# 117th Annual Report

To the Contributors of the Queen Elizobeth Geriatric Centre.

Lodies and Gentlemen,-

It is my privilege on beholf of the Board of Management to present the 117th Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ended 30th June, 1974.

### CHANGE OF NAME

Following Royal Assent the name of "The Queen Elizobeth Home" hos been chonged to "The Queen Elizobeth Geriatric Centre" a title more in keeping with the extended responsibilities and services of the Institution.

### PATRON

A very kind letter was received from our Patran, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, Major-General Sir Rohan Delacambe, K.C.M.G., K.C.V.O., K.B.E., C.B., K.S.O., K.St.J. on his retirement as Governor of Victoria and return to England. Our very best wishes ore recarded to Sir Rohan and Lady Delacombe for a very happy retirement.

#### FINANCE

The Board has pursued its policy of introducing new services and praviding modern accammodation but has been limited by the amount of Government manies available bath for maintenance and capital development. Pragress has also been affected by the disastrous results of inflotion.

The year ending 30th June, 1974, resulted in a deficit of \$72,663, the major cause of which was the requirement of the Haspitals and Charities Commissian to make a provision of \$67,218 for Long Service Leave accrued.

Inflation has cantributed mainly to the increase in maintenance expenditure from \$2,850,095 in 1973 to \$3,519,335 in 1974, and this increase, reflected in Salories and Wages, was beyond the control of the Board of Management, although very close attention has been given to all aspects of the Centre's financial operations.

The doily average of patients of 754.2 was reflected in an overage bed occupancy of 95.48% and Day Hospital visits totalled 17,438, an increase of 206 over the previous year.

However the Doily Average Cost per doy per patients has increased from \$9.92 ta \$12.46 and the cast per attendance of Doy Hospital patients has risen from \$6.37 to \$6.81, and econamic trends indicate that further cost increases are inevitable.

### CAPITAL FUNDS AND PLANNING

"Old Age" is a misunderstood ond misused term, generally applied to "some one" else, and more people ore realising that the "Third Age" is a more appropriate term. There are actually more people in the community in this group than there are accommodated in Geriotric Centres.

This has been proved by the successful pilot scheme introduced sixteen years aga with home care, laundry services, day hospital and short term wards, hostels and flats for independent living — developments which have since been followed by other centres. Much more needs to be done and finance mode avoilable to further develop this work into the field of reducation and retraining in preparation for retirement and leisure.

In close co-aperation with the Hospitals and Charities Commission the Board's planning has therefore been directed towards—

- (a) future buildings;
- (b) existing buildings;
- (c) services.

### FUTURE BUILDINGS

The 1973 Special Building Appeal for \$100,000 referred to later in this report was launched for a new 120 bed infirmary building. Prior to the finale of the Appeal it was my pleasure to announce that the overall building programme finally approved by the Hospitals and Charities Commission of Victoria would provide an additional 200 beds commencing with a 50 bed hostel unit including a day centre.

Nursing Aide Training School 109-111 Ascot Street, Bollarat. Sketch plans for the 50 bed hostel unit and day centre on the ground floor and in the basement are now in the hands of the Hospitals and Charities Commission and will be constructed on the Talbot Street site.

This will be followed by the 150 bed infirmary unit.

New Infirmary Building

It is necessary for the new building to be constructed on the main block to obtain the full benefits of service and the demolition and resiting of several existing buildings is essential.

Transfer of Buildings

The clearance of the site will involve the demolition of Dormitory 3, Store, Workshops, Staff Change Rooms and Lederman Hall. Some will be rebuilt on the Talbot Street site, other services will be relocated within existing buildings.

Group Laundry

After much investigation and many delays final sketch plans have been agreed upon and working drawings are being prepared.

The transfer of our laundry to the new site in Lonsdale Street will allow the present laundry building to be used for other purposes.

Percy Baxter Homes

Financial assistance from the Percy Baxter Charitable Trust has enabled tenders to be called for an additional twenty units for this complex and we record our appreciation for the continued interest shown and financial support given by the Trust.

Ripon Street

Tenders have been called for a centre of twelve units for independent living to be erected in Ripon Street South. Ballarat.

### (b) EXISTING BUILDINGS

It is essential that the present buildings be maintained in keeping with modern standards for accommodation and sofety.

Main Building

A detailed survey has been made and working drowings completed for large scale alterations to pro-

vide maximum safety far present day conditions and approval to call tenders far this work is awoited. A complete review of patient accommodation and services in this building is almost completed.

Argyle Ward

Extensions have been completed to the Argyle Ward by the construction of a large sun room and launge. Furniture, furnishings and equipment are being replaced in this area.

### Caterina Services

The expansion of buildings and services including Meals-an-Wheels has also required a review of aur catering services and facilities. This service is under discussion with the Hospitals and Charities Commission and investigations being made into the most effective method by which the catering needs for the development can be met.

#### Land

The completion of these projects will finalise all possible development on the moin site and land is being acquired in the oreas in north, south, east and west of Bollarot for the construction of day centres and the incorporation of other services for people in the Third Age.

This development is essential in order that the services of the Centre may be further decentralised.

Special Appeal

Lost year the Special Building Appeal for \$100,000 was launched and the Special Appeal Committee formed under the chairmonship of Mr. W. B. Messer. The enthusiosm of the organising committee was rewarded at the finale which was held an 5th October. 1973 when the announcement was made that the torget had been exceeded and the Appeal was finalised with the sum of \$149,660.

From the many highlights of the Special Appeal mention must be made of the magnificent contribution by the younger members of the community.

A record number of people ond organisations worked untiringly and our sincere thanks is recorded to everyone who participated in this most successful Appeal.

#### STATISTICS

The general statistics relating to bed capacity and waiting lists are recorded elsewhere in this report.

Current trands highlight the fact that although the centre accammadates 856 in the various types of accommadation available, direct contact is maintained with mare than 800 elderly people outside the centre and this figure is rising. Experience has shown that too much emphasis cannot be placed on the great need for more attention to be given to the re-education and retraining, nat only far retirement but the increasing amount of leisure time resulting from changing economic and social canditions. This trend also gives rise to the possible responsibility of large enterprises for the welfare of staff preparing for retirement.

### STATE GERIATRIC CONFERENCE

Sponsared by the Hospitals and Charities Commission of Victoria, the State Geriotric Conference will be held at this Centre on 30th and 31st October and 1st November next.

We are pleased that it has been made possible for Dr. John Fleetwood of Dublin to attend tagether with interstate representatives in this field.

### STAFF

Including part time stoff there are 640 individual members all of whom have a specific contribution to make towards the treatment and welfare of the patients whether it be by personal or direct service. These services include administration, medical, nursing, welfare, medical ancillary, cotering, loundry, engineering and maintenance domestic; recreation, and acutside help. There is an inter-relationship between these services and without co-ordination and the layolty shown by the staff the patient for whom the whole complex has been established and developed must lose.

It is with great cleasure that the Board records its appreciation for the work carried out by each and every member.

#### OTHER INSTITUTIONS

In this field there are essential services which connot be provided by the Queen Elizabeth Geriatric Centre and partirular reference is made to the Bollorat and District Bose Hospital, Ballarat and District Ambulance Service Ballarat and District Nursing Service and the Red Cross Society.

The co-aperation in Ballarat between these essential services has been commented favourably upon by visitors to the Centre and the Board takes this apparturity to record its appreciation.

### **ORGANISATIONS**

The Queen Elizabeth Geriatric Centre receives great benefits both personally and financially from the many organisations which have supported its work over a period of many years, and we record our oppreciation, porticularly to the Ladies' Auxiliary of the Centre, the Presbyterion Fellowship of Australia, the R.S.S.A.I.L.A., Mums and Dods Association, Church Ladies Guilds and Auxiliaries, M. B. John Employees Charities Group, Ballarat Travellers Social Club, Social Service Groups from the Schools and Bronches of the Country Wamen's Association.

#### RELIGIOUS SERVICES

Our thanks are again recorded to the Choplains from all denominations who regularly attend the Home conducting services in the Chopel and administering to the needs of the residents.

### LEGACIES AND BEQUESTS

The Annual Report lists the legacies and bequests received during the year. All such amounts are applied in accordance with the Testator's wishes and the Centre is deeply grateful to these people who mode provision far the Centre to benefit from their Estates, and as a result were responsible for many of the developments of the Centre.

### HOSPITALS AND CHARITIES COMMISSION

The Board of Management ogoin records its appreciation of the Chairman, Commissioners and officers of the Hospitals and Charities Commission, and extends congratulations to the recently appointed Commissioners in the persons of Dr. E.
