## 121st Annual Report

To the Contributors and Life Governors of the Queen Elizabeth Geriatric Centre

Ladies and Gentlemen.

It is my privilege and pleasure on behalf of the Board of Management to present the 121st Annual Report and audited statements of accounts for the year ended 30th June, 1978.

#### Board of Management

It was with extreme regret that the Board received the resignation of Mr. A. C. (Mac) Fraser who had the distinction of being the longest serving member of the Board.

In 1939 Mr. Fraser succeeded his father the late Mr. J. Fraser who had been elected to the Board in 1915. His mother was also closely associated with the Centre as a prominent and active member of the Ladies' Auxiliary.

Mr. Fraser occupied the position of President in 1943, 1954 and 1969 and has been an active and enthusiastic member whose long experience will be greatly missed by his fellow Board Members.

Mr. John Trevenen was appointed to the office of Government Nominee on our Board of Management by the Governor In Council. Mr. Charles Clamp who had previously served in that capacity was elected to a casual vacancy on the Board of Management

Mr. William Crawford was appointed to fill a casual vacancy on the Board of Management.

#### Capital Works

A contract has been let for \$1.2 million to construct a hostel and day centre on the site of the former Midlands Golf Club. The hostel will provide accommodation for 35 people

and the Golf Clubhouse will be converted to an active day centre. The seven rink bowling green will be retained.

Further planning on the development of our Midlands site is proceeding and we are waiting approval from the Department of Social Security to continue with the next stage, an additional 35 bed hostel unit.

Through the co-operation of the Borough of Sebastopol the Centre has obtained a most suitable 10 acre site in Sebastopol upon which it is planned to erect a day centre and hostel units. Approval for construction of both these facilities is awaited from the Hospitals and Charities Commission and the Department of Social Security.

#### Central Highlands Linen Service

The construction of facilities to house the Central Highlands Linen Service which will serve hospitals in our region is proceeding satisfactorily. The project including land, buildings, equipment and linen will cost approximately \$4 million to complete. The capital costs are being completely funded by the Hospitals and Charities Commission. Design concepts and work flow principles are the most modern available in the world. We are looking forward to the commencement of services in 1979.

#### Medical Services

Dr. John Hurley assumed his appointment as Medical Superintendent in February, 1978. This appointment allows Mr. D. B. Skewes to give full time attention to his services as Regional Geriatrician.

Medical staffing has improved with the rotation of two Resident Medical Officers from the Ballarat Base Hospital on a regular basis. This allows a tighter medical supervision of the patients and in addition allows the Centre to provide education in the care of the elderly for junior doctors. There is a high possibility that medical students will be attending the Q.E.G.C. at regular intervals following the success of their recent attendances. This can do nothing but good for the Centre, students, doctors, residents and all concerned.

Moves are being made to rationalise the geographical area for which the Q.E.G.C. is responsible, to allow sound future planning and development. There has been considerable development in services for the elderly in the surrounding areas which has altered the traditional scene quite markedly. A geographical area, has been tentatively agreed to which the Q.E.G.C. will cover in regard to community care and long term nursing. The Rehabilitation Unit (G.S.I.) continues to accept patients from any area with no restrictions.

The emphasis of the services provided by the Q.E.G.C. should be on maintaining the elderly person in their own home. Should admission be necessary then as short a stay as possible will be the aim. This philosophical attitude should lead to the strengthening of the Welfare Department and the services that it provides. Further development should take place in the provision of Hostels and Day Centres, to allow the elderly a balanced group of alternatives to permanent nursing home care. The provision of Hostels would allow the transfer of patients out of the Q.E.G.C. resulting in a reduction of overcrowding and would allow the introduction of an assessment ward. Such a ward would be capable of dealing with some of the more acute medical problems that occur within the Centre, and would allow for the assessment on a short term basis of patients from home. The latter in many cases would lead to the prevention of permanent admissions. Other beds should be allocated for holiday admissions and planned intermittent admissions thus sharing some of the care of the elderly people with the relatives.

The Centre was visited during the year by a number of distinguished professional people interested in geriatrics and these included Professor Isaacs and Professor Wells from the Universities of Birmingham, England and Rochester, U.S.A.

Mr. G. B. Cutter retired from the post of visiting optometrist in which post he gave extraordinary service to our residents over 34 years. The Board of Management was pleased to be able to appoint Mr. D. Gardiner to the position of visiting optometrist. The appointment of Dr. Hawkins and Dr. Mangan as visiting ophthalmologists is providing a valuable additional service to our residents.

Retirement of Mr. A. D. McMillan

Mr. A. D. McMillan, Deputy Manager, retired in December, 1977. Mr. McMillan's outstanding services in the administration of the Queen Elizabeth Geriatric Centre were recorded in the minutes of the Board of Management and we wish him a very happy retirement.

#### Nursing

The dedication of the nursing staff and the quality of patient care they provide under the leadership of Mrs. M. L. Campbell, Director of Nursing is well appreciated by the Board of Management, Nursing care plans based on the needs of patients, continue to be implemented and improved and our staff have been encouraged to become aware of any new and desirable developments in nursing care, by participating in study programmes at this and other Centres. Students from the College of Nursing, Australia continue to spend several weeks at our Centre, gaining experience in nursing and hospital administration. Staff from other hospitals and geriatric centres have been made welcome during the study visits to our Centre.

The Board of Management congratulates Mrs. D. Bracka, Deputy Director of Nursing on the successful completion of the Nursing Administration Diploma Course at the College of Nursing, Australia and noted with pleasure that Mrs. Bracka has subsequently been awarded the status of Fellow of the College of Nursing Australia.

Mrs. Dianne Passalick, Dip.N.Ed., has been appointed Principal Nurse Educator replacing the former Principal Nurse Educator Mr. A. Grime.

#### Welfare

The Centre is expanding welfare services into homes of the elderly people. Over 300 people are currently receiving one or more home care services and our welfare staff have become increasingly involved regional and local health care discussions. Some of the home care services currently being provided through our welfare department are housekeeping, chiropody, laundry, shopping, transport and consultation. The support of the Ladies' Auxiliary who roster their members on a weekly basis to pack linen for home delivery is greatly appreciated. The Board of Management congratulates Sister P. J. Taylor, Director of Welfare and her staff on the wonderful contribution they are making to the welfare of the elderly people in our region.

#### Paramedical Services

The Centre continues to provide a wide range of paramedical services and intends in the future to extend these to meet the needs that exist for a variety of therapies designed to rehabilitate and maintain people in a satisfactory life role. The chiropody department provided almost 6000 treatments for patients and in

addition manufactured over 400 appliances to assist the mobility of patients. During the year there has been consolidation of physiotherapy, occupational therapy, craft work, recreation therapy and hairdressing. This has promoted team work and has resulted in a more co-ordinated approach to the provision of care. Our staff, however, remains too small in this area to cope with the pressing need. The Centre therefore has awarded a number of scholarships in physiotherapy and occupational therapy, to students presently undertaking these courses.

#### Finance

Financial restrictions imposed on health services this financial year have been very severe. The Centre has endeavoured to meet the policy of containment of growth in health services, but at the same time being careful not to reduce the quality of care being provided. Developments in medical, paramedical, nursing, welfare and domiciliary services have thus been restricted, but nevertheless the effects of inflation have boosted operating payments by almost 17% in comparison with the previous year. resulting in a deficit on \$159,000. A special grant from the Hospitals and Charities Commission of \$54,500 relating to our previous year's deficit meant that our cash deficit for the year just completed, was reduced to \$104.500. In addition to this maintenance expenditure of approximately \$1 million was expended on capital works. The cost of operating the Queen Elizabeth Geriatric Centre in terms of cost per service provided is one of the lowest in the State.

#### Maintenance

Considerable maintenance work has been undertaken on our buildings and services during the year. In addition to major capital works there is a constant programme of upgrading facilities in all our buildings.

#### Gardens

Much work has been undertaken during the year on improving the grounds and involving residents in gardening activities. This has proved a very popular activity with many residents. Additional garden seats and tables have been obtained for outdoor use. The Hospitals and Charities Commission approved the purchase of additional equipment during the year for use at Midlands where the Centre will provide a bowling green and possibly a future croquet green.

#### Catering

The facilities available to our caterer and his staff are recognised as inadequate and is a problem to be tackled in the near future. The main kitchen at the Centre is now producing in excess of 2300 meals per day and facilities are in urgent need of being upgraded. In addition to the meals for residents in the Centre and at hostels the Catering Department provided 53,141 meals for the Ballarat Meals on Wheels Service.

The Department has conducted successful experiments with freezing of cooked food by liquid nitrogen and later quick reconstitution. This method provides attractive nutritious food and is considered suitable to meet future needs of supplying remote hostels and day centres.

#### Ladies' Auxiliary

The Board of Management is most appreciative of the contribution members of the Ladies' Auxiliary make to the happiness and welfare of our residents. Each year the Auxiliary organises functions at Christmas, Easter, Mothers' Day, Fathers' Day and the annual picnics all of which give the residents great pleasure.

The ladies conduct many fund raising activities and as a result raised \$4000 for the year under review. The Ladies' Auxiliary is a very important link between the Centre and the community.

#### Staff

The staff of the Q.E.G.C. has continued to maintain the high quality and standard of efficiency so necessary to provide the quality of life the elderly people in their care deserve.

During the year several executive staff changes have been made.

Mr. F. G. Black was appointed Executive Director and in this capacity is charged with the responsibility of future planning and development of capital works. In October, 1977 Mr. J. E. Walter was appointed Manager and has already proved his ability in this position.

The judgement of the Board was further vindicated when in July Mr. Walter was appointed a part time Commissioner on the new Health Commission of Victoria.

The vacant position of Assistant Manager has been filled by Mr. Peter Prendergast. These three appointments have given the Centre an extremely strong administrative team.

#### Religious Services

Chaplains of many denominations regularly visit the Centre and their attention to the spiritual needs of our residents is appreciated.

#### Financial Support

Many of the physical improvements effected at the Centre have been made possible by the generous support of people who have provided donations, legacies and bequests. These are acknowledged separately in this report. Plans to re-organise and improve future services, e.g. improved ward accommodation, hostels, day centres, are proceeding. The wonderful support we receive and we hope will continue to receive means these plans will be able to be achieved and the future welfare and comfort of the people in our care will be assured.
