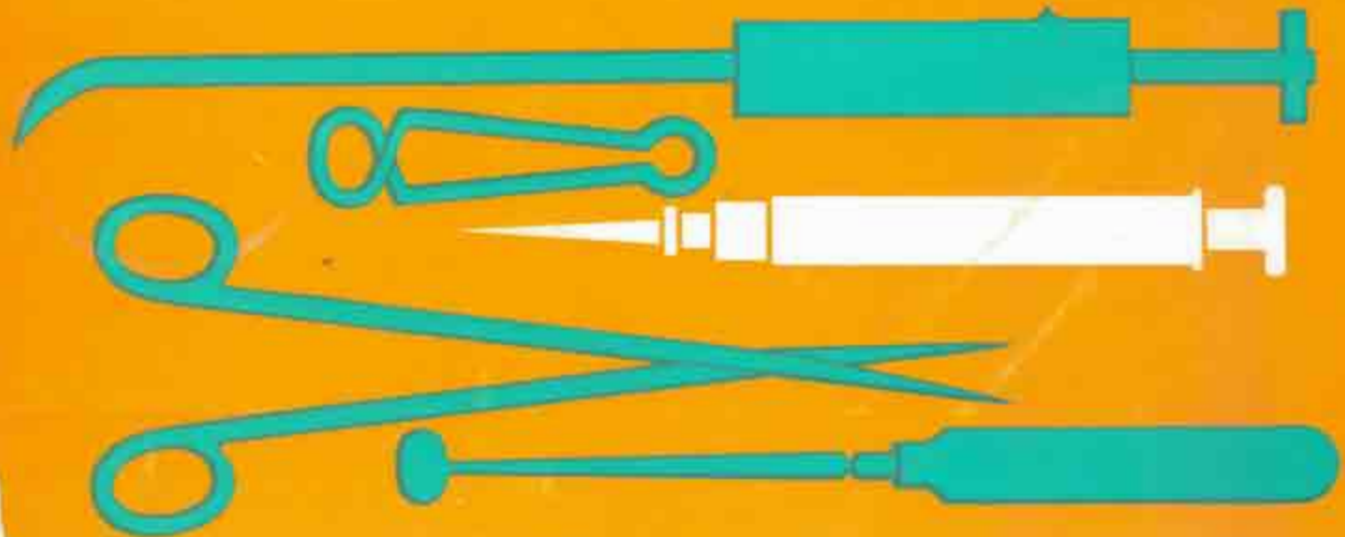
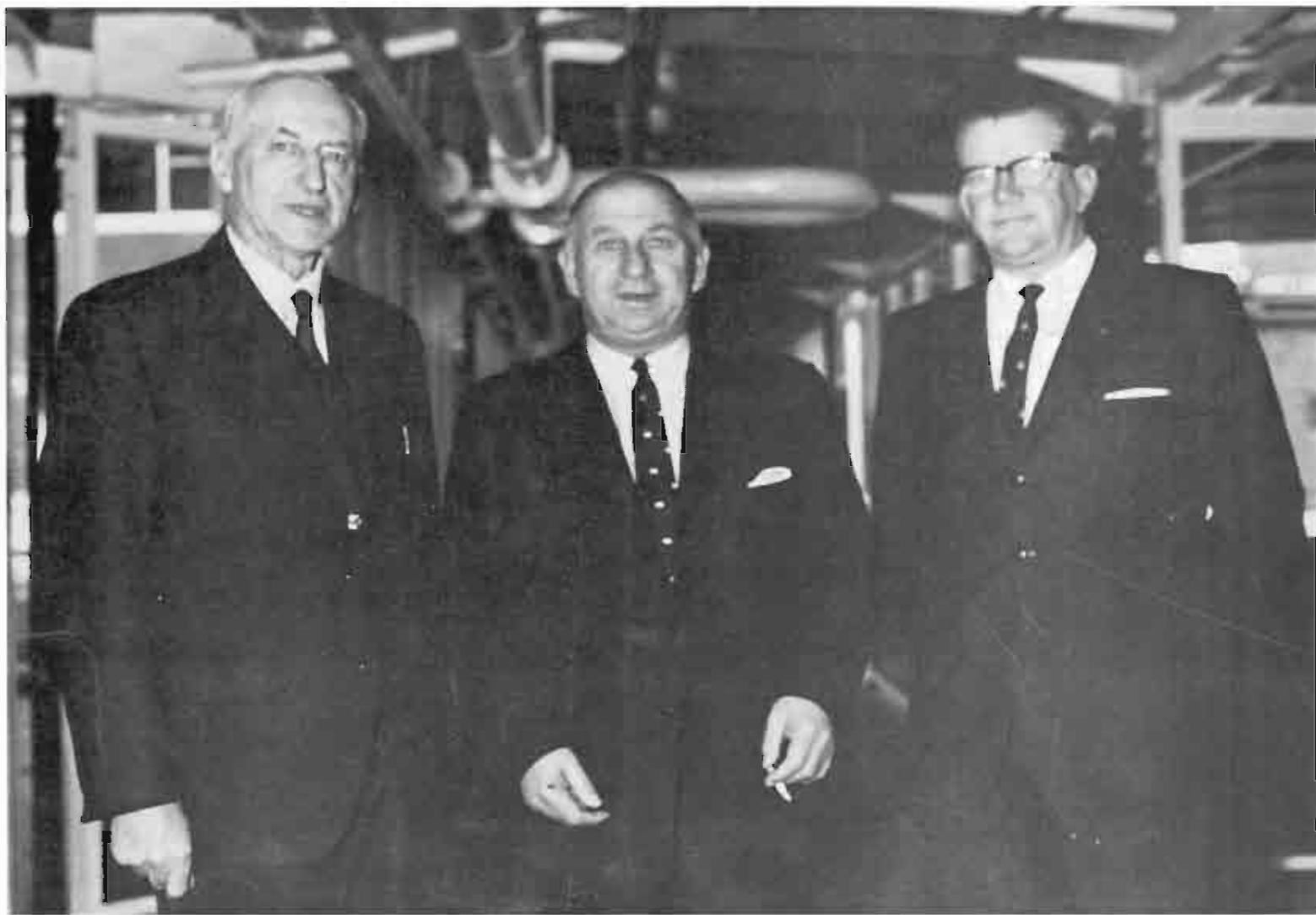

ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT FOR THE TWELVE MONTHS ENDED 30th JUNE, 1968

To the Life Governors and Contributors.

Ladies and Gentlemen,—

On behalf of the Committee of Management, I have the honour of presenting the Annual Report and Financial Statements for the year ended 30th June, 1968.

SERVICE : By far the most significant contribution to the services provided by the hospital this year was the completion and opening on 30th June, 1968 of Dr. W. A. Sloss House. The building cost \$726,000 of which the hospital has so far had to contribute \$120,000, and equipment costs will be \$33,500 of which the hospital contributes \$16,000. The full impact of this development will not be apparent to the Ballarat community until the coming year when its services become operative. This building is the new front door of the hospital and provides for the reception of all visitors and patients and integrates the hospital on the Drummond Street frontage, providing for free movement of patients and staff through the majority of the hospital's wards and departments all in the one building complex. Dr. W. A. Sloss House houses reception and admitting offices, medical superintendent, welfare sister and casualty on the ground floor; theatres and central sterile supply department on first floor. It has extensive plant rooms on roof and basement levels.

The Committee was indeed honoured to have the building opened by the Honourable the Premier of Victoria, Sir Henry Bolte, K.C.M.G., M.L.A., who was

accompanied by Lady Bolte and the Minister of Health, the Hon. Vance Dickie, M.L.C. The opening ceremony was attended by approximately 850 people.

The hospital treated 5,949 inpatients and 72,963 outpatients and the daily average bed occupancy was 184.8.

The regional services have continued as in past years. However, our pathologist, Dr. S. T. H. H. Pilbeam, has been only partially successful in his endeavours to expand the pathology services on a regional basis, beyond their present limited "specimen collection" basis. This is due primarily in our opinion, to a non-acceptance by committees of the basis upon which the Hospitals and Charities Commission desire the scheme to operate. There has also been considerable unrest at Regional Council level in regard to the somewhat nebulous powers and functions of the Regional Council. Members feel that they lack any real authority and attempts are being made to have the Hospitals and Charities Commission develop an acceptable constitution giving councils more specific responsibility and authority.

We had fears that after the departure of the hospital's social worker in the middle of the year, the department would close down. However, it is pleasing to report that we were able to appoint Sister A. A. Meiklejohn welfare sister and she is continuing to provide a most worthwhile service in this area.

BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT : As part of the programme of moving casualty to its new area in Dr. W. A. Sloss House provision was made for a new pharmacy department in the south-east corner of the main

services block. These alterations were carried out and completed by 30th June, 1968. In its new location the department is centrally situated for servicing all wards and the new casualty floor.

Now that "Glass House" is completed the Committee is concentrating its efforts on furthering the next stages of its building programme. These involve firstly a complete remodelling of Yuille House followed by a remodelling of Edward Wilson-Eildon House block. When

these stages are completed we will have on the Drummond street frontage a modern hospital of which Ballarat can well be proud.

Sketch planning of the Yuille House project is already underway and it is hoped to be in a position to let tenders before the end of this financial year.

A number of smaller works is being investigated which it is hoped can be carried out during the term of the major project. These include renovations to out-patients and chest clinics, laundry improvements, and additional living in staff accommodation for married couples.

STAFF: The quality of service offered by any hospital will vary according to the efficiency and ability of the staff employed. We have a total of some 500 persons and it is pleasing indeed to record that in the Committee's opinion an exceedingly high standard of service prevails. To all members of staff we say "thank you" for a year's work well done.

Reference was made in our last Annual Report to the retirement of Miss J. M. Longham after twenty years as our Matron. Now we can report that Miss M. S. Ogden has been appointed to the post. Miss Ogden was on the tutorial staff here some years ago. She holds a Diploma in Nursing Administration from the College of Nursing, Australia and came to Ballarat from the Royal Children's Hospital where she was a member of the senior administrative staff.

Early in the year our deputy matron, Miss J. Beverley also resigned from the staff after a long and valued association with us. This post has been filled by Miss D. C. Trevaskis who has had extensive nursing administrative experience and was previously matron of Numurkah District Hospital.

We extend congratulations to Mr. R. I. Parker on successfully gaining his Diploma of Hospital Administration with distinction, including the awarding of the Rupert Fanning Memorial Prize and the University Prize for the diplomate with the best overall academic record.

A very real problem in a hospital with a large and diversified staff is that of establishing an efficient means of communication between senior staff members. In an attempt to overcome this, regular staff luncheons were commenced this year and have so far proved a popular and successful venture.

This year for the first time, resident medical officer appointments were organised through a computer matching programme conducted by the Melbourne Medical Post Graduate Committee. It was an interesting experiment but at this stage results achieved do not justify us in stating it successful in achieving the objective of filling all metropolitan and base hospital posts. In our case through our own approaches interstate and elsewhere we finally appointed a satisfactory resident medical officer staff. We realise this is a first attempt and intend to participate again.

The Committee also records its thanks to the Honorary Professional Staff for services rendered to public patients and for the considerable time they have devoted to assisting in the training of our student nurses. We also acknowledge and are deeply grateful for the advice and guidance given by our Honorary Solicitor.

COMMITTEE: To my fellow members of Committee of Management I record my thanks for the co-operation extended to me during the year.

Messrs. M. B. John, J. McKay, H. C. Tippett and I. F. Tweedie retire under the by-laws and being eligible offer themselves for re-election.

LIFE GOVERNORS: In recognition of services rendered to the hospital the Committee was pleased to appoint the following:—

FINANCES: As revealed in our financial statements the hospital has this year shown a relatively small book surplus in its maintenance account. The reality of this surplus can be gauged only in the light of the hospital's bank overdraft and outstanding debtors which

together total more than \$297,000. The book surplus is brought about through:—

- (a) an increase in daily average giving rise to additional fees raised;
- (b) an increase in government grant; and
- (c) a reduction over budgetted expenditure.

It is interesting to note that this year more public concern has been expressed than ever before, over the present method of financing hospitals. A number of committees at governmental level, are currently enquiring into present benefit schemes and it will indeed be interesting to learn the outcome of these deliberations. This hospital's Committee has always supported the view that if everyone was adequately covered by an efficient hospital benefits scheme, at least part of the problem would be overcome.

We have had discussions with the Commission and the Minister of Health out of which we have been assured of a continuing capital allocation from governmental funds. This ensures continuity of our remodelling programme although perhaps not at the most desirable rate.

GENERAL: The year has been an exciting one for the hospital. We have seen a lot of development taking place and a lot more being planned. I am of the opinion that there has been a quickening of public interest in our hospital and its affairs and I hope this continues.

Many people and organisations helped us through the year. We are grateful to our "Mary-Helen" Auxiliary for their continued support; to Myer Emporium (Ballarat) for officiating in children's words at Christmas time; to the Red Cross Blood Bank for its co-operation and assistance; and to others too numerous to mention who have generously volunteered their aid.

Finally I extend my thanks to the Hospitals and Charities Commission for its guidance and financial support, and to the Ballarat "Courier," BTV 6 and 3BA for the most valued public image of the hospital that they have assisted in projecting into the community.

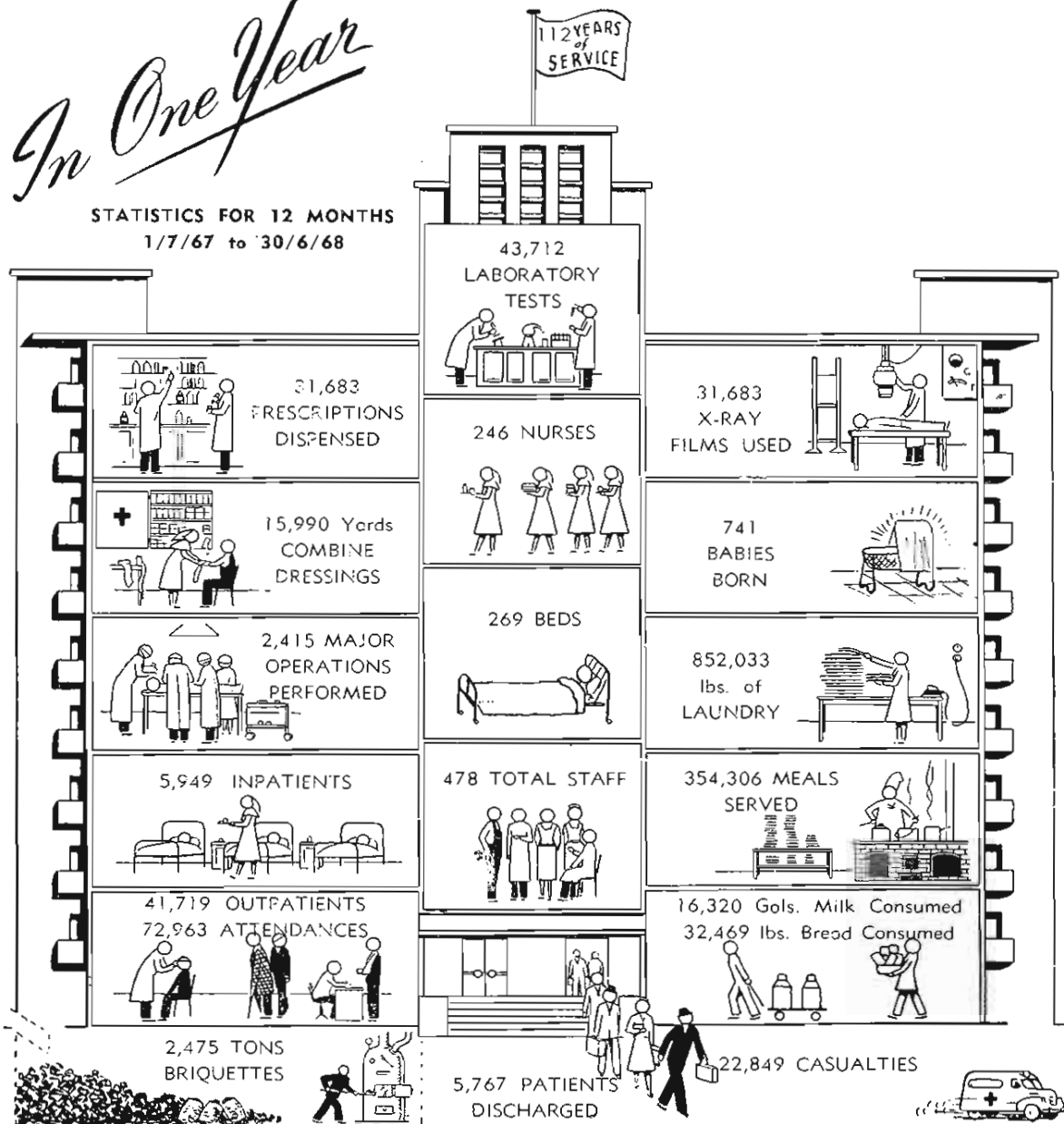
