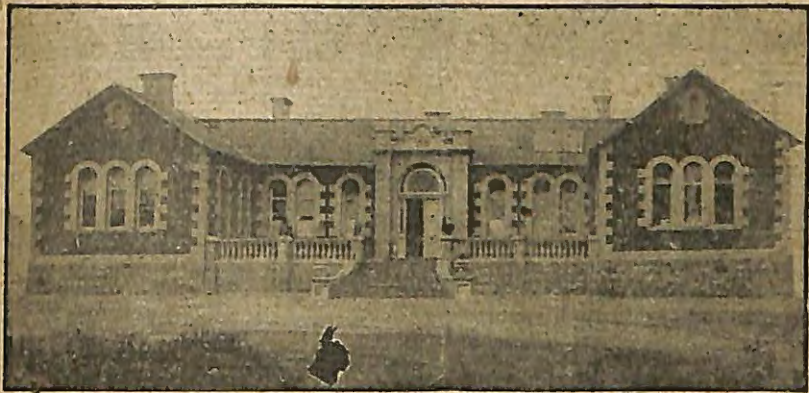

TO THE SUBSCRIBERS—

The Committee of Management of the Stawell Hospital and Benevolent Asylum have the honour to present to the Subscribers their 58th Annual Report and Balance Sheet for the financial year ended 30th June, 1917.

### Financial.

The Income from all sources for the year just ended amounts to £2239 1s 11d. the items showing an increase being Private Contributions, £21 18s 7d; In-Patients' fees, £53 9s 7d; Special Donations, £343 7s 3d; Hospital Sunday Fund, £92 8s 6d; Interest on Investments, £46 15s. The committee greatly appreciate the fact that, despite so many calls to charitable and Patriotic Funds the public have supported this Institution just as liberally as in past years. The expenditure for the year 1916-17 was £1863 2s 7d, being £144 19s 4d less than the preceding year. The following donations have been received during the year—The late Mary Watson's Estate, £437 10s; W. A. & G. A. Gray, £50; Edward Wilson Trustees, £40; Edward Simmons Interest on War Loan, £45; Felton Bequest Trustees, £30; Wallaloo Concert per Mrs Andrew, £15 11s; Navarre Charity Sports, £15 8s; Fyans Creek Progress Association, £10; Glenorchy Turf Club, £5; Commonwealth Button Fund, £10 6s; Trustees Sir W. A. Zeal, £5 per J. A. Anderson; Stawell Brass Band, £107 13s 8d; Landsborough Brass Band, £152 3s 9d.

### Departure.

Owing to his removal from this district we regret having lost the services of Dr W. L. Aitken.

### Obituary.

The Committee have to report with deep regret the death of their colleague, Mr John Cromie, who was a member of Committee for many years. The late Mr Cromie took great interest in everything pertaining to the welfare of the Hospital. The committee desire to place on record their appreciation of his services to the Institution.

Staff.

The committee tender their thanks to Drs J. R. Fox and W. J. Forshaw and the Nursing Staff for the attention paid by them to all cases.

The Matron, Miss M. I. Lang, resigned last April in order to take up military duties and has sailed for Salonika, the vacancy being filled by the appointment of Miss A. M. Simpson to the position, and she has resigned and left on the 11th July. This vacancy has been filled by the appointment of Sister C. Wren, the position of Sister being filled by the appointment of Mrs F. F. E. M'Lay.

Benevolent Asylum.

Owing to the small number of Patients in the Asylum, it was decided to close the Ward, the inmates being transferred to Ararat.

Contemplated Improvements to Buildings

The present Lavatories being cramped and obsolete it is proposed to replace them with modern up to date buildings, also to erect verandahs on two sides of the building. Plans and specifications have been prepared and tenders invited. It is estimated the cost will be about £1000. The State Treasurer has offered £400 towards same.

Distinguished Service at the Front.

The Subscribers will be pleased to know that our Resident Surgeon, Dr D. D. Jamieson, who with the permission of the Committee enlisted for Active Service at the front has several times been mentioned in despatches for distinguished service.

In conclusion, the Committee offer their best thanks to all who have by subscription, donation, or other means, assisted the funds of the Hospital, and wish to specially mention the members of the Landsborough and Stawell Brass Bands, and they venture to hope that the kindly Charity which prompted the support given in the past may lead to renewed effort on behalf of this deserving Institution in the year which is now commencing.
