## The Ninety-Fifth Annual Report

OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT  
FOR THE YEAR ENDED MARCH 31, 1952



The Committee of Management of the Ballarat and District Base Hospital takes pleasure in presenting to the Contributors the Ninety-Fifth Annual Report and Financial Statements for the year ended 31st March, 1952.

As in previous years, all services have been heavily availed of, often to an extent when accommodation has been considerably overtaxed. Reference to the statistical figures which are detailed elsewhere in this Report will prove of more than passing interest.

Attention is focussed on the following figures :

51,000 Out-patients.	9,767 X-ray investigations.
5,646 In-patients.	8,044 Pathological investigations.
1,320 Babies born.	422,991 Meals served.
343 Staff.	612,102 lbs. of laundry.

During the year a T.B. Thoracic Surgical Unit was established : a development of considerable importance, and a valuable contribution in the combatting of tuberculosis.

**BUILDING DEVELOPMENT:** The new Nurses' Home, erection of which was commenced on 21st October, 1947, was officially opened by His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, General Sir Dallas Brooks, K.C.B., C.M.G., D.S.O., R.M., on Wednesday, 21st November, 1951.

The building is one of which we are extremely proud, and it is gratifying to know that it has been so whole-heartedly approved by the many citizens who have inspected it. Dominating the city's western skyline, it represents an important milestone in an effort to provide fully for the sick and injured who are always with us.

Provided the present progress is maintained with the erection of the 100-bed Infectious Diseases and Tuberculosis building, it should be ready for occupation towards the end of the ensuing financial year.

Plans have been finalized for the erection of the new Services Building which will provide appropriate kitchen, steam, hot-water and other fundamental services. Unfortunately, the financial policy of the State Government has been restricted and, consequently, a commencement of building operations is delayed. It is sincerely hoped that this setback is only temporary.

Record is again made of the increasing demands being made upon the Hospital and the necessity to maintain a vigorous policy with regard to building development which, after all, is the only permanent solution to so many of our recurring problems.

**BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT:** A new temporary Diet Kitchen has been completed and is proving of inestimable value. The service, providing an individual approach to and control of diets, is a very worthwhile innovation.

The lease on the property in Errard Street (used as temporary accommodation for nurses) was discharged, coinciding with the opening of the new Nurses' Home. The Committee acknowledges the facilities made available to the Hospital during a critical period by Mr. and Mrs. C. M. Chisholm.

"Norwood" Hospital is still owned and controlled by your Committee, but its function will possibly be due for reconsideration during the coming year.

Rusden House, previously used for the accommodation of Nursing Staff, is now available to other than Nursing Staff for change and rest-room facilities.

A new Ironer, costing £5,383, has been installed in the Laundry, and a "Presha" Generator (£2,250) has been added to our Boiler equipment. Both units have added greatly to general efficiency.

All buildings and equipment have been maintained at a high level.

**NURSING:** "The Patient," for whom the Hospital actually functions, is dependent to a large extent on the direct contact with Nursing Staff. In Ballarat we are indeed fortunate to have sufficient staff to cope with the heavy demands, and provide a service which brings commendation from nearly every patient.

The Committee of Management acknowledges the high ethical qualities of the Nursing Staff and the loyal service performed during the year.

The Eighth Graduation Ceremony was the usual successful function, Miss P. Cumin-Scott (Staff Tutor, College of Nursing, Australia) being the Guest Speaker.

Sister J. A. Harris resumed as Sister Tutor, following her return from abroad, where she successfully completed post-graduate studies.

Sister J. Beverley accepted the position of Home Sister, vide Sister Shalley, who has gone abroad.

Other staff changes have occurred, and record is made of those who served the Hospital so faithfully.

**FINANCE:** Additional adjustments to the basic wage and cost of living increases, together with the resultant spiralling costs of food and other commodities, have affected the Hospital very considerably. The accumulated maintenance overdraft is the nett result, and, as has been expressed previously, the Committee must of necessity look towards the Government more and more to permit financial solvency. Such support has thus far always been forthcoming, as has the practical sympathy of the Ballarat and district citizens.

The Committee believes that the current system, whereby the Hospital is controlled by representatives of the Contributors, is in the best interests of patients, and therefore hopes that the citizens will continue to offer appropriate financial support to ensure the continuance of that policy.

The Appeal to furnish the new Nurses' Home was most gratifying, and record is made of the total response to date, which includes the sponsoring of the following:

and represents a Total of £7,385.

To all who associated themselves with the project, the Committee of Management expresses warm appreciation.

Thanks to the Management of 3BA, arrangements have been made for a Radio Appeal to be conducted on Sunday, 7th September, 1952. It is three years since a similar Appeal was held for the Hospital, and the Committee is hoping for the same generous response.

**COMMITTEE:** Messrs. W. C. Oakes, R. A. Must, F. E. Duncan, H. C. Evans, Drs. W. A. Sloss and A. C. H. Salter retire by effluxion of time, and are eligible for re-election.

**GENERAL:** To achieve complete success, within the Hospital there must be team work, goodwill and support. Your Committee believes that these conditions have existed in Ballarat.

Every assistance has been received from the Hospital and Charities Commission, and the Committee desires to record its appreciation of many acts of helpfulness.

Especially to the Honorary Professional Staff (Medical and Dental), and also the paid staff, the Committee expresses thanks for yet another year of service.

Special mention must be made of the work of the several Auxiliaries (referred to elsewhere in this Report): the Ballarat Travellers who donated £707/14/-; the employees of the Lifeguard Milk Company, who presented additional ward equipment; the kindness of the Ballarat "Courier" 3BA; the Red Cross Society; the school children of Ballarat and district who collected 1,744 dozen eggs, and all who helped to brighten Christmas for the patients.

My two years as President have convinced me of the extent to which the Hospital is responsible for the health of the community. I sincerely hope that the Hospital will never be found wanting by those who, in times of sickness and accident, seek its services.

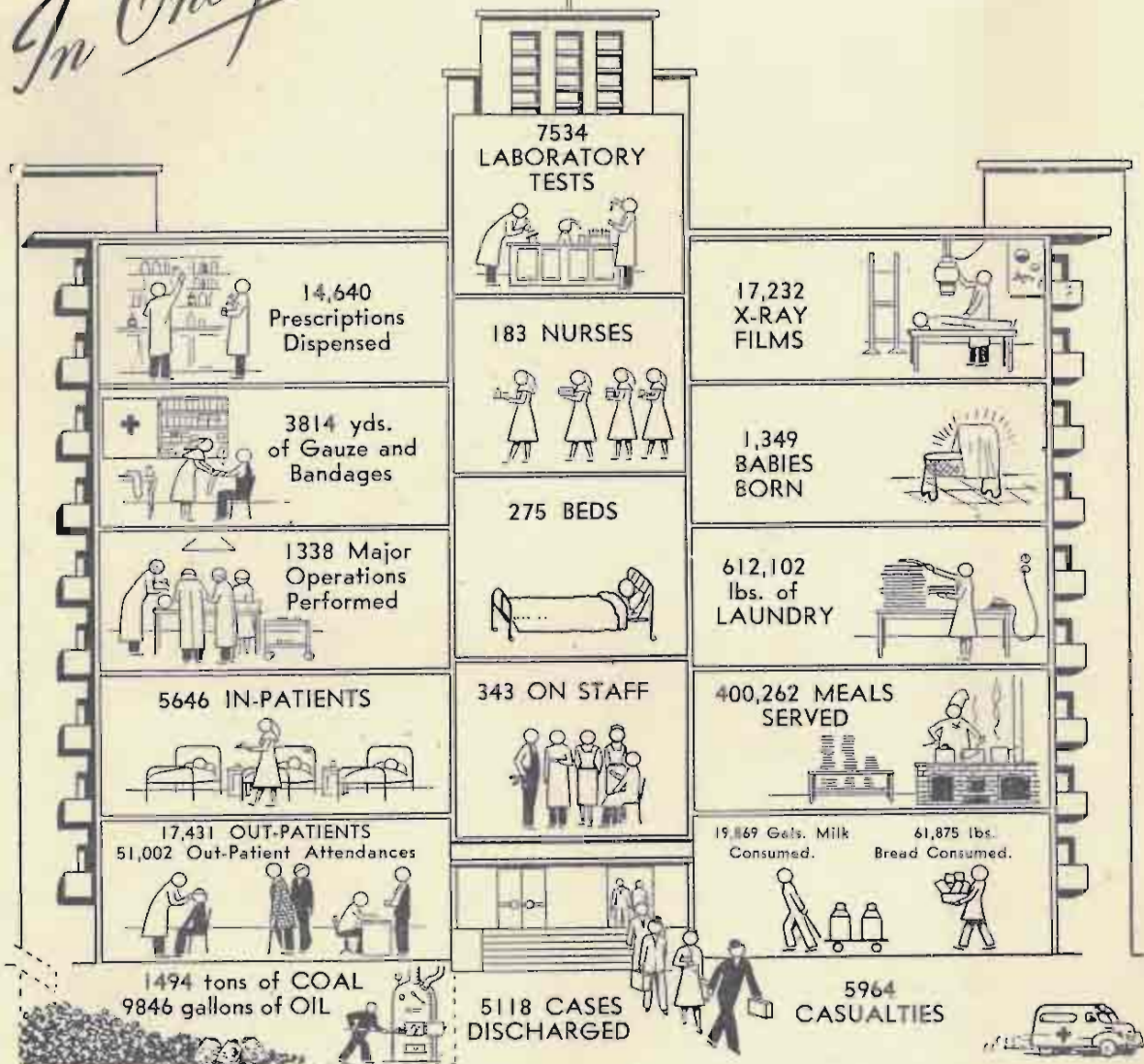

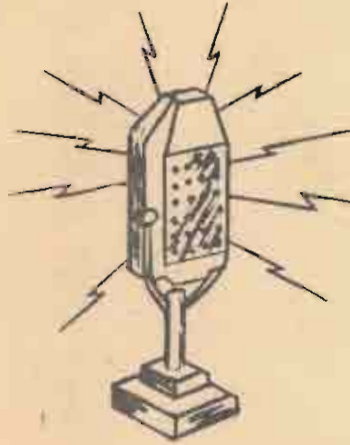
