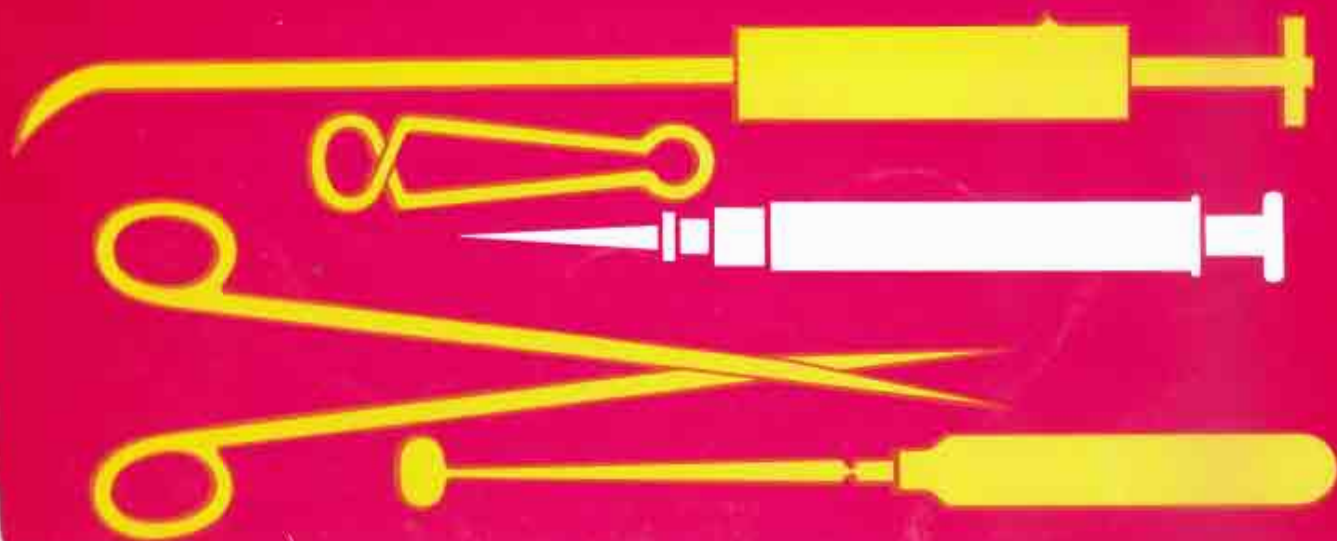

ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT FOR THE TWELVE MONTHS ENDED 30th JUNE, 1967



To the Life Governors and Contributors.

Ladies and Gentlemen,—

On behalf of the Committee of Management, I have the honour to present the Annual Report and Financial Statements for the year ended 30th June, 1967.

SERVICE : The hospital is ever conscious of its primary objective, which is to be ready and able to render aid to the sick and injured of this community at any time of the day or night. Of recent years it has not always been easy to maintain this most essential service because of the difficulty in recruiting sufficient qualified professional staff to fill our establishment. Fortunately this year the situation has eased a little and we have obtained the services of an adequate number of resident medical officers to staff the wards and casualty department. The hospital's Honorary Professional Staff have continued to provide their valuable services in conducting outpatient clinics and supervising inpatient ward treatment.

In an attempt to improve outpatient services the Committee has conducted a number of patient surveys during the year, and as a result we are now introducing an improved appointment system in the outpatients' department.

In March, 1967, a two bedded intensive therapy ward, situated at the eastern end of the Queen Victoria

Block, was opened for the care of critically ill or injured patients. This ward, will provide intensive nursing and medical care for all patients admitted to it.

Also in March, 1967, Miss A. Baker, a trained social worker, who had been bound to the hospital under a bursary agreement, commenced duties with us. It is almost ten years since our social welfare department was closed through lack of trained staff and it is pleasing indeed to see this important service again available to those in need.

The hospital has continued to provide medical ancillary services to regional hospitals as far as it is possible and in addition has continued its administrative and engineering services to annexe hospitals at Beaufort, Skipton and Lismore. The regional physiotherapy service which was curtailed last year through lack of staff was recommenced at the beginning of the year. The regional pathology service continues to operate effectively under the guidance of Dr. S. T. H. H. Pilbeam.

The Committee is conscious of the future building requirements of the hospital and discussions are currently proceeding with the Hospitals and Charities Commission concerning the implementation of the next stage of our building programme. It is the Committee's desire that this follow on immediately after completion of the Dr. W. A. Sloss House contract.

BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT : The Dr. W. A. Sloss House contract has proceeded satisfactorily during the year. The work is well up to schedule and completion time remains unchanged as May, 1968. In this type of building programme where a large block is being erected in a congested area between existing buildings, inevitably a number of problems affecting supplies, traffic lanes and neighbouring departments occur. We were no exception to this rule and the builders, S. J. Weir Pty. Ltd., and our own staff deserve commendation for their co-operation and forbearance in this period.

As referred to earlier in this report a three bedded ward at the eastern end of the Queen Victoria Block was converted to a two bedded intensive therapy unit. This unit is fully equipped with piped gases, suction, Bird respirators and cardiac monitoring and defibrillation equipment.

Many improvements were carried out to the hospital's laundry to facilitate more efficient processing of the work load in this busy department. In all some \$7,500 was spent on new equipment and \$1,500 on remodelling works.

The Eildon midwifery floor nursery was enlarged and remodelled at a cost of \$4,280 and now provides spacious accommodation for twenty-four babes together with a four cot premature nursery.

Additional nurse training school equipment costing \$1,100 was purchased and a further amount of \$15,000 was spent on new equipment items for wards and departments generally. All these sums being in addition to normal routine replacements of sundry instruments and equipment running into many thousands of dollars.

STAFF : It was with deep regret that at its June, 1967 meeting the Committee of Management accepted the resignation of the hospital's matron, Miss J. M. Langham. Miss Langham has been with the hospital for just on twenty years and during that period has proved to be a most capable nursing executive. She has always

exhibited concern for the welfare of the many thousands of patients who have passed through the hospital. She has ably administered the nurses' training school and the hospital is indeed proud of the calibre of trained nurses who have graduated from our school. In addition, Miss Langham has always had a wide interest in nursing and hospital matters and has been active on a number of committees and organisations in this sphere.

On behalf of the Committee I record our appreciation and wish her a long and happy retirement.

The Committee also records its thanks for services rendered by the Honorary Professional Staff to public patients and for the considerable time they have devoted to assisting in the training of our student nurses.

A number of other staff changes occurred in the period under review and these are noted elsewhere in this report. The Committee does however express its appreciation to all members of the staff for their services during the year and commends them for the high standard of skill and care exhibited throughout the hospital.

COMMITTEE : It is with deep regret that I record the deaths, during the year, of two very good friends and past presidents of the hospital. Dr. W. A. Sloss died on 13th October, 1966 and Dr. A. C. H. Salter on 26th May, 1967.

The late Dr. Sloss joined the Honorary Professional Staff in 1913, the Committee of Management in 1929 and served three terms as president. He was most active in the affairs of the Country Hospitals' Association of which he was chairman for some years.

The late Dr. Salter joined the Honorary Professional Staff in 1917, the Committee of Management in 1931 and served one term as president.

Reference to their retirement from the Committee and service to the hospital has been made in earlier reports.

Mr. R. G. Rowland resigned from the Committee and in June, 1967, Mr. D. C. Gount was appointed in his stead.

Messrs. J. H. Heinz, R. Humphreys, E. G. Ludbrook, R. A. Must and D. C. Gount retire under the by-laws and being eligible offer themselves for re-election.

I wish to record my appreciation for the ready co-operation and assistance I have received from the members of the committee during my term as president which has made my task so much easier.

LIFE GOVERNORS: In recognition of services rendered to the hospital by the "Mary Helen" Auxiliary the committee was pleased to appoint the following members as Honorary Life Governors: Mrs. E. Borclay, Mrs. K. Chalmers.

FINANCES: The hospital showed a small deficit of \$107 at the end of the financial year. This most satisfactory result was achieved only because of the considerable financial assistance made available through the Hospitals and Charities Commission late in June, 1967.

Our total operating cost rose by more than 10% over last year's cost, practically all of this being due to the inevitable wage rises and to increased purchases of medical and surgical supplies. It is quite remarkable to note that dietary, housekeeping, laundry, power and heating costs have remained stable. In fact through improving boiler efficiency we have achieved a reduction in fuel costs on briquette supplies.

The Committee is concerned however over the increasing cost of running the hospital. The fact that a

large proportion of our income comes from governmental sources means that further development of our services is closely tied to the availability of government funds. The Committee is most definite in its view that the maintenance of an adequate hospital service is one of the most important functions of a responsible government. The Committee accepts the responsibility for the local administration of this hospital and in turn it looks to and expects the government to play its share by providing such additional moneys as are determined by the Committee, after consultation with the Hospitals and Charities Commission, to be reasonably necessary for the maintenance of the hospital.

GENERAL: This report would not be complete without recording our thanks to those many people who have displayed their interest in the hospital during the year. Some have helped through visiting, some through gifts of cash, some through gifts in kind, to all I say "thank you very much indeed."

To our "Mary-Helen" Auxiliary I extend our sincere thanks and also congratulations on completion of another excellent year of service.

I also record our appreciation of the assistance and co-operation received from the Ballarat "Courier," BTV 6, 3BA and the Ballarat Branch of the Red Cross Society.

Finally, I extend our thanks to the Hospitals and Charities Commission for the most impressive governmental financial assistance they have given to us and also for the departmental advice they have been ever ready to provide in respect to the needs of this hospital.

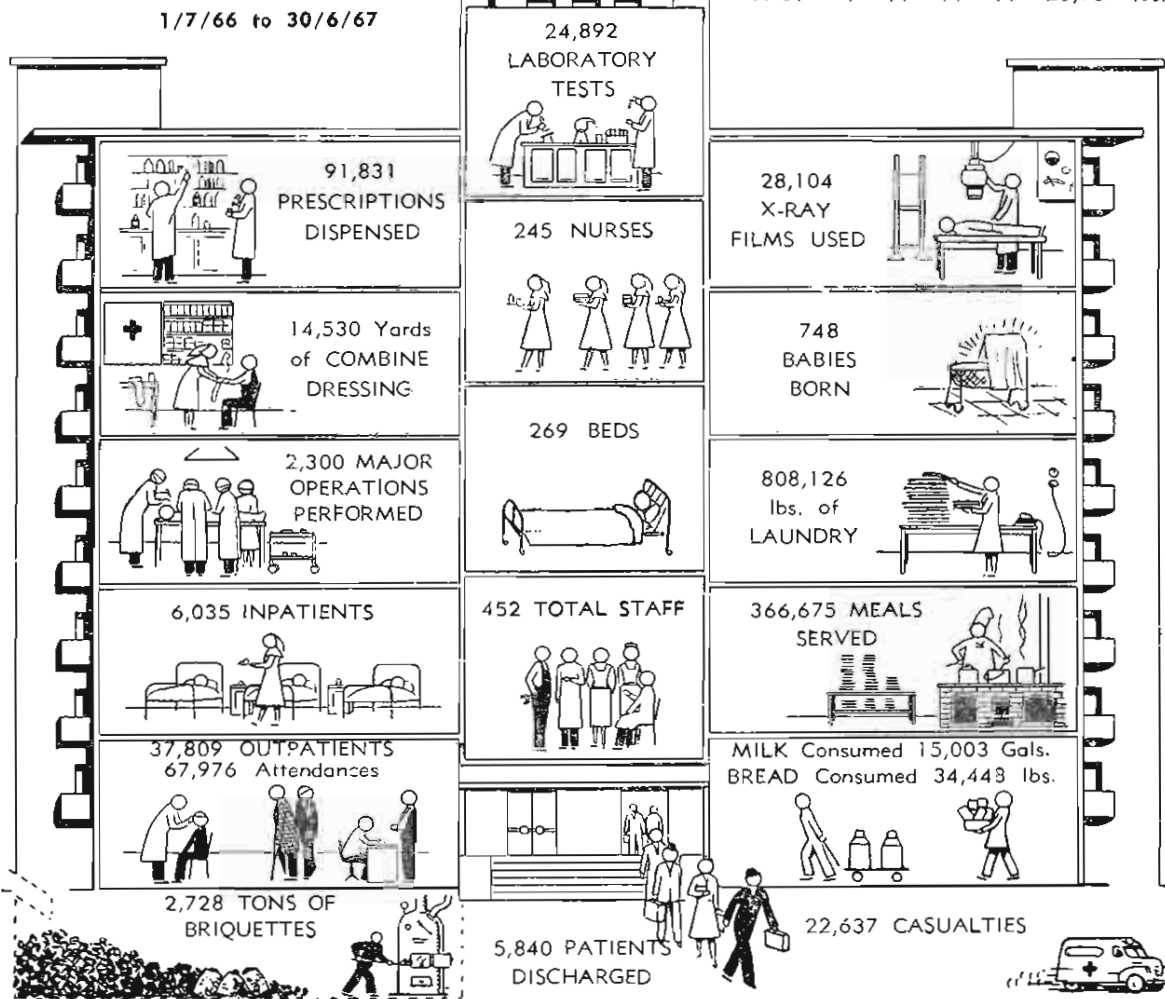
