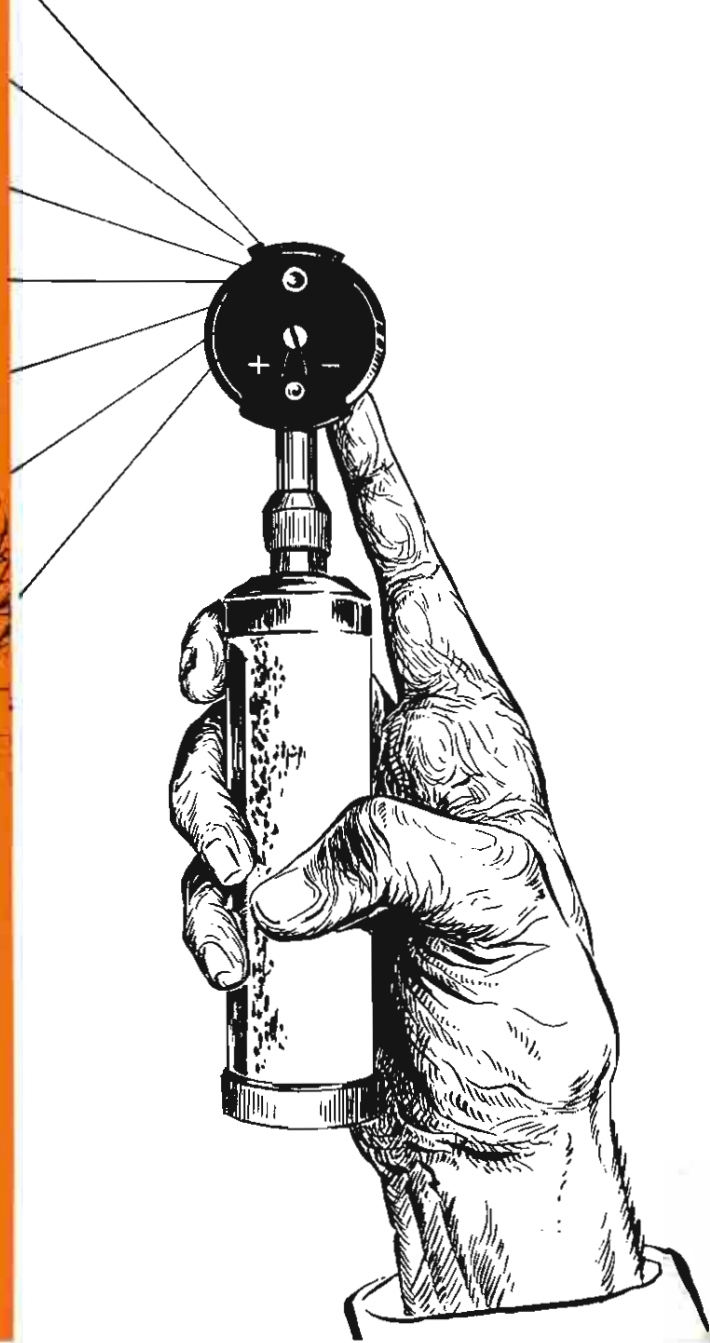

# ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT FOR THE TWELVE MONTHS ENDED 30th JUNE, 1970

To the Life Governors and Contributors.

Ladies and Gentlemen,—

On behalf of the Committee of Management, I have the honour to present the Annual Report and Financial Statements for the year ended 30th June, 1970.

**SERVICE:** Additional medical services established for the public patients this year include:—

- (a) Department of Orthopaedic Surgery;
- (b) Family Planning Clinic.

Also following an idea of a committeeman, outpatients attending casualty now are issued with an identity and personal medical record card, indicating currency of patients personal immunization programme. This is happening at all immunizing centres throughout the Ballarat Health District.

Of existing services, the Intensive Therapy Unit, although costly to maintain, has continued to provide sophisticated and frequently life saving service to the critically ill patient.

The most significant improvement in the physical facilities offered to patients would be in the completion of the remodelling of the outpatient building on the corner of Sturt and Drummond Streets with new entrance opening to Sturt Street. This programme was referred to in last year's report and the improved accommodation now provided is most appreciated by the outpatients attending the hospital.

This year again we have shown an increase in the number of inpatients treated which has risen by a further 350 to 7,184. It is of interest to record this increase particularly in view of the Yuille House remodelling programme which commenced on 21st April and necessitated

half the ground and all the first and second floors being closed from that date. During the currency of this programme alternative accommodation is being found elsewhere in the hospital for the affected areas.

The hospital also recorded 68,365 outpatient attendances and the daily average of inpatients was 188.01.

The regional administration and para medical services have been continued and it is pleasing to report the extension of the pathology service to hospitals at Beaufort, Skipton and Lismore.

**BUILDING DEVELOPMENT AND EQUIPMENT:** Progress on the carrying out of the current building programme this year has been very definite. The stages reached in various projects are as set out below:—

(a) **Outpatients Department—**

With completion of the ground floor conversion to the outpatient building by contractors A. W. Nicholson Pty. Ltd., this building now houses practically all outpatient facilities at the hospital. This project was carried out with the assistance of the Hospitals and Charities Commission. The Committee recognising the great assistance received from Mr. F. C. Armstrong, Chief Architect of the Hospitals and Charities Commission, invited him to formally open the newly restored building. This was a very economical project and has proved most successful in its revised usage;

(b) **Yuille House—**

A contract to the value of \$555,432 was signed with contractors S. J. Weir Pty. Ltd. on 14th April. On its completion the conversion of the Yuille House building

will provide many improvements, including more interior space, and increase the bed capacity from 97 to 122. A new Drummond Street facade in line with the present balcony will be constructed up to the fourth floor level. The building will be divided into smaller wards the largest of which will have a capacity of three beds. A greater number of more easily accessible toilet and washing facilities will be provided. All services, including the passenger lifts, will be completely extended, replaced or modified. Arrangements have been made with the Health Department to meet their share of the cost of remodelling the ground floor (Ward 6), their share being \$32,750;

(c) **Proposed extension to facilities to Edward Wilson/ Eildon House Block and Sloss House—**

The Hospitals and Charities Commission has given approval for the hospital architects, Stephenson & Turner, to proceed with sketch plans for a scheme valued at \$1,000,000. This project will make it possible to house all inpatient facilities adjacent to the Drummond Street frontage and properly plan the future accommodation for Intensive Therapy Unit, Coronary Care Unit, medical and children's wards. It is intended that this project will follow the completion of the Yuille House remodelling programme;

(d) **McDonald Wing Flats—**

Plans have been finalised to convert this building to accommodate senior staff in self-contained flats. Depending on the availability of finance tenders will soon be called;

(e) **Minor Works—**

- (i) Minor but significant alterations were carried out in the pathology department building (\$2,004);
- (ii) The enclosure of the old main entrance at the north end of the administration building has provided a tea and meeting room for doctors (\$2,972);
- (iii) In Eildon House an area has been enclosed for a classroom for the Midwifery Training School (\$2,298);

- (iv) Conversion of the old operating theatre area has been made to give temporary accommodation for urology patients whilst Yuille House is being remodelled;
- (v) Installation of bulk liquid oxygen supply was commenced and will be completed early in the new year;
- (vi) Conversion of kiosk to classroom in Nurses' Home (\$2,098);
- (vii) Installation of Thermal Fire Alarm system (\$7,487);
- (viii) Installation of Plenum cooling coil in casualty (\$2,503);
- (ix) Provision of medical library (currently proceeding), (\$3,800);
- (x) Old kiosk remodelled for E.C.G. department;

(f) **Equipment—**

Major items purchased include:—

- (i) Mobile image intensifier at a cost of \$9,790;
- (ii) Orthopaedic extension frame, \$1,050;
- (iii) Rotary press for laundry, \$2,702;
- (iv) Astronic diluter and flame photometer, \$2,575;
- (v) Tissue Tek microtome, \$2,426;
- (vi) Technicon Ultra tissue processor, \$3,730;
- (vii) Cardiac monitoring equipment, \$2,801;
- (viii) Refrigeration unit for kitchen cool rooms, \$1,550.

**STAFF:** The year just ended has been a busy one for the hospital and for all sections of the staff. On many occasions due to the building programme, staff duties have been carried out under very trying conditions. The Committee is most appreciative of the co-operative attitude of the staff and records here its thanks for the high standard of service maintained during this period. In particular our thanks are extended to Matron, Miss M. S. Ogden, and members of the senior nursing staff.

It is sad to record that two loyal staff members died during the year. The Committee's condolences were extended to the families of the late Mr. A. G. Bath and Mr. R. Goodall.

The hospital is fortunate to have the services of a highly qualified Honorary Professional Staff, many of whom attend

clinics at major teaching hospitals in Melbourne. To the members of the Honorary Professional Staff I extend our appreciation of their services to the public patients in Ballarat. Some changes have occurred in the staff and these are recorded elsewhere in this report.

Also, with great regret I record the death during the year of Mr. F. J. Favalaro, B.D.Sc., L.D.S., a member of the Honorary Professional Staff for 19 years.

In recognition of his services to the hospital the Committee was pleased to appoint Mr. J. C. Dick to the post of Honorary Consulting Anaesthetist. It is also pleasing to record that Mr. Dick has been singularly honoured by his colleagues in that he has been elected an Honorary Fellow of the Faculty of Anaesthesia, Royal Australasian College of Surgeons.

Under the able guidance of our Medical Superintendent, Dr. J. H. Begg, the hospital was able to build up its senior resident medical staff this year so as to provide a rotating service to the Lakeside Hospital; this arrangement appears to be working extremely well. Currently negotiations are under way with the Royal Melbourne Hospital with the objective of this hospital receiving a rotating service from them of two junior resident medical officers and two registrars.

I also wish to record the Committee's appreciation of the work which is being carried out by our Manager. Mr. McVilly has been largely responsible for the successful implementation of our large building programme and for the smooth co-ordination of activities as each phase of the development occurs.

**COMMITTEE:** I wish to express appreciation to my fellow committeemen for their co-operation and support throughout the year. I also regretfully record the death of our Government Appointee, Mr. H. C. E. Evans. Mr. Evans joined the Committee in 1949 and his contribution to our discussions will be greatly missed. Mr. J. H. Heinz has been appointed by the government in his place. The Committee was pleased to appoint Mr. S. C. McBride to the vacancy so caused.

The Committee generally has displayed interest in keeping abreast of hospital affairs at both state and national level. During the year the hospital became a member of the Australian Hospital Association. This we regard as a forward step to keep informed of hospital affairs at a national level.

During the period under review it was agreed that the House Committee of the hospital meet twice monthly instead of once per month. This has proven to be most satisfactory and assists to expedite many matters, contributing to smooth and efficient management of the hospital.

With the objective of broadening our knowledge and improving our services Committee representatives have attended the following seminars and conferences:—

- (a) A one day course for board members organised by School of Hospital Administration, University of New South Wales, at the Chevron Hotel. This course was strongly supported by the Hospitals and Charities Commission;

- (b) Annual conference of the Country Hospitals' Association;
- (c) Meeting of representatives of base hospitals to discuss common problems;
- (d) Meeting of regional chairmen and representatives called by the Hospitals and Charities Commission at Mayfield Centre to discuss proposal for future development of regional services on a "Sector" basis.

Messrs. D. C. Gaunt, R. Humphreys, E. G. Ludbrook, R. A. Must and S. C. McBride retire this year and being eligible offer themselves for re-election.

**HONORARY LIFE GOVERNORS :** In recognition of services rendered to the hospital the Committee was pleased to appoint Mesdames T. C. Brown and J. K. Feary of the "Mary-Helen" Auxiliary, as Honorary Life Governors of the hospital.

**FINANCE :** The financial statements are presented elsewhere in the report and are self-explanatory. These follow the pattern of past years. The only variation being in respect to outstanding debtors. Here, following instructions from the Hospitals and Charities Commission, provision is now made for uncollected income in each year, in respect to public, outpatients and non qualified fees. The result of this is to bring fee income into the accounts on a cash received basis.

The first steps have now been taken to introduce the benefits of E.D.P. to base hospital accounting systems. During the year the Assistant Manager, Accountant, Chief Clerk and Paymaster attended a computer studies course conducted by the Computer Studies Group of the Hospitals and Charities Commission. Following this we have appointed our own computer studies sub-committee with the object of reviewing hospital systems, particularly payroll and medical records, for future conversion. We await further developments following a visit by the Computer Studies Group early in the new financial year.

A number of significant bequests have been received, these are listed elsewhere in the report. However I wish to record here the fact that we have received a further \$2,500 from the Joe White Bequest, making a total from this source since 1961, \$19,200. We were also grateful to receive a bequest

of \$5,000 from the estate of the late Mr. H. C. E. Evans and the Committee has agreed that a three bedded male surgical ward in Yuille House be named in his memory.

**GENERAL :** Other matters which I feel worthy of recording in this report for the information of our contributors are:—

- (i) A visit by Dr. R. F. Harbison, the accreditation officer of the Melbourne Medical Post Graduate Committee, who met members of Committee and Honorary Professional Staff to discuss the future role of the hospital in respect to first year resident medical officer training;
- (ii) The kiosk area in the Nurses' Home was converted to provide an additional classroom for the General Training School. This room was named the "Jessie M. Langham" classroom, to perpetuate the name of Matron Langham who did much to help the status of our training school during her term at Ballarat;
- (iii) The City Council has been most helpful in assisting in our traffic control problems and has agreed to reserve certain kerbside parking spaces at strategic points adjacent to hospital entrances. This should be of great assistance to movements of patients in and out of the hospital.

Finally to our numerous supporters I extend our most sincere thanks for the help they have given us.

In particular I say "Thank you" to the "Mary-Helen" Auxiliary for their loyal support. I am also particularly pleased to record our appreciation of the interest in our affairs displayed by our members of parliament — Mr. G. D. Erwin, Hon. Murray Byrne, Hon. V. O. Dickie, Mr. A. T. Evans and Mr. W. F. Stephen.

In conclusion I express appreciation to the Hospitals and Charities Commission, Red Cross Blood Bank, to the Ballarat "Courier," to BTV 6 and to 3BA, all of which have been most considerate of the needs of our hospital.

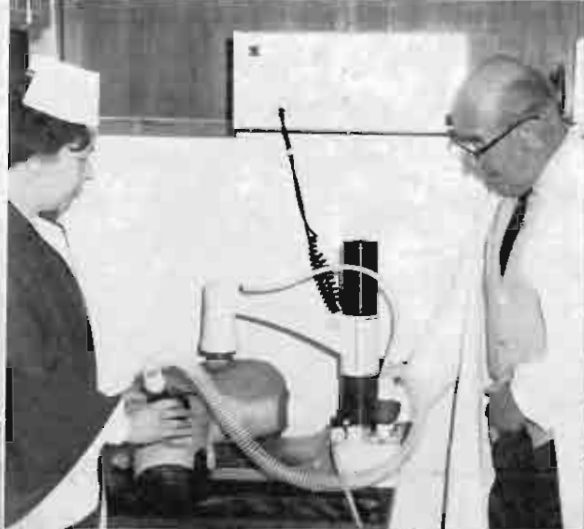

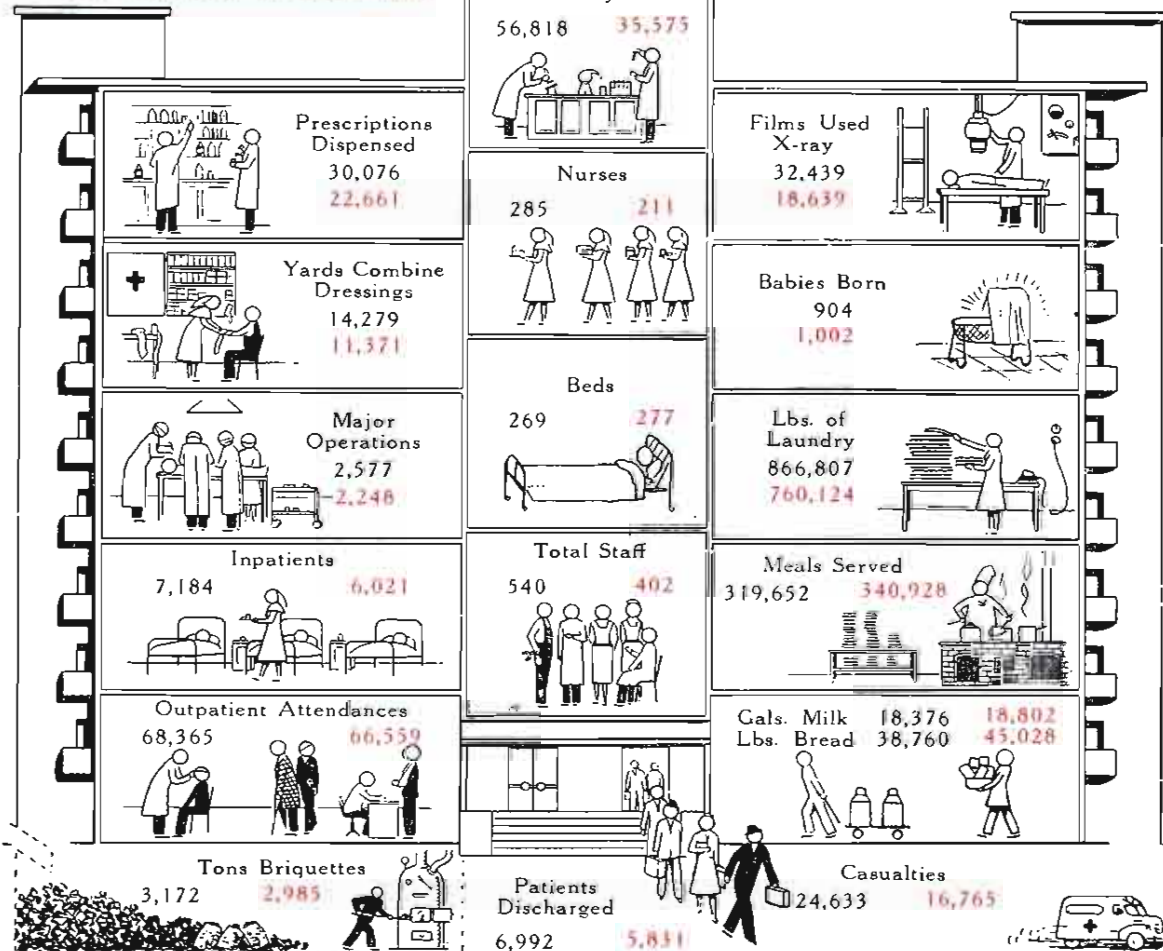
