

To the Subscribers .-

The Committee of Management of the Stawell and District Hospital have the honor to submit to the Subscribers their Sixty-fourth Annual Report and Balance Sheet for the financial year ended the 30th June, 1923.

Financial-

The income from all sources for the year just ended amounts to £2447/2/8 and the expenditure £2403/19/10, thus reducing the overdraft of £70/10/9 on June 30th of last year to £27/8/1 on June 30th of this year. The receipts for this year show an increase of £282 65 8d on last year's figures.

The Committee desires to place on record its appreciation of the liberal support given by the public and hopes that in the coming year this assistance will again be forthcoming and augmented.

We are pleased to report that Nurse Eileen Healy and Nurse Lilian Clarke passed their R.V.T.N.A. Examination this year.

As the result of the Gift Afternoon held on June 22 of last year the expenditure on Bedding, Clothing and Drapery was reduced from £123/9/6 in 1922 to £45/0/7 for 1923.

Another successful Wood-bee was organised by Mr Code this year, and the result therefrom will greatly reduce the expenditure on Fuel for the Institution.
