Annual Report

OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT
FOR THE TWELVE MONTHS ENDED 30th JUNE, 1959.

To the Life Governors and Contributors :

Ladies and Gentlemen,

As stated in last year's report, the necessary emphasis on development at this Hospital is that concerning casualty and outpatient facilities, although, as will be commented on later in this report, there is a pressing need for more "acute" medical beds.

Plans for the extensions and alterations of the Casualty and Outpatients' building have reached an advanced stage, and the splendid financial contribution by the public of Ballarat and District, through the May 1959 3BA Hospital Radio Appeal, with the certain promise of Governmental subsidy, will enable the Hospital to call tenders for construction work in the new financial year. Sketch plans, on the basis of the Hospital's thoughts, have been prepared by the Architects' Division of the Hospitals and Charities Commission, and, among other features, they provide for the following major improvements:—

- complete separation of Casualty Department from Outpatients' facilities;
- provision of a lift to permit ease of patients' and staff access;
- provision of planned Dental facilities, including dental laboratory;
- expansion of Medical Records and Outpatients' offices;
- provision for deep therapy ("Peter MacCallum" Clinic) unit;
- provision of an X-ray room adjoining "dirty wounds" Casualty Theatre;
- provision of good facilities for "primory" treatment dressings and for observation of the sick and injured;
- additional Casualty Theatre for "clean wounds" work;
- re-arrangement of consulting and examination cubicles, with provision of waiting room for patients;
- provision of a creche for patients' children.

BUILDING DEVELOPMENTS

The "Edward Price Department of Pathology" was opened by Dr. J. H. Lindell, Chairman of the Hospitals and Charities Commission, on 19th October 1958. The Department is now fully-operative in its extended and re-modelled form. The number of tests performed for the full year was 29,895, compared with 25,403 in the previous year. In accordance with the Hospital's stated policy, training for the Diploma of Medical Laboratory Technology is being fostered by the Department now that full facilities are available. Generally speaking, the pathology services of the Hospital continue to expand and develop, and credit is due to the progressive interest of Dr. K. C. Porter, the Pathologist. The statistics speak for themselves — towards the end of the year under review, tests were being performed at the rate of 40,000 per year.

New covered-way connections between several of the main buildings have been completed. Apart from providing sheltered walkways for the transport of patients, the greater convenience of staff and visitors, and for transport of supplies and food trolleys, the provision of these covered-ways has enabled an early start to be made on the installation of new electricity reticulation lines, hot water radiation and condensate return for the Medical Wards, Casualty-Outpatients and Administration Building.

A new Post-operative Resuscitation Room was completed during the year by the Hospital's staff and will commence its important function upon the appointment of an appropriately-trained nurse. The provision of this unit, with the advent of covered-ways, will relieve the surgical wards and ensure that patients, following operation, are fully recovered from anaesthesia prior to return to their ward beds.

Work is practically completed on conversion of the old workshop area for a modern Physiotherapy Department. This Department is at present temporarily situated on the first floor of Yuille House in an area which is needed for the expansion of the Children's Ward.

In addition to providing good facilities for the Physiotherapy Department, and as a step towards development of a planned Rehabilitation programme, the Hospital has established an Occupational Therapy Department in part of "Rusden House," which is a building adjacent to the re-modelled Physiotherapy Department. Miss Susan Gorran, our recently-appointed Occupational Therapist, is at present setting up the Department and providing inpatient care. We are confident that patients will derive considerable benefit from this service, the full value of which will become apparent when Physiotherapy, Speech and Occupational Therapy and the Medical Social Work Departments are functioning as an integrated whole.

Early in the new financial year, new major X-ray plant will come into use. It consists of a "Siemens" table and "Stonford" components. It is one of the finest units of its type in Australia. This plant, which cost £9,730, will enable the radiologists and the department's staff to undertake a wider range of work, more expeditiously than was previously practicable. It is worthy of note that Hospital staff undertook the very detailed preparation of a former store-room to house the new plant. The total cost of room preparation and equipment purchase is over £12,000.

As mentioned previously in this report, the need for additional "medical" beds is an acute one, which must be faced with resolution. The two existing medical wards, which are known as the "Queen Victoria" building, have accommodation for some 60-65 patients. Both wards are soon to have "dov" ereos, which will be provided by closing in the north verandahs: this will add to the comfort and also speed the convalescence of patients, but will not provide additional beds. The annual percentage occupancy of beds in this building is 88% in the female ward and 80% in the male ward. The Hospital is greatly indebted to the Queen Elizabeth Home for the splendid co-operation which enables accommodation problems to be overcome during periods of greatest difficulty.

Another problem for earnest consideration in the forthcoming year will be the complete re-organisation of the Birth Suite of the midwifery floor. It is proposed also to co-ordinate the nursing administration of all midwifery services rather than have separate "public" and "non-public" nursing and birthroom staffs. In other words, the public and non-public birth suite nursing services will be provided in the same manner as the Operating Theatre service.

A private automatic (internal) telephone installation (P.A.X.) was completed recently. This has greatly improved the internal and external communication facilities.

The Windermere Street frontage has been greatly improved by the erection of wire mesh and re-built iron fencing; the City Council has constructed a concrete gutter and kerb, on a cost-sharing arrangement with the Hospital.

MEDICAL AND ANCILLARY MEDICAL SERVICES

THE PETER MacCALLUM CLINIC continues to provide a first class decentralised service to the Ballarat and districts' community. Established in March 1957 as the first such clinic outside the metropolitan area, the clinic was attended this year by 622 patients, and there were 1,292 superficial therapy treatments given.

THE ORTHOPTIC CLINIC, conducted at the Hospital by visiting orthoptists every six weeks, provides an important ancillary-medical service to patients referred from eye specialists. The orthoptists help patients, mostly young children, to use both eyes correctly, and, by eye muscle re-education, to correct "turns" in one or both eyes.

THE SPEECH THERAPY CLINIC is yet another specialised service which obviates the need for Ballarat and district residents to travel to Melbourne for treatment. Speech Therapy, the remedial correction of speech defects in both children and adults, is used effectively in the many cases of stammering, lisping and vocal disorders referred by doctors during the year, and there were 1,426 treatments given. School teachers play a large part in encouraging parents to seek this aid for their children.

Physical developments in the PHYSIOTHERAPY DEPARTMENT have been mentioned elsewhere in this report, but it is worthy of report that the activities of the Department have increased very considerably. 9,630 treatments were given in 1957/58, but 12,178 treatments were sought and given in the year ended June 30th 1959. An additional appointment, that of Miss Madeline Stock, was made during the year to meet these demands, and also those required in the Regional Hospitals. The visiting service was extended to the Bacchus Marsh Hospital in April and attendance figures show that Hospital to be keenly interested in the scheme. Very considerable interest is being displayed by the Donald, St. Arnaud, Maryborough, Daylesford and Clunes District Hospitals, in addition to Bacchus Marsh. 500 miles per week are travelled by the Regional Physiotherapy services.

DENTAL SERVICES: Comment was made in last year's report of the need for an inter-institutional dental service in Ballarat. In view of the fact that there are no local means for the provision of dentures to pensioners and other necessitous people, apart from the practical kindness of honorary dental surgeons who provide dentures at reduced cost in many deserving instances, the problem of meeting these needs is pressing.

Although no steps have as yet been taken in this particular direction, your Committee is pleased to announce that a modern clinic is to be established, in conjunction with current building works, to replace the small Dental Clinic room and waiting area in Yuille House. The new clinic will be situated on the first floor level of the Outpatients Building.

THE BLOOD BANK is conducted regularly each week at the Hospital by honorary doctors working in conjunction with voluntary aides of the Ballarat Branch of the Australian Red Cross Society. Demands for blood totalled 1,834 pints in the year ended June 30th 1959, with a maximum monthly demand of 179 pints. The greater volume of this blood is used in Ballarat's two general hospitals, but all requests from the Region's hospitals are also met.

THE BALLARAT DISTRICT NURSING SOCIETY AND THE QUEEN ELIZABETH HOME continue to give the utmost co-operation in helping to maintain a "fluid" bed state at the Hospital. In order to assist the District Nursing Society to broaden the scope of its services to the community, the Hospital has been pleased to join in discussions with the Hospitals and Charities Commission. Dr. J. W. Hill, Medical Superintendent, has been appointed to the Society's Committee, and the belief is expressed that such close relationship with the Hospital will be of mutual benefit to both bodies. The Society's service range has recently been extended from 10 to 15 miles from Ballarat. 8,437 individual visits were made this year by the Society's nursing sisters, attending to 763 patients. Demands for hospital accommodation have certainly been avoided by the Society's activities.

APPRECIATION TO HONORARY STAFF: Warm appreciation is expressed by the Committee for the skilled services and interest of the Honorary Staff, whose members, in addition to normal clinical duties, have given freely of their valuable time by instruction and lectures to nursing students, both general and midwifery.

Outpatient services of the Hospital have developed greatly in the last few years and this trend is expected to continue, especially in the light of building developments. The Committee is deeply grateful to the Honorary Staff for its major contribution in this connection.

HONORARY STAFF CHANGES: Mr. J. H. Pryor, M.B., B.S., F.R.C.S., was recently welcomed to the staff as Honorary Outpatients' Surgeon.

Warm tributes were paid to Mr. G. R. Davidson, M.B., B.S., F.R.C.S. (Edin), F.R.A.C.S., Honorary Urologist, and Dr. E. R. G. Sheil, M.B., B.S., B.Sc., Honorary Physician, who retired by effluxion of time, and to Mr. J. V. Dale, B.D.Sc., L.D.S., Honorary Dental Surgeon, who resigned during the year.

Mr. K. J. Neerhut, M.B., B.S., F.R.A.C.S., and Dr. J. S. T. Stevens, M.B., B.S., M.R.C.P., were appointed Honorary Urologist and Honorary Physician, having previously held appointments as Honorary Assistant Urologist-Outpatients' Surgeon, and Honorary Outpatients' Physician respectively.

Mr. J. A. V. Irwin, B.D.Sc., L.D.S., replaced Mr. Dale and he is also welcomed to the Honorary Dental Staff.

Mrs. Austin Lynch, daughter of the late Dr. Douglas, joined the Official Party on this occasion, in company with Mr. Lynch.

The standard of the Hospital's nursing education is highly satisfactory, as is indicated by the following examination results:

We are very happy to report that Miss Langham has made a good recovery from the illness which necessitated her absence for two months recently.

Sister R. Westwood resigned as Assistant Sister Tutor in March 1959 to undertake the post-graduate course for the Sister-Tutor Diploma. The Hospital's best wishes accompany Sister Westwood, who rendered very good service in the field of nurse education.

CENTRAL HIGHLANDS HOSPITAL REGION

As the base hospital in this Region, your Hospital has a good deal to offer in an advisory capacity and, whilst from the practical standpoint it is true that District Hospitals are "self-supporting" in many directions, the Base Hospital is increasingly looked to for service in a number of ways. To this end, the following regional activities are conducted:

REGIONAL MEDICAL DISCUSSIONS: The monthly clinical meeting (to which all doctors in the Regional are invited) makes a valuable contribution to improved standards of Hospital care, and fosters co-operation amongst practitioners. The Regional Medical Library is a useful facility, and, although not extensively used, is readily available for reference.

ANCILLARY SERVICES

REGIONAL PHYSIOTHERAPY SERVICE: Reference has been made elsewhere in this report to the expansion of this service. 1,613 treatments were given in the regional hospitals by the visiting physiotherapists. At the present time there is a rapidly-growing interest in this service. The hospitals at Donald, St. Arnaud, Maryborough, Daylesford, Clunes and Bocchus Marsh are visited each week.

ENGINEERING: The Base Hospital Engineer and Staff are called on from time to time to attend to equipment maintenance needs of outlying Hospitals. Although such calls are time consuming and cause delays in this Hospital's own maintenance programme, this responsibility is willingly shouldered. Beaufort, Clunes and Creswick Hospitals have been assisted during the year.

RESERVE EQUIPMENT: A few calls have been made by district hospitals during the year for the loan of such items as "Insulcots." The latter units, provided by the Hospitals and Charities Commission, have given good service and, doubtless, have helped to save the lives of premature infants in this Hospital and in the Region's smaller hospitals.

REGIONAL BLOOD BANK: Emergency supplies of blood, although not great in volume, are delivered each month to hospitals in the Regional area; delivery is made by the Ballarat Ambulance Service, and also by Red Cross Branch members. Donors from the regional area have creditably supported the Blood Bank.

ADMINISTRATIVE: Delegates of all Hospital Committees of Management in the Region, Managers and Matrons continue to meet at Ballarat at three-monthly intervals for useful deliberations of the Regional Council. Reports from all Hospitals are brought forward and discussion takes place on matters of mutual interest. Delegates from the Ballarat and District Nursing Service and the Ballarat and District Ambulance Service also attend meetings. The Ballarat Branch of the Australian Red Cross Society will appoint representatives in the near future.

Several very interesting and informative addresses have been delivered during the year, including those of Dr. Colin Robjohns, Medical Superintendent of Queen Elizabeth Home ("Geriatrics"), Mr. Whittaker, Hospitals and Charities Commission Regional Engineer based at Terang, and Mr. Keith Mackay, Executive Director of Queen Elizabeth Home ("Overseas Care of The Aged").

MEDICAL STAFF: Dr. J. W. Hill, M.B., B.S., Medical Superintendent, is making an increasingly important contribution to many aspects of the Hospital's future planning, and medical administration continues to prosper under his medical superintendence. He has devoted much time and thought to the improvement of Casualty and Outpatients' Department services. All of the basic planning for building extensions and alterations has been carried out with his full interest and co-operation. In November 1958 Dr. Hill attended the Pan-Pacific

Rehabilitation Conference in Sydney. Dr. Hill and Sister Beverley, Assistant Matron (who also attended the Conference) subsequently presented stimulating and thought-provoking information regarding rehabilitation. As a result, your Committee has approved in principle the development of integrated Rehabilitation services of this Hospital. There is no doubt that a pressing need exists for such a service for the complete rehabilitation of patients, to enable them to re-commence their workday lives with minimum delay after discharge from hospital, or to render them less dependent on others. This can only be achieved by bringing together Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy and Medical Social services into one cohesive programme; with the establishment of Physiotherapy Department in the old workshops building, (adjacent to Rusden House), planning to include other ancillary services in the latter building will be a practicable proposition.

During the past twelve months, several leaders in their respective fields visited Ballarat, and very helpful discussions took place at the Hospital.

Visitors included Mr. Henry Gussane, Director of the noted Birmingham Accident Centre; Dr. Morjorie Warren, world authority on Geriatrics; Professor S. Rubbo, Director of the Melbourne University, Department of Bacteriology, who addressed medical and nursing staffs on the problems of "cross-infection," and Dr. J. C. Laver, Medical Superintendent of the Royal Women's Hospital, Melbourne, who advised on future planning of the Hospital's midwifery facilities.

RESIDENT MEDICAL STAFF: Your Hospital was fortunate to obtain a full complement of Resident Medical Officers this year, in the face of the present acute shortage of graduates from the University of Melbourne. With the assistance of the Hospitals and Charities Commission, two English graduates — Dr. John F. Garner and Dr. Paula Thomas, were appointed to the staff. They have already proved themselves most capable officers. Dr. Ian Allen, who is in his second year at Ballarat, has been appointed a Senior Resident Medical Officer, as has Dr. Garner, and the Junior Resident "team" consists of Drs. C. M. Yeung, P. A. McKenna, Paulo Thomas and C. L. Matthews.

RETIREMENT OF MR. F. GRAHAM: On 31st December 1958, Mr. Fred Graham retired after 43 years' service to the hospital. Mr. Graham commenced duty in 1915 as a dispensary assistant, and he also coped with porter's and lodgekeeping duties.* At other times Mr. Graham acted as wardsman, yardman, laundryman, theatre attendant, ambulance driver and storeman. From 1943 to the date of his retirement he was the Hospital's official Collector. Mr. Graham has at all times been one of the greatest ambassadors for goodwill towards the Hospital, and it is true to say that no employer could have been better served than the Hospital has been by Mr. Graham. He is respected, admired and loved, throughout the length and breadth of Ballarat and District.

On your behalf, the Committee of Management and the staff of the Hospital wish Mr. and Mrs. Graham a long and happy retirement. The opportunity was taken to make a number of presentations to Mr. Graham.

3BA RADIO APPEAL: As stated in the introduction to this Report the measure of public support to the "Cash for Casualty" Appeal in May 1959 (the amount of £14,000 was raised)—will enable the Committee to press for an early commencement on those urgent building and alteration works.

It would be quite impossible to make mention of each of the many voluntary helpers to the Appeal. Our thanks have been expressed in other ways. Some of the Appeal highlights were:—

"Operation Doorknock" (£3,392), organised by the Junior Chamber of Commerce, with the assistance of many Ballarat organisations, the Shire of Ballarat and the Borough of Sebastopol. This effort was undoubtedly a record for any local appeal.

The Car Raffle (£2,842-net) organised by Mr. O. R. D. Harris, Station Officer Steele and the Ballarat Fire Brigades, with the assistance of Messrs. A. G. Onley and F. Graham, once again proved a most popular feature of the Appeal, and sincere thanks are expressed for the magnificent amount of voluntary support to this particular effort.

The 3BA Popularity Poll, the "Jock Davey" Show and G.T.V. 9's "In Ballarat Tonight" brought in £1,900.

The school children of Ballarat raised £669, and our special thanks go to Mr. A. D. Burke, Head Master of the Golden Point School for his energy and drive in organising this major effort by school children in the district.

Once again the Directors, Management and Staff of 3BA have earned our warm and lasting admiration and thanks for sponsoring the Appeal and making the result possible.

For his exemplary drive and enthusiasm, the Committee has expressed its warm thanks to Mr. H. C. Tippet, Chairman of the Appeal Committee. Mr. Tippet devoted a great deal of his personal time to the general promotion of the Appeal and paid close attention to every aspect of its organisation. Mr. David Karmouche, Assistant Manager, was relieved from his normal Hospital duties for four months to act as Appeal Co-ordinator. He did an excellent job.

The opportunity is taken to extend best wishes to Mr. Karmouche on his imminent departure from the hospital administrative sphere, following his appointment to an important position in local private industry.

The Committee's best wishes will accompany Mr. and Mrs. Karmauche.

"COMMUNITY CHEST" DISCUSSIONS: During the year, several Council members and the Secretary of the Geelong Community Chest visited Ballarat, at your Committee's invitation, to present information on the development of a "Community Chest." Representatives of major fund-raising and "Service" organisations were present at one meeting, in company with delegates from the Queen Elizabeth Home and this Hospital. No action is contemplated at present as a result of the discussions, but the way remains open for further consideration of the matter when the time is believed to be more propitious.

AUXILIARIES

THE "MARY-HELEN" AUXILIARY has completed its 30th year of valuable aid to the Hospital. Apart from assistance towards linen purchases, Christmas and Easter "cheer" to the patients, the Auxiliary donated a "Levitt" bath lift, ward chairs and the Hospital's share of cost of a Boyle's anaesthetic machine for the Casualty Theatre.

Congratulations are extended to Mrs. A. St. C. Wallace, President, Mrs. J. Ritchie (Honorary Secretary) and Mrs. L. Trevenen (Honorary Treasurer), for a most successful year of office, and to all members for their interest and support. In recognition of the Auxiliary's sustained help, Life Governorships were conferred on two former Presidents, namely Mesdames F. G. Haak and G. A. Gillbert.

THE RAILWAYS AUXILIARY, under the Presidency of Mr. J. F. B. Townsend, ably assisted by his office bearers and members, completed an active year of very effective service to the Hospital.

Mr. H. L. Robertson again acted as "Father" Christmas during the Festive Season and distributed gifts to patients in the Children's wards. These gifts are provided by "The Sun Toy Fund." Sweets were provided by Mrs. E. M. Davis and her son Ron, and ice creams were also distributed.

The Auxiliary also enabled the Hospital to purchase four special recovery trolleys for the newly-established Post-Operative Recovery Unit. These were formally presented during the year. The Hospital's Committee members present at the presentation ceremony took the opportunity to express grateful thanks for the efforts of this valuable auxiliary.

Although not so well known for their activities, the HOSPITAL YOUNGER SET AUXILIARY is doing a very worthwhile job in its aim to endow and maintain a £500 cot, as well as providing infants' clothing for the Children's Ward. To this end, activities to raise money during the year included house parties, a Christmas Dance, barbecues and card parties.

The Committee records its appreciation to the Auxiliary whose members have completed a successful year under the Presidency of Miss P. Muir.

THE SUNSHINE CIRCLE has continued to distribute magazine reading matter to patients, and the thoughtful kindness of this small group of ladies is greatly appreciated. Mention is made at this point of the group's donation of £100 to the Radio Appeal—a gesture which merits our warmest thanks.

Compared with the previous year, expenses rose by 3.9% from £363,079 (£14,184 increase) and income rose by 2.7% from £365,130 (£10,046 increase).

The financial result for the year was a deficit of £2,087, which, in relation to total running costs of £377,263, demonstrates that the financial stability which has been in evidence for the past three years has continued. On the other hand, the Maintenance account overdraft (including creditors at 30th June) stands at £76,523 — which is a cause for great concern to your Committee.

It is apparent that Governmental assistance towards accumulated Maintenance overdraft reduction is the only possible solution to this problem.

Despite the closest attention to unpaid accounts collection, the total outstanding continues to rise. There is little doubt that the ease of public involvement under "hire purchase" agreements has reacted to the detriment of hospitals. Your Committee re-emphasises the importance of obtaining and retaining membership of an approved hospital-medical benefit insurance fund.

STAFF APPRECIATION: Sincere appreciation is recorded to the Hospital's efficient, loyal and interested staff for their achievement of a very high standard of service to the Community's sick and injured.

Much of that accomplished is due to enthusiastic interest over and above that which is measured in terms of salaries and wages.

RESIGNATION OF MANAGER: Your Committee has recently accepted, with sincere regret, the resignation of Mr. A. E. Miller as Manager and Secretary. Mr. Miller will leave the Hospital in December next, after six years' service, in order to enter the Anglican Ministry following theological training in Queensland.

The Committee's best wishes will accompany Mr. and Mrs. Miller and their family.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT: Dr. W. A. Sloss, M.B.E., was granted leave of absence during the year on the grounds of ill-health. Prior to his illness Dr. Sloss had served continuously on the Committee for a period of 30 years, including three years as President. His presence at meetings and other functions was greatly missed. As this Report goes to press Dr. Sloss' health is improving steadily and the sincere wish is expressed that he may soon be able to take an active part in Hospital affairs.

Mr. M. B. John was granted six months' leave of absence to undertake an overseas business trip from which he will return late in 1959.

Mr. R. A. Must as the representative of Messrs. Cuthbert, Morrow, Must and Show, our Honorary Solicitors, has again spent a considerable amount of time on legal matters for the Hospital, and is deserving of our best thanks.

Messrs. E. G. Ludbrook, M. B. John, J. H. Heinz and H. C. Tippett retire by effluxion of time, and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election.

In conclusion, I would extend my sincere thanks and appreciation to all Committee members for their active interest and support throughout the year.

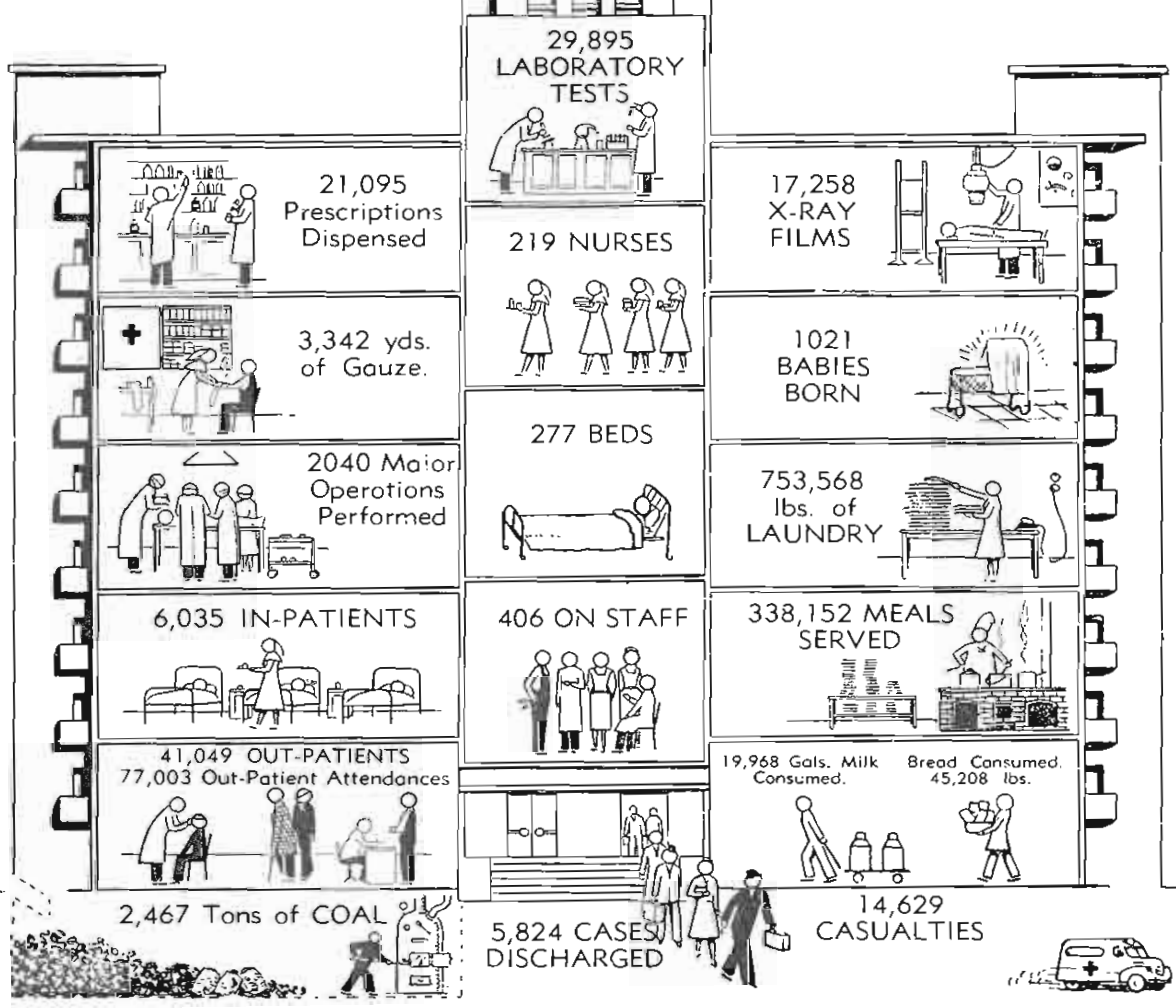
