## "A Young Patient in Modern Society"

Not long ago, a young girl aged 5 years, was admitted to hospital: it was thought that she was suffering from pneumonia. She had dark skin and was a waif, which mattered not at all to the hospital.

Marie (as we shall call her) was completely investigated and found to be suffering from tuberculosis. What then was to be done?

If Marie was to have a chance, she must remain in hospital for nearly twelve months; many expensive drugs would have to be given, numerous X-rays and pathological examinations involved, and, in fact, all the services of the hospital called upon. The total cost would amount to approximately £750, and even then the result was not certain. Fortunately, in our civilized world of today, the policy of hospitals enables a quick decision to be made and soon Marie's treatment began.

She came in contact with the staff in the various departments and became a much loved figure around the hospital, and as time went by showed signs of responding to her treatment. Members of the staff took more than a casual interest in this little girl and bestowed many personal kindnesses.

At the end of 10 months, Marie had made a complete recovery: she has since been discharged from hospital and is being well cared for and able to look to the future like any other child.

The vast hospital organization, the result of nearly a century of development, had successfully functioned in her interests, and all concerned had very mixed feelings when the day came to say good-bye to Marie.

Such cases as this occur at the hospital very frequently: the results are not revealed in the balance sheet, but it is true that many children, and adults too, owe their very existence to the hospital organization.

Included in this report are illustrations depicting aspects of complete treatment, the cost of which is not always apparent. The skilled care of the doctor and nurse would not be possible without highly trained technical staff, good food, steam, hot water, efficient equipment, laundry, buildings and planning, etc.

This true story is but a reminder that the Ballarat and District Base Hospital is organized to help each and everyone of us in time of sickness or accident, and we should ever remember our inherent obligation to be unselfish in our thoughts for others.



In the future, even greater emphasis will be focussed on preventive developments.

## The Ninety-Fourth Annual Report

OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT  
FOR THE YEAR ENDED MARCH 31, 1951



The Committee of Management of the Ballarat and District Base Hospital has the honour to present to the Contributors the Ninety-Fourth Annual Report and Financial Statements for the year ended 31st March, 1951.

An examination of the Figures (financial and statistical), which are detailed elsewhere in this report, will reveal the extent to which the hospital services have been used.

To achieve its purpose, a hospital must progress with the times, and notable advances during the year under review include :

- ★ The appointment of a full-time appropriately qualified Pathologist.
- ★ The development of the proposal to establish a T.B. Thoracic Surgical Unit and an Advisory Consultative Out-Patient Cancer Clinic.
- ★ The Ambulance Service being developed by the recently-appointed Ambulance Committee. Existing vehicles and other assets of the Service were handed over on 1st June, 1950.

Each of these progressive measures will further improve the over-all health scheme available to the community.

**BUILDING DEVELOPMENT**. Capital expenditure in the past year has been considerable. The new Nurses' Home which dominates the city's western skyline, and is already a landmark, should have been completed by now had the work gone according to plan. The post-war problems common to all building projects in the Commonwealth, shortage of materials and the incidence of the 40-hour week, have not passed us by. It is now expected that the Home will be finished and opened within a few months. This serviceable and up-to-date building will surely meet with the approval of the many who will inspect it after it is opened.

When the Committee presents its next annual report, it hopes to be able to record the near completion of the 100-bed Infectious Diseases and Tuberculosis building. Steady progress is being made with its erection, but completion is more than 12 months ahead.

Plans have been finalized for the new Services Building, and it is expected that tenders will be invited and work commenced before December, 1951. This building will include a new boiler installation, providing essential hot water and steam and, in addition, a new kitchen is to be incorporated.

Arrangements are in hand for a Group Laundry to be established at the Queen Elizabeth Benevolent Home. This arrangement, when completed, should prove very satisfactory. A new Ironing Machine, costing £5000, has been placed on order and will, at a later date, be transferred to the Group Laundry.

Generally, we can be satisfied with the progress of our building development. It will be upwards of twenty years before the complete 500-bed hospital with all appropriate services is completed. Naturally, in the meantime, many temporary arrangements must be made.

**NURSING:** That all wards and departments have functioned to capacity does not mean that your Committee has not been faced with staffing problems that are common to most businesses and organizations today. The shortage of staff is brought about, not because nursing is a profession unattractive to young women, for, contrary to general belief, more girls than ever are taking up nursing. What is often overlooked is the ever-expanding hospital service and the effects of the 40-hour week.

The Committee of Management realises that the Nursing Staff has been most loyal and co-operative qualities that have enabled the Hospital to give a full measure of service, notwithstanding difficulties of readily filling the vacancies that occur.

The 7th Annual Graduation Ceremony was an outstanding success, and we were honoured to have with us as Guest Speaker, Major-General F. Kingsley Norris, Director-General of the Medical Services of the Australian Army.

**MAINTENANCE OF BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT:** The Hospitals and Charities Commission has continued to make it possible for the Committee of Management, amongst other things, to maintain buildings and equipment in a satisfactory condition. The war-time leg is now almost completely adjusted, and it is our policy to maintain all existing assets at a high level.

Mr. E. McBain has replaced Mr. Colmer (resigned) as Chief Engineer.

**FINANCE:** The diminishing purchasing power of the pound is well known to every citizen, and there is no magic formula by which it can be stretched further in a hospital than in the home. Just as it becomes more costly for the individual to live, so, too, is it more expensive to treat the sick.

The Balance Sheet records a substantial accumulated overdraft. What cannot be set down so concisely is the health of the community, the present high standard of which is an invaluable asset to which your Committee feels the Hospital has contributed in no small way by the service it provides.

It is known that many new and expensive drugs are now available. These are of vital importance to a patient for they help to reduce the stay in hospital and, in the case of a wage-earner, allow him to return to work sooner than was formerly possible.

The cost of medical supplies and food, and the salaries and wages bill which has increased threefold in the last five years, are reasons why finance is a serious problem.

The financial burden has caused the Committee to rely more and more on the Government to provide sufficient finance. At the same time, it is conscious of the desirability of the hospital being controlled by a voluntary Committee. It is hoped therefore that full local support will be maintained.

**COMMITTEE:** Messrs. J. McKay, R. Humphreys and H. H. Jephson retire by effluxion of time and are eligible for re-election.

**"NORWOOD" HOSPITAL:** "Norwood" Hospital annexe, accommodating midwifery patients, is still controlled by your Committee, and continues to provide sufficient beds to meet the demand. During the year 275 babies were born at "Norwood." The thanks of the Committee are extended to Sister Crawford for her continued loyal help.

**GENERAL:** Many things contribute to what a Hospital Committee can achieve. Besides the co-operation of the staff, there must be the support of the community, and we feel that we have had both.

The Honorary Medical and Dental Staffs are generous in the giving of time and ability, and fully deserve the sincere thanks of all concerned. In this regard, special mention is made of Dr. J. C. Douglas, who has resigned from the Honorary Staff after 27 years of sterling service. The Committee records its appreciation of one whose courtesy was unfailing, and whose efficiency and generosity beyond question.

The paid staff, too, has worked diligently in the best interests of the Hospital, and the Committee records its thanks.

The success of the Staff Association is also worthy of note.

So many acts of kindness were bestowed upon the Hospital in the past year that it is not possible to mention them all. However, special reference is made to the work of the several Auxiliaries, the Ballarat Travellers who donated £492/7/-, the employees of the Lifeguard Milk Company who presented equipment, Mr. Hon and party who kindly made available a piano for the patients in Ward 6, the kindness of the Ballarat "Courier" and 3BA, the Red Cross Society, the school children of Ballarat and district who collected 2092 dozen eggs, and all who helped to brighten Christmas for the patients.

With almost a century of service to our credit, we shall continue to do all in our power to cope with all demands made upon us by the sick and suffering of this district.


