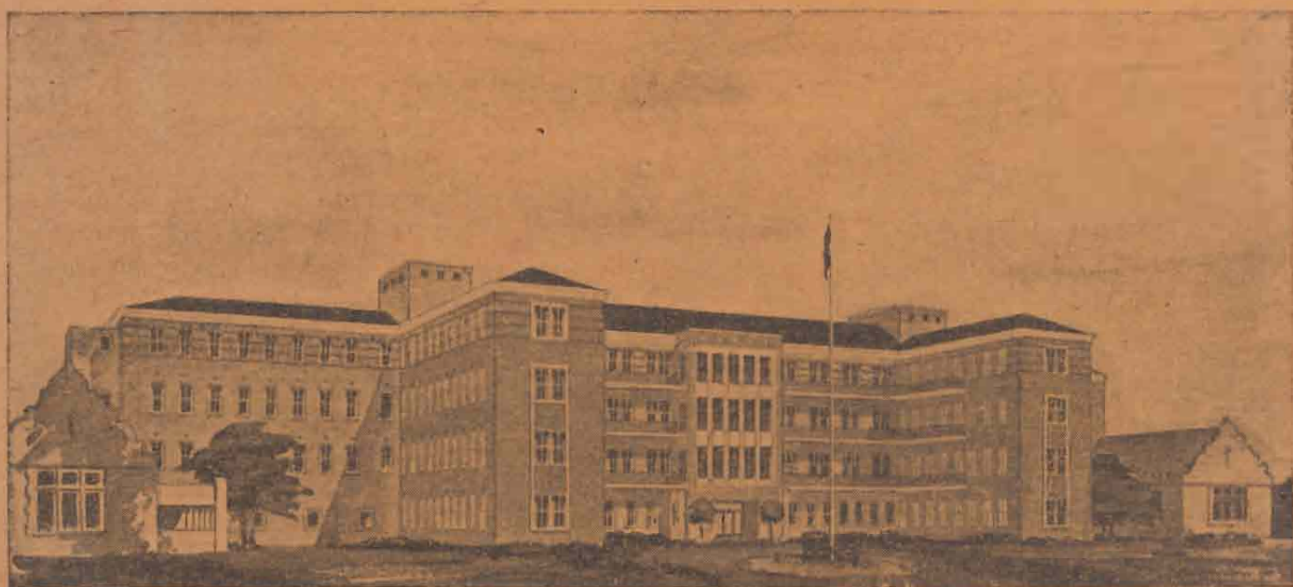
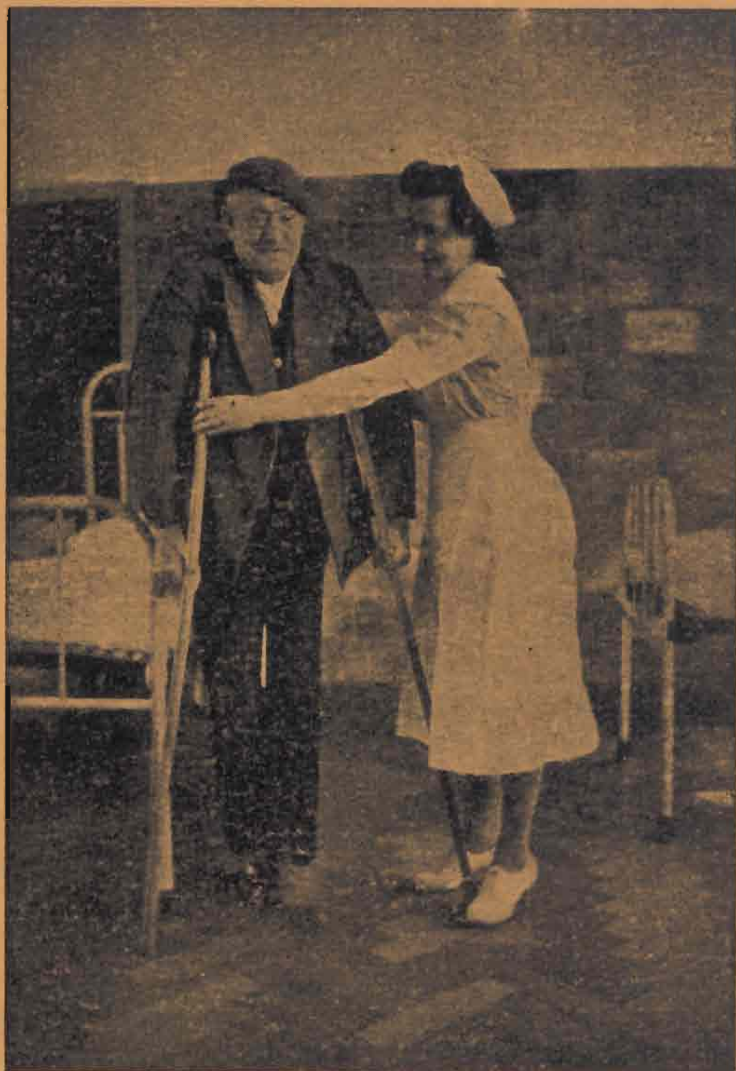

Ninety-first Annual Report

of the

Board of Management

for the Year ended 30th June, 1948

TO THE CONTRIBUTORS.

Ladies and Gentlemen,—

Your Board has pleasure in presenting its Ninety-first Annual Report and Audited Statement of Accounts for the year ended 30th June, 1948.

FINANCE.—The Statement of Income and Expenditure shows a marked increase under practically all headings. Provisions cost £1,005 more than for the previous year; domestic requirements £1,619 more; and drugs and medicines £216 more. Salaries and wages have increased from £37,742/11/6 for the year 1946-47 to £43,239/3/2 for the year just closed. There have been steady rises in the wages of the general Staff and greater increases in the wages of the artisan Staff. The introduction of the 40-hour week necessitated the enlargement of the Staff. As the 40-hour week was operative for only half of the year under review a substantial increase under this heading must be expected for the coming year.

The extra costs are reflected in the annual cost per occupied bed which was £121.103. Last year the cost was £104.08.

It is pleasing to record that the total ordinary revenue for the year was £70,397/8/7, an increase of £10,947/8/3 on last year's figures. There were comparatively small decreases in annual subscriptions and entertainments, a total of £516/10/9. Donations in cash and kind, however, exceeded last year's figures by £1,072/19/9. In addition, the Special Appeal Committee raised £5,858 during the year, to which further reference will be made.

The average ages of the patients in residence at 30th June, 1948, were Males 70.989 years, Females 72.01 years.

Of those who died during the year, the average age of males was 76.483 years, and of females 79.337 years, and their average periods of residence were males 858.439 days and females 896.648 days.

During the last six months the subject of suitable accommodation for the aged and infirm in this State has been given prominence in both the Ballarat and the metropolitan press. As is well known to the members of our Board, frequent reference has been made by us to the State and the Commonwealth authorities that our Institution has been carrying from sixty to eighty patients in excess of the number of beds provided by our ward accommodation. Applications for admission, from practically all parts of the State, in most cases fully worthy of our help, have had to be refused. It is realised that our duty is to give preference to applicants who reside in Ballarat and District. By utilising every possible corner in the building, beds have been provided for most urgent cases. It can be readily appreciated that this over-plus of occupied beds entails a severe strain upon our Staff. Credit must be given to our Nursing Staff and employees generally for their loyal and considerate response to this extra demand upon them.

An additional 250 patients could be accommodated, at comparatively little expense, by an extension of our buildings. We possess the necessary provision for sewerage, water and lighting, all of which, in addition to kitchen requirements for feeding the patients, need only linking up with the present installation. A suggestion has been made to the Charities Board for permission to proceed with the plans, etc., for this extension and a reply is awaited by our Board. This subject was fully discussed in the Annual Report of last year.

When the Hon. the Premier, Mr. T. T. Hollway, accompanied by the Hon. A. G. Warner, M.L.C., Minister for Housing, visited the Home on the 18th of June last, the practicability and the necessity for the extension of our building was cordially approved and an assurance was given by the Minister that a permit would be granted. However, consent of the Charities Board must be obtained before the Minister for Health, Sir A. Dunstan, M.L.A., will give his permission. There the matter rests at the moment.

The forthcoming visit to Australia of Their Majesties The King and Queen is creating considerable interest. It is hoped that they may visit Ballarat. Should they do so we may reasonably expect an inspection of our Home. With that possibility in mind preparations are already in hand for their reception.

The new staff dining room has now come into use. It is a commodious room fitted with all the requirements, and is greatly appreciated by the female resident and non-resident staffs.

A matter for consideration by the Board is the extension of the kiosk. It will be remembered that this useful accessory was enlarged last year. The services rendered by the kiosk to all the patients are now utilised to such a degree that practically twice the present accommodation is needed. I would suggest that the Board take this small but very necessary reconstruction in hand.

The utility truck which was purchased on 11th July, 1947, has proved to be of considerable assistance in many ways.

The large and regular attendance by our patients at the talkie film is evidence of their sustained interest in this form of entertainment. Many patients, both male and female, who cannot leave the building, are wheeled down to the Lederman Hall, and are thus enabled to enjoy a much needed break in the monotony of their lives. The services rendered by our Mr. C. A. Young, as Collector, are again giving fine practical results. I have great pleasure in recording the appreciation of the Board of Mr. Young's valued and tactful co-operation.

Mesdames Rees and C. W. Tompkins continue to arrange for the regular concerts. Here also our feeble old folk obtain an interesting and greatly appreciated relaxation. We all owe these ladies our sincere appreciation and thanks for their voluntary work.

Our Ladies' Auxiliary is constantly alert in seeking ways and means whereby the patients may enjoy some of the pleasures from which they are debarred by their infirmities. The annual picnic organised by the Auxiliary is greatly enjoyed by all of those who are able to attend this function.

The appeal for funds referred to in last year's report was brought to a highly successful conclusion. The total amount collected by this effort was £5,858. The organisers, under the leadership of Mr. A. C. Fraser (Chairman), Mr. L. M. Nixon (Hon. Treasurer), with our Mr. Keith Mackay as organising Secretary, deserve the thanks of this Board and all well-wishers of the Home. The splendid financial result was entirely due to the fine team work exhibited by the organisers. The money has been placed in a trust account and will be used for purposes not included in the usual expenditure account. The month of September, 1950, has been reserved by the Ballarat City Council for an appeal by this Institution.

Many of our male ambulatory patients are now happy in the possession of a two rink Bowling Green. The generous financial assistance given by the bowlers of Ballarat made it possible for the Board to lay down the greens. We were assisted in this highly technical work by the generous activities of Mr. H. Mansfield, Caretaker of the City Oval Bowling Club. A remarkably fine Bowling Green is now in use and the fact that the green was used in its first year is a testimony to the care and capability of the gentlemen who voluntarily carried on the work. Our head gardener, Mr. J. Allan, gave valuable help in the construction of the green, and his technical knowledge is a valuable asset for the continuation of this enjoyable relaxation by those of our male patients who are able to go on the green. In this and in many other activities we are all under a deep debt of gratitude to Mr. D. Stenning. This gentleman might with truth be given the title of the presiding genius of the bowling activities. I know I am expressing the feeling of the patients who are now enjoying a game of bowls on their own green, and I am also expressing the unanimous desire of the members of the Board of Management by tendering a very special "Thank You" to our worthy friend Mr. D. Stenning.

Now I move to a very different expression of congratulation. On 1st May last, Mrs. Catherine Davis, one of our respected patients, celebrated her 100th Birthday. The occasion was suitably celebrated in the Home and the dear old lady enjoyed a happy birthday. Mrs. Davis was the recipient of the following cable sent from Buckingham Palace from His Majesty the King through his Secretary:—"The King and Queen are much interested to hear that you have recently celebrated your 100th Birthday and send you heartiest congratulations and good wishes."

We are fortunate in possessing a loyal Staff in all departments of the Home. Under the very capable control of our Manager (Mr. Keith Mackay), assisted as he is by a Matron of outstanding ability and tact (Sister Mandeville-Halls) and Sub-Matron (Sister Zachariah), the internal administration gives nothing but pleasure to the Members of the Board.

Special thanks are due to our Medical Officer, Dr. Mervyn Robinson, who has given close and sympathetic attention to the health of our patients. Your Board also expresses its appreciation of the efficient services of our Dispenser, Mr. J. Russell.

Mention must be made of the highly skilled and conscientious work of our Accountant, Mr. C. C. FitzGerald. During the enforced absence of Mr. Mackay, Mr. FitzGerald carried out the dual responsibilities of Acting Manager and Accountant. Each of these positions is a heavy responsibility. Together they involve a pressure of work of great magnitude. Credit is due to Mr. FitzGerald for his loyal and self-effacing labour in a difficult time.

When I refer to the Staff generally in a happy and grateful way, I wish it to be understood that I do so in no mere form of speech. On many occasions our Staff has a difficult job to do. With nearly 600 helpless and infirm patients, most of whom are well beyond the allotted span of life, add their physical pain, and the oft times mental distress, it must be clear to the most superficial observer that daily attendance on our patients is a real job of work. Therefore, when I refer in eulogistic terms to our Staff, from the Manager and Matron throughout the whole range, I am deeply appreciative of their loyal co-operation in our very important work of charity.

We are very sorry that our Engineer, Mr. A. S. Sargent, was obliged to resign through ill health. He had been a valuable member of the staff and his conscientious work was greatly appreciated. His successor, Mr. H. R. Tonks, brings a wide knowledge of the work into his activities, and we look forward with confidence to many years of helpful co-operation.

The introduction of a 40-hour week for the Staff imposes a heavier financial burden. This can be met only by an increased sense of responsibility on the part of all concerned. We all have but one aim and one duty, and that is to help the aged and the helpless to the best of our ability.

In the meantime, among other worthy organisations, the Ballarat Charity Fund Appeal, guided by our Mr. John Keith and the Hon. A. J. Pittard, does its best to assist the Charities of Ballarat. We appreciate the fine work these good folk do.

Special thanks must also again be given to the Ballarat Travellers' Social Club for their continued generous support as evidenced in their donations amounting to £379/10/5 received during the year.

It is refreshing that from time to time grateful patients who are in a position to do so, endeavour to help us to help them by such donations to our funds as they can afford. We do appreciate this gesture however small the contribution may be.

Our Manager, Mr. Keith Mackay, has continued his policy of maintaining the appearance of the Home, both internally and externally, by employing a small staff of tradesmen on the work of repairs and replacements. There is no doubt that this is a form of true economy. Our building is kept fresh and clean at all times. This is as it should be and Mr. Mackay must be commended for the bright and fresh condition of the whole of the Institution.

In this connection it is appropriate to refer to the leave of absence recently forced upon Mr. Mackay by the Board. It was noted that he was not in his usual condition of health, so the Board suggested that he take a real holiday. Fortunately in our Mr. Cliff FitzGerald we possess a gentleman who was able and willing to assume the very onerous duties that belong to the Manager. The Matron also came forward with an offer to help, and the staff co-operated willingly. Mr. Mackay was thus able to go on a month's holiday with Mrs. Mackay. As a result, we now have our Manager back to his duties, re-invigorated and able to tackle any and all of the problems which arise daily in connection with the management of such an Institution as ours. On behalf of the Board of Management I can assure Mr. Mackay that he possesses the confidence and good-will of all who are associated with him in this noble work of charity.

During my term of office as President, I have been happy to receive a large number of visitors to the Home. Taken in order of dates and certainly not in order of importance, for in this respect there can be no priorities, I venture to mention the following:—The Moderator of the Presbyterian Church; Mr. G. W. Holland, President of the State Branch of the R.S.S. & A.I.L.A.; Mr. H. T. Stitfold, Under Secretary for Health, W.A.; Mr. R. H. Goldsby, Secretary Bathurst Hospital and Home for the Aged; Officers of the Rechabite Lodges; and that wonderful lady, Miss Helen Keller, and her companion, Miss Polly Thompson.

While I would like to deal fully with each of these distinguished visitors, limitation of space must be recognised. In general, it is at all times a pleasure to meet the visitors, and it was with no little pride that I conducted them over the building.

My year of office as President of our noble Institution has been made easy and agreeable by the kindly help given to me by the Manager, Mr. Keith Mackay. I desire to place on record my deep appreciation of our Manager's consideration and helpfulness. While for a time I was not in the best of health, the road before me was made smooth by him. This was at a time when it was evident that even Mr. Mackay was feeling the physical and mental strain of the heavy duties associated with the position of Manager. His work is not confined to a 40-hour week for he is on call at all times. Indeed it is within my knowledge that calls not infrequently come to him after his bed time. I am aware that this is known to the members of the Board of Management. May I suggest that some way be found to enable the Manager to obtain complete release from his duties for a reasonable time each day. If this can be achieved I feel that we shall be doing something worth while. However, I must express my thanks to Mr. Mackay for the great help he gave to me throughout my term as your President. I thank all the senior members of our staff for their willing co-operation in the responsible duties belonging to their several departments. To the Staff generally, in all its varied departments, I have great pleasure in testifying to the fact that in every respect the onerous and by no means easy jobs of daily routine are done with good spirit and consideration for the need of the old folk.

Reference should be made to the Honorary Officers. Their names and duties appear on the front page of this report, and it only remains for me to say that our Home, and its nearly 600 patients, are well served by a body of professional men who willingly give their time and expert knowledge in the cause of charity.

I must mention our appreciation of the consideration and helpful co-operation of the Charities Board of Victoria, and I take this opportunity of sincerely thanking Mr. C. L. McVilly, Inspector of Charities for his very helpful advice.

I wish to refer in grateful terms to the Clergy and Lay Preachers for their regular services in providing spiritual comfort to our patients. I know that the Chapel is greatly appreciated. It is a comforting experience to this Board to find that the introduction of a properly furnished Chapel is now a recognised part of all similar Institutions. We have the happy knowledge that we led the way in providing a properly equipped Chapel as an integral part of our building.

The visits of our Ballarat Bandsmen and also bands from other centres are always appreciated by our old folk. With our wide radio transmission service throughout the wards we can give all the permanent cot cases the benefit of listening to these entertainers. I thank all the entertainers for their pleasing contribution to the comfort and enjoyment of our patients.

If I were to enumerate all the functions and entertainments organised for the benefit of our Home, I should extend this already lengthy report to an impossible degree. I must, therefore, be content to refer briefly to the Christmas festivities, which were carried out with all the jollity and good fellowship associated with Christmas time. Our Ladies' Auxiliary had a helpful body of happy workers associated together to make a Happy Christmas for our patients.

I must not omit to refer to the fine appearance of our Home in its setting of green lawns and gay flowers. Added to these the vegetable plots make a right royal show. I congratulate our Mr. Jack Allan, the Head Gardener, on the splendid results of his expert labour.

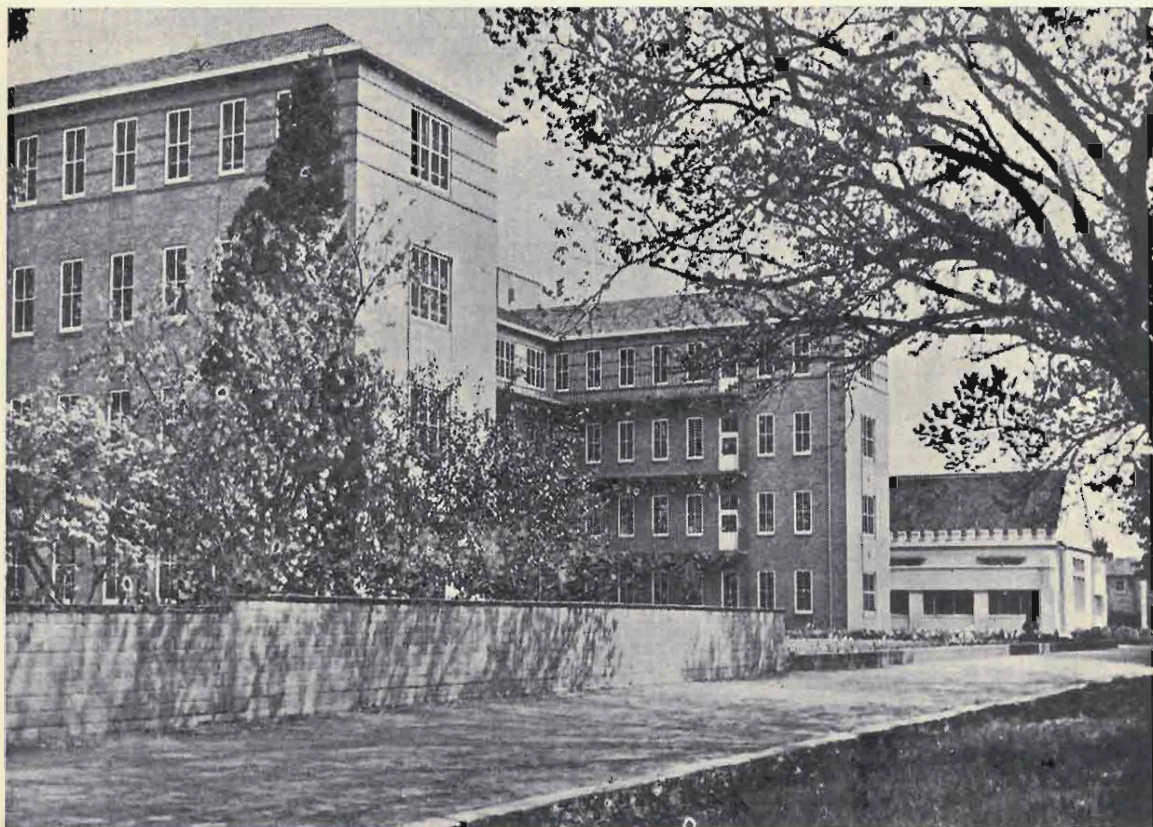

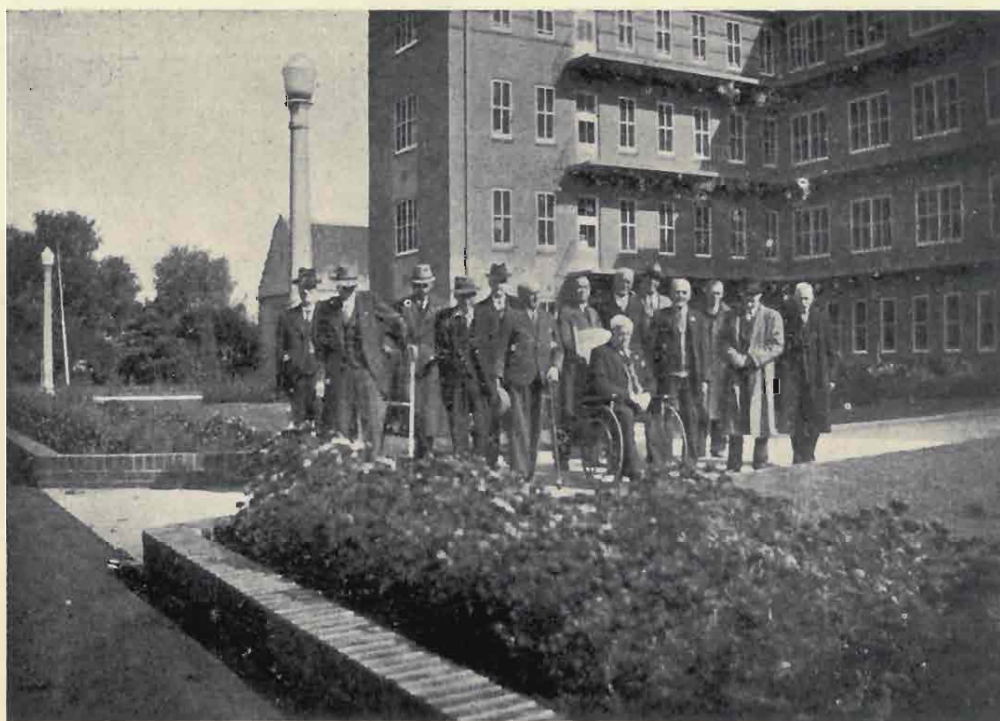

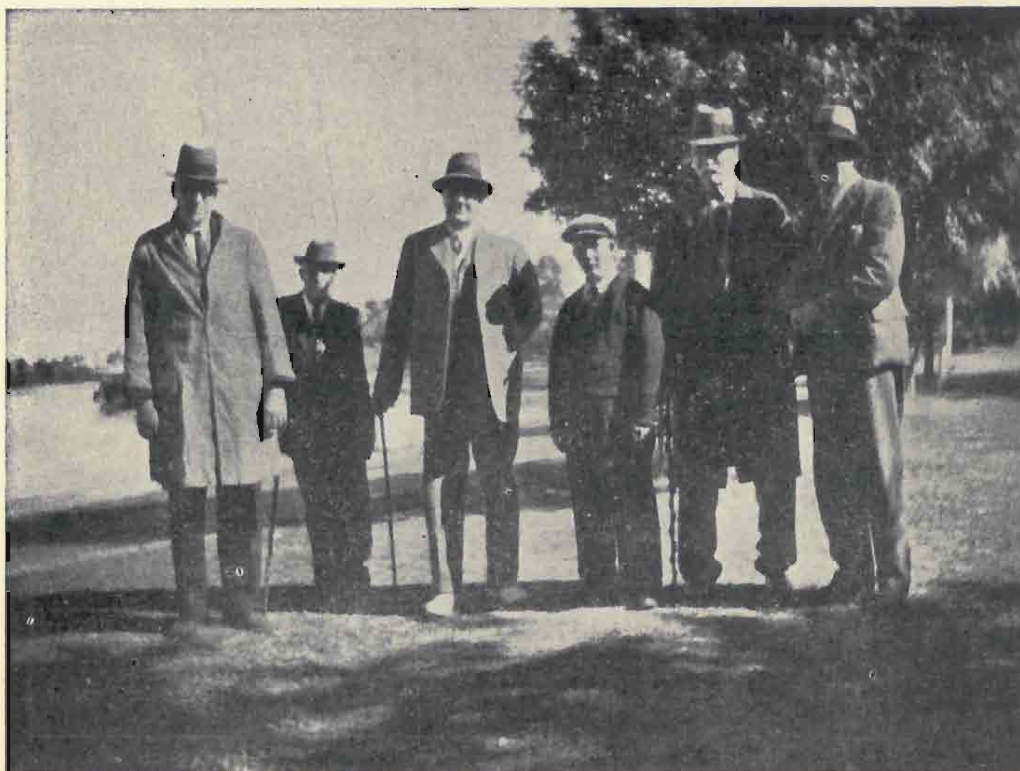

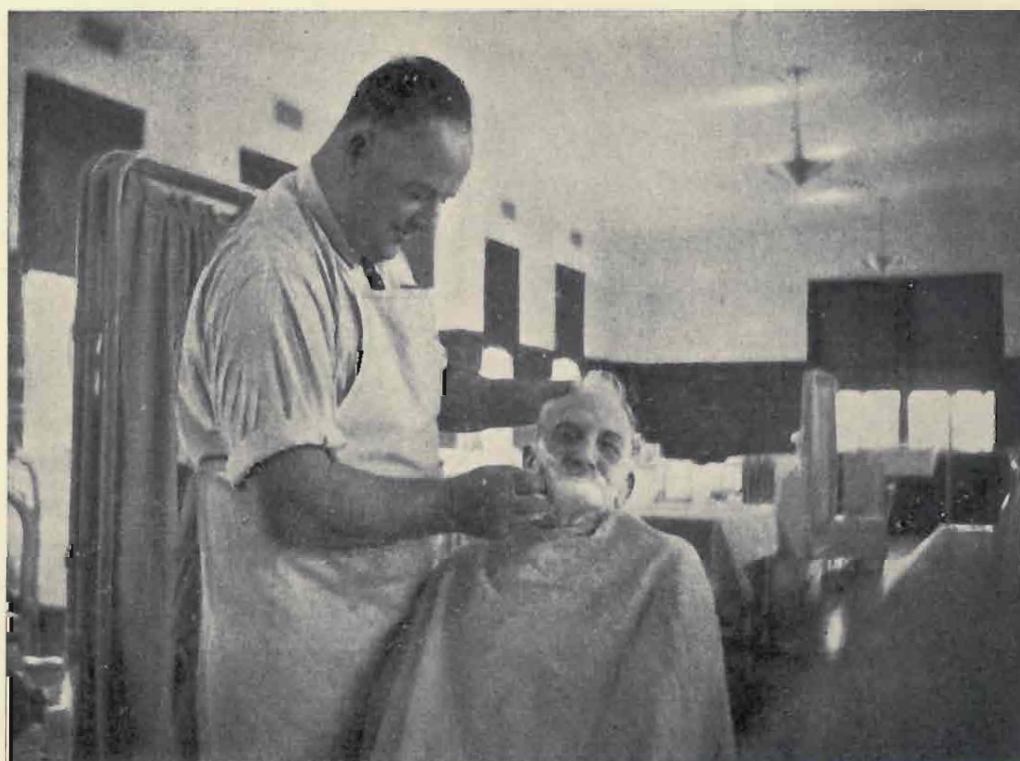

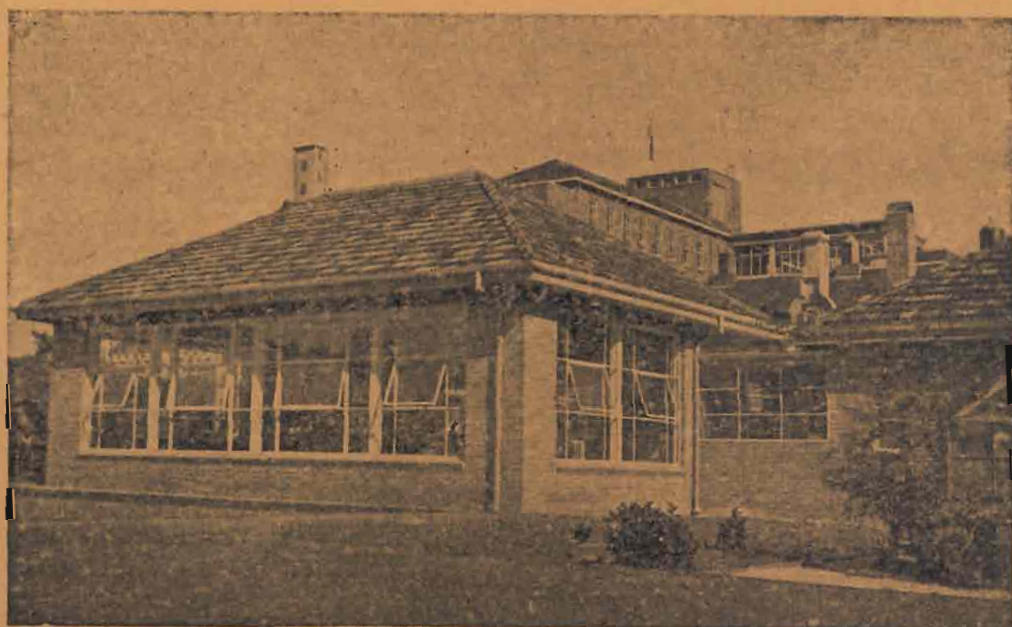
