# 114th Annual Report

of the Board of Management for the year ended 30th June, 1971.

To the Contributors of the Queen Elizabeth Home.  
Ladies and Gentlemen—

It is my privilege on behalf of the Board of Management to present the 114th Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ended 30th June, 1971.

## FINANCE

Statements of Income and Expenditure on Maintenance and details of the Balance Sheet are set out separately in this Report.

The past year was one of financial crisis but despite prediction in the hospital field that wards would be closed and services curtailed because of lack of finance, the Board assured the public that under no circumstances would the scope and standard of services at the Queen Elizabeth Home be reduced. Despite the inflationary trends and the shortage of Government Grants to meet these trends, the Home was able to meet its commitments and also to maintain its high standard of service. The result has been a deficit on maintenance for the financial year under review of \$7598.00 on a total maintenance turnover of \$2,011,584.

The rise in the average cost per in-patient per day from \$5.96 per day to \$7.30 per day and the increase from \$3.62 to \$4.62 for each day hospital patient attendance is indicative of the effects of inflation and it is certain that during the coming year maintenance finance will be one of the major problems facing the Board of Management.

## WAITING LISTS

The number of elderly people, particularly in the metropolitan area, awaiting admission to Homes and Hospitals for the aged is a matter of great concern to all who are associated with the care of the aged. The total care services radiating from the Queen Elizabeth Home, short term wards for intensive rehabilitation and discharge, Day Hospital for daily attendance, Home Care which includes House keeping and Laundry Services, and Meals on Wheels — leave no room to doubt that the elderly person is much happier and independent when they continue to live in their own homes. These services at the Queen Elizabeth Home have attracted attention not only from within Victoria but from interested organisations from Interstate.

## BUILDINGS

### Administration Extensions

The replanning of these areas has been completed and tenders called. These extensions will complete a long awaited and most necessary section of the Home. The critical financial position required that the proposed roofing of the Lederman Hall Courtyard and the provision of additional amenities for the patients to be deleted as part of this particular project.

### X-RAY DEPARTMENT

It is particularly pleasing to report that after many delays, the X-ray Department in the George Skerritt Wing was officially opened on Thursday, 17th June, 1971, and is functioning very well. This Department was incorporated in consultation

with the Ballarat and District Base Hospital with the object of not only relieving the load on the Department at the Ballarat and District Base Hospital but also to obviate the inconvenience to elderly patients of having to transport them some distance for minor X-rays. Major X-ray examinations will still be carried out at the Ballarat & District Base Hospital, with whom this Home has enjoyed a very harmonious relationship over many years.

MARGARET HOARE WARD

This is one of the older wards of the Home and during the year renovations have been completed by the conversion of the large area into two 4-bed units and two 6-beds units and the provision of covered lights and individual patients lockers.

HOSTELS

For the convenience of the residents of the hostels individual covered lights have been installed throughout these units.

EAST SUN ROOMS

Third Floor — Main Building

The ceiling of this large area was replaced during the year.

GEORGE SKERRITT WING

The provision of sliding doors in the covered way running between the George Skerritt Wing and the Janet Biddlecombe Wing has proved of great benefit particularly during the winter months.

JANET BIDDLECOMBE WING

The new entrance to this Wing, which provides a ramp as well as steps, has proved to be a marked success and convenient for both visitors and patients. Additional covered screens have also been installed in this Wing.

FIRE MAINS

In the last Annual Report reference was made to the provision of modern fire services at the Hostels and Brim Brim.

During the current year the fire services to the main buildings were redesigned in consultation with the Country Fire Authority. This work has been completed and includes a new pump house on the southern boundary of the main block.

F. G. HOOK REHABILITATION CENTRE

Last year it was reported that the pottery and woodworking sections were being transferred to the F. G. Hook Rehabilitation Centre. The transfer has been an outstanding success and to cope with the increasing number of residents wishing to undertake pottery work the department was extended by removing the dividing wall to the former library.

This is the 114th Annual Report of the Board of Management and it is extremely doubtful if reference has not been made in every previous report to lack of space. This year is no exception and attention is also being given to this problem at Brim Brim and the Argyle Ward area.

BRIM BRIM

Work is in progress to provide a roomy amenities room and workshop for the residents. The site of this building also lent itself admirably for the provision of a basement which will allow for the storage of equipment, and the storage and washing of vegetables produced on this farmlet. This project was made possible as a result of monies raised by the Ballarat Travellers Social Club and your Board expresses very sincere thanks for the assistance and support received from the Club.

ARGYLE WARD AREA

Your Board is currently engaged with the Architects in planning an economic scheme which will result in the redesign of the buildings in the area south of the Kiosk to the Eyre Street Boundary and include extensions to Argyle Ward.

LEDERMAN HALL COURTYARD

The temporary building erected some years ago to accommodate the Physiotherapy Department when it was first established has now been demolished.

FLATS

The Architects are also engaged in the preparation of working drawings for extensions to the Percy Baxter Home Units.

EQUIPMENT

Requirements are continually changing and during the year \$10,584 was spent on Equipment and \$32,054 on additions and major alterations.

### HERBERT ENGELBERT ESTATE

Your Board was delighted to receive a visit from Mr. D. McKean representing The Equity Trustees Executors And Agency Co. Limited and his Co-Trustee, Mrs. D. McClean on 9th March, 1971. Mr. McKean officially presented from the Estate of the late Herbert Engelbert a cheque for \$20,000. The Home previously received \$80,000 from this Estate, and it has been most disappointing that the project for which these funds were allocated, —two additional floors of the George Skerritt Wing, has not been able to proceed because of the shortage of Government Funds.

### LADIES' AUXILIARY

On June 21st the Ladies' Auxiliary held its 49th Annual Meeting and entered its 50th year. Over this period of time despite changing social, economic and political conditions and changes in membership, the ladies of this Auxiliary have never wavered in their interest and efforts on behalf of the residents of the Queen Elizabeth Home. In again recording our thanks, congratulations are extended to the Honorary Secretary Mrs. B. Ferguson, who has continued in the office of secretary for 21 years.

### MUSICAL APPRECIATION

The very popular musical appreciation session was unfortunately terminated by the death of the conductor the late Mr. James Gullan, who worked untiringly in the interest of the patients. The session is now being conducted by Mr. W. H. Keith Young from the Home Chapel, and is heard throughout the Home by means of the Home's own broadcasting system.

### NURSING

The Board is very conscious of the changes taking place in the Nursing Profession and the emphasis being placed on Nursing Education as a result of the recent Enquiry at Government level. Hospitals for the Aged are at the present and will be affected more so in the future as the number of infirmary cases increase. We acknowledge with appreciation the work of the trained nursing staff and the qualified nursing aides and congratulate the nursing aides who qualified through the Queen Elizabeth Home Nursing Aide School and whose names are recorded elsewhere in this report.

### HOSPITAL MATRONS' ASSOCIATION OF VICTORIA

The Board was pleased to host the Annual Conference of the Hospital Matrons' Association of Victoria on 29th and 30th October, 1970. The interest shown by the members of the Association in the progress of the treatment of the aged is an indication of widening importance of this field in the overall health care of the community.

### INTERNATIONAL HOSPITAL FEDERATION

#### 3rd Regional Conference — September, 1970

Delegates from the Home attended this International Conference which was held in Australia for the first time and it is quite clear from the information received from International delegates that total community health care is receiving attention throughout the world.

### STATE GERIATRIC CONFERENCE

Delegates from the Queen Elizabeth Home also attended the Annual State Geriatric Conference which was held this year in Bendigo in October, 1970. This State Conference on Geriatrics which is sponsored by the Hospitals and Charities Commission of Victoria annually is very valuable in that it allows the exchange of ideas and information on the progress being made in an area which has become of national importance.

### PRESBYTERIAN FELLOWSHIP OF AUSTRALIA

The combined branches of the Presbyterian Fellowship of Australia held their Annual High Tea and Concert for the residents of the Home for the 47th year in succession. It is interesting to note that when this annual function commenced there were only 189 patients in the Home, this year there are 849 patients and your Board acknowledges the Fellowship's continued efforts with sincere thanks.

### RETIREMENT

During the year two valuable members of the Staff retired in the persons of Mr. Gil. Baker, Catering Officer and Mr. Cam. McArthur, Works Foreman, who served the Home for twenty years and twenty five years respectively. We welcome to the Staff, Mr. Fred. Davies who commenced as Catering Officer on August 20th., 1970.

Many of the developments achieved by the Home have been initiated directly from monies received from these sources, and the Home is deeply grateful to those people who made provision for the Queen Elizabeth Home to benefit from their Estates.

RELIGIOUS SERVICES

All denominations are represented among the residents of the Home and the Chapel is in use daily. The services conducted and the attendance by Chaplains representing the various denominations are greatly appreciated by the residents.

MEALS ON WHEELS

Congratulations are extended to the organising Committee and the voluntary drivers on this service which is rapidly increasing, and for which the meals are prepared at the Queen Elizabeth Home. The importance of this service is shown by the fact that the number of meals prepared at the Home has increased from an original 60 per week to 410 per week.

HOSPITALS AND CHARITIES COMMISSION

This year it was not possible for the Commission to approve of the Home proceeding with two additional floors on the George Skerritt Wing because of the shortage of Government monies. This was a great disappointment. The Board of Management appreciates the problems faced by the Chairman, Commissioners and Officers of the Commission during this period of financial crisis and records its appreciation of their work.



## NURSING AIDE GRADUATION CEREMONY

At the Nursing Aide Graduation Ceremony held on 20th August, 1970, Certificates were presented to 50 Nursing Aides who had successfully completed their training.

The Ivy May Dicker Award for which the prize is a Gold Medal was won by Nurse N. Wright. In view of the close competition for this Award it was decided that additional prizes be awarded and these were received by Nurses W. Dark, E. Hiscock, J. Hull, M. Isaac, P. Moore, B. Mott and A. Knight.

as most important links between the Queen Elizabeth Home and the community and our thanks are recorded to them for their work during the year.

### STAFF

I have the honour to present to you the 49th Annual Report, covering the activities of the Auxiliary for the past twelve months.

### MEMBERS

With Mrs. W. Cassells as our President the year has been very happy and successful. Our Members fully support all efforts and are most willing and enthusiastic to assist any function within or outside the Home. They visit Residents regularly; play bias bowls, accompany on bus trips and personally add their comfort to others. We have added five new Members this year. The Board of Management honoured us by giving a Life Governorship to Mrs. J. G. Pratt, who for many years has worked hard for the Auxiliary including three terms as President.

### EFFORTS
