



The Ninety-Fifth Annual Report of the Board of Management

FOR THE YEAR ENDED, 30th JUNE, 1952

TO OUR CONTRIBUTORS.

Ladies and Gentlemen,—

Your Board has the honour to present its report covering the activities of the Queen Elizabeth Benevolent Home during the year just closed.

Looking back over the period under review, two very serious and so far unsurmountable problems were encountered. FINANCE—Inadequate income to meet all commitments—ACCOMMODATION—not sufficient beds to provide for the increasing number of aged and chronic sick applying for admission.

FINANCE.—Your Board fully subscribes to the policy of living within one's income but due to conditions beyond its control, such as frequent increases in the basic wage and soaring costs of ordinary supplies, the cost of maintaining an inmate is now 12/10 per day. The Home's income is derived mainly from Governmental grants and payments on behalf of inmates, but as adjustments of rates payable are not made immediately, and are usually inadequate, in any case, there is an ever increasing deficiency between income and expenditure. Your Board has kept the position under constant examination. It felt that it could not conscientiously drastically cut costs by reducing the essential services now provided for the inmates nor would the Board for a moment consider that you would approve of such an action. In its previous report the Board was pleased to record a surplus of £3,914/15/- on the year's operations, this year unfortunately, there was a deficiency of £15,380.

FUNCTIONS OF THE HOME.—Fifteen years ago the Home provided for approximately 300 aged persons of both sexes, with probably less than 25 per cent of them bed cases requiring nursing attention. As the statistics in the preceding paragraph indicate there is now a far greater ratio of infirmary cases. These figures do not, however, tell the whole story. Years ago the infirmary cases were mainly the bed ridden aged, now the Home accommodates chronic sick and incurables of all ages. Your Beard has asked the Hospitals and Charities Commission to review the classification of The Queen Elizabeth Benevolent Home in order that payments by various Commonwealth and State Government Departments may be based on the actual present day functions as a Hospital for chronic sick and not as a Home for ambulant aged.

SPECIAL DONATIONS AND PROCEEDS OF ENTERTAINMENTS, CHARITY SUNDAY COLLECTIONS AND APPEALS.—A very welcome donation of £500 from a generous anonymous donor was gratefully received. Many generous people have contributed direct to the Home or through organisations, and to them your Board tenders its grateful thanks. Legacies and bequests and donations from trustees of

various funds are acknowledged on other pages of this report. The Annual Charity Sunday fund under the Chairmanship of His Worship the Mayor, and the experienced guidance of the Hon. Secretary, Mr. J. Ke th, returned £110 as this Home's share of the collections. The Ballarat Travellers' Social Club's Annual Gala held last November was an all time record and your Board gratefully acknowledges the allocation of £767. A cheque for £219/10/1 being this Home's share of the proceeds of the 1951-52 Electric Light Bowling Tournament was handed to your President by the President of the City Bowling Club on 9th September, 1951.

LIFE GOVERNORS.—The Board had pleasure in appointing several ladies and gentlemen as Life Governors as a gesture of appreciation of their generous donations and, also in appointing a number of Honorary Life Governors as nominees of clubs, societies and organisations which have contributed towards our funds.

MEETINGS OF BOARD AND COMMITTEES.—The Management of the Home is vested in a Board consisting of 15 members which meets regularly every month. The Finance Committee attends to the routine examinations and payments of accounts and handles all matters relating to finance whilst the Executive Committee supervises the house management. Other Committees are the Building, Public Relations, Gardens and Bowling Green Committees. All have met regularly and members have given time and thought to the many problems that arose during the year.

Mr. Douglas Barnes who has rendered valuable service to the Home since his election to the Board in 1942, resigned in May 1952 on account of the difficulty of attending Board Meetings. Mr. Barnes' resignation was accepted with sincere regret and an appropriate record of his services has been made. Your Board unanimously appointed Mr. Ronald B. Ronaldson to the vacant position.

DEATH OF HIS MAJESTY, KING GEORGE VI.—The British Commonwealth of Nations mourned the death of our King, one who was loved as a man and honoured as a monarch. Your Board on behalf of all associated with the Home, forwarded a message of sympathy to The Queen Mother and the Royal Family.

THE QUEEN ELIZABETH HOME LADIES' AUXILIARY.—Special reference is made to the untiring work of the Ladies' Auxiliary. Our patients are most appreciative of the warm-hearted interest of these good ladies as instanced by the following efforts for which they were responsible. Special teas are provided on festive occasions. Practically all our ambulatory patients are able to attend the annual picnic which is so thoroughly enjoyed. Those unable to attend the picnic are not forgotten—a special tea is provided for them. The Annual Christmas Tree, held on 18th December, was voted the brightest and best for many years. Three Fathers Christmas officiated, distributed a parcel to every inmate, had a few cheery words and a handshake for each bed patient. A special feature was the happy atmosphere created by the "Dame" (Mr. John Sorrell), whose bright conversation and good natured badinage brought many chuckles of sheer enjoyment. On behalf of the patients the Board tenders a grateful "thank you" to the Auxiliary.

BUILDING AND DEVELOPMENT.—The Board's greatest disappointment is the set back to its building programme—Sketch plans for a new block to accommodate paying and ordinary patients, extensions to the Edward Wilson Block with new ambulance entrance, medical officer's clinic, new and larger dispensary etc., have been shelved indefinitely due to the financial position. The need for additional beds for the aged and chronic sick is more urgent than ever and the delay in making any attempt to overcome the lag will cause increasing distress and misery as the years go on. The number of aged and chronic sick is snowballing year by year. Your Board hesitates to voice its apprehension for the future prospects of these who will shortly be reaching retiring age.

MAJOR REPAIRS, RENOVATIONS AND ADDITIONS OF NEW EQUIPMENT.—Insufficiency of funds forced your Board to curtail its repairs and renovating programme and to modify its plans for the installation of new equipment. However, all essential repairs were carried out, good progress was made with the works' programme and a number of urgently required articles of equipment were purchased. Urgent repairs to the small boiler and the installation of a new pump involved the Home in heavy and unexpected expense. The ceilings of the main building have been insulated. During the current year your Board hopes to complete the renovation and refurnishing of No. 3 Dormitory, the construction of an additional toilet block to the Margaret Hoare Ward, replace several worn out beds, instal a new "Autoclave" and construct temporary workshops, and add kitchen equipment to cope with the increased number of meals served.

The Maintenance and Artisan Staffs have had a particularly busy year, and your Board congratulates the Engineer on his capable handling of the various problems and the efficient services rendered by him and his staff.

LAUNDRY MACHINES.—The proposal to establish a Group Laundry has not been abandoned but has, through lack of funds, been temporarily shelved. The normal wash of the Home has increased considerably. The addition of a new tumbler last year relieved the position but a bottle neck in output was caused by the incapacity of the ironer to handle the quantity of flat work. The Deputy Chairman of the Hospitals' and Charities Commission, Mr. C. R. Frencham, accompanied by Mr. J. W. Chadwick, Executive Officer and Mr. Cartwright, a member of the Commission's Laundry Advisory Panel, visited the Home and as an outcome of this visit, authority has been given to order an Armstrong Amazon 54 inches by 120 inches Single Roll Ironer at a cost of £8,028. This machine will be installed in the Home's Laundry pending the erection of the Group Laundry on another site.

HOSPITALS AND CHARITIES COMMISSION.—This report would be incomplete without reference to the sound advice and co-operation which your Board has received from the Commissioners and its officers. Members of the Board have had the privilege of meeting the Chairman of the Commission, Mr. C. L. McVilly, the Deputy Chairman, Mr. C. R. Frencham, and Dr. J. G. Hurley, when they visited The Queen Elizabeth Home and also when representatives of the Board interviewed them at the Commission's offices. Their readiness to discuss problems and their unfailing courtesy and encouragement is appreciated.

LATE DR. WILLIAM AMBROSE SPRING.—For over 25 years an Honorary Medical Officer of the Home and relieving Medical Officer during the war years whilst Dr. Robinson was on service with the R.A.A.F., the late Dr. Spring gave great service to the Home. He was extremely popular with patients and staff, always available in emergencies and kind and understanding in his dealings with his patients. Your Board records its appreciation of the services of a warm hearted and generous personality and extends its sympathy to the late Dr. Spring's relatives.

LATE PERCIVAL S. RICHARDS.—It is with deep regret that your Board records the death of the late Percival S. Richards, of the firm of Messrs. P. S. & G. S. Richards, Honorary Architects to the Home. For very many years the late Mr. P. S. Richards gave freely of his professional talents and much of his leisure to his office of Honorary Architect.

The Board has conveyed its condolences to his widow and family.

PAY BEDS.—During the past ten years many people with means have applied for admission to the Home because it has been impossible for them to gain admission to one of the diminishing number of private homes for aged, and it has been equally impossible to obtain home nursing. The Hospitals' and Charities' Commission has authorised your Board to reserve 36 beds in two bed and four bed wards for the accommodation of paying patients.

PATIENTS AND SPECIAL SERVICES.—In a community of over 600 people, most of whom are unable to leave their beds, there are scores of minor problems and difficulties which to each individual appear tremendous. To the incapacitated and blind—what can I do about my correspondence?—The Home provides a young lady who amongst her varied duties, reads the letters and writes replies. Many would like to do some shopping—small gifts for friends or relatives or articles for their own use. If the kiosk mobile trolley cannot supply, an experienced buyer makes the purchases in Ballarat. Pensions, voting, banking of savings, posting of letters, changing of library books, ordering of periodicals and newspapers. Someone on the staff attends to all these problems.

RELIGIOUS SERVICES.—Our Chaplains and other representatives of various denominations have faithfully attended to the religious life of our inmates. Services in the Chapel have been well attended and great comfort has been given to those who are permanently confined to bed. During the year two very popular clergymen—Canon E. S. Yeo, Anglican Chaplain and Rev. W. D. Smith, Presbyterian Chaplain, resigned on account of their departure from Ballarat. Inmates of all denominations were sorry to lose such kindly friends. Their places have been filled by Rev. F. H. Symonds and Rev. J. A. Moscript, who have already endeared themselves to their charges.

OFFICIAL VISITS.—Your Home was honoured on 15th August, 1951, by a visit from Lt. General Sir John Northcott, K.C.M.G., C.B., M.V.O., Governor of New South Wales and Administrator of the Commonwealth of Australia. His Excellency accompanied by his daughter, made a tour of the Home and grounds and chatted with many of the inmates.

On 19th May, 1952, Dr. C. A. Taylor, Director of Hospitals' Division, Department of Health, New Zealand, made an official inspection of the Home. Dr. Taylor was impressed by our modern buildings and high standard of service.

A few days later your Board had the pleasure of welcoming Dr. Bertram Hutchinson, of the Department of Social Studies, University of Melbourne, who is on a two year visit from England in order to make a survey of conditions of aged people in Victoria. Dr. Hutchinson complimented the President and Board Members on the structure of the buildings, the efficient management, the amenities provided for the Old Folk and the Home's atmosphere of comfort and happiness.

TOP TOWN CONTEST.—His Worship the Mayor of Ballarat, Cr. W. E. Roff, very thoughtfully invited the Queen Elizabeth Home to share with the Ballarat Base Hospital in the proceeds of concerts held in connection with the Top Town Contest.

GARDENS AND GROUNDS.—The gardens, lawns and grounds have never looked more attractive. Many visitors to Ballarat included the Home in their tours of the City. Flowers beds in front of the Home were particularly beautiful about Christmas time and the show of hydrangeas was really magnificent.

BOWLING GREEN AND BOWLING CLUB.—The Bowling Green was in excellent condition during the season and its garden surroundings made this one of the most beautiful spots in Ballarat. Our Head Gardener and his Staff have been complimented on this green and its setting. The Queen Elizabeth Home Bowling Club has had a most satisfactory year. The Club manages its own affairs, elects its own officers and many old chaps have become keen bowlers. Ballarat and District Clubs have visited and have entertained our bowlers who gained more victories than they suffered defeats, a tribute to the patience, tact and encouragement of the Coach, Mr. E. J. Evans.

CONCERTS AND ENTERTAINMENTS—The inmates have enjoyed a number of concerts and revues in addition to the fortnightly concerts arranged by the Ladies' Auxiliary. Talkie programmes have been screened on alternate Wednesdays. There are three major events in the lives of our Old Folk, the Christmas Tree arranged by the Ladies' Auxiliary, the Annual Picnic also arranged by the Auxiliary and the concert and high tea provided by the Presbyterian Fellowship Association.

NURSING SERVICES.—Under the capable direction of the Matron, the trained staff has built up a splendid staff of nursing assistants, skilled in the nursing of aged and chronic sick. The prestige of our nursing staff has never been higher.

NURSING AIDES — TRAINING SCHOOL.—The Hospital and Charities Commission has recently set up a school for the training of Qualified Nursing Aides. This Home has been approved as a training school for Student Nursing Aides.

PRESENTATION OF CERTIFICATES.—Nursing Assistants with two years' practical experience and if recommended by the Matrons of their respective hospitals, were admitted to the Roll of Qualified Nursing Aides. At a ceremony arranged by the Hospitals and Charities Commission held at The Queen Elizabeth Home on 21st February, 1952, the Mayor of Ballarat, Mrs. W. E. Roff, presented certificates to 56 Qualified Aides from several Hospitals outside the metropolitan area. Included in this number were 38 from this Home.

COLLECTOR'S TOURS AND PUBLIC RELATIONS.—The Public Relations' Committee has helped the Collector to plan and has through the office organisation assisted him in extending the scope of his work. Country tours have been systematically organised and the results have been good. Collections within the city itself are also higher. The Board is extremely grateful to the many kind friends who generously responded to the collector's appeals.

CONFERENCE—BENEVOLENT HOME MANAGERS.—A conference of Managers and Accountants of Country Benevolent Homes, was held at The Queen Elizabeth Home on 29th August, 1951. The conference was opened by the President of The Queen Elizabeth Home, who welcomed delegates and official visitors—Col. Eller, President of Victorian Hospitals' Association, Dr. W. Sloss, President of Country Hospitals' Association, Mr. Gaylor, of Department of Social Services, Mr. W. D. Loughlin, Secretary of the Victorian Hospitals' Association and the Country Hospitals' Association, Mr. G. G. Hookey of the Hospitals' and Charities' Commission. The Conference discussed many problems of mutual interest and delegates benefitted greatly by the interchange of ideas.

CATERING.—The procurement, reception, preparation, cooking and distribution of food was recently placed under the direct control of a Catering Officer. The Board is pleased to report that this move has been attended with greater efficiency, better economy and the vastly improved range of wholesome and appetising meals—wastage has been reduced to a negligible minimum.

STAFF.—The efficiency of an Institution depends upon the interest, capability and loyalty of its staff. It is gratifying to record that our staff has given splendid service showing kindness, tact and patience in their dealings with individuals and energy, care and reliability in the performance of their duties whether in administrative, nursing, cleaning, maintenance, domestic or food services. The employment of a domestic supervisor to control and direct all female employees except office, nursing and catering staffs, has resulted in better co-ordination of duties and increased efficiency and output.

GENERAL.—It is impossible to mention every group or department, but your Board feels that it should record its appreciation of the loyal and efficient services rendered by the Staff as a whole and as individuals.

HONORARY OFFICERS.—Your Board records its deep appreciation of the Honorary Services given to our patients by Dr. S. A. Wilson, Hon. Dentist, and Mr. G. B. Services given to our patients by Dr. S. A. Wilson, Honorary Dentist, and Mr. G. B. Cutter, of Messrs. Wastell & Cutter, Honorary Optometrists, and its grateful thanks to our Honorary Architect, Mr. G. S. Richards, and our Honorary Solicitor, Mr. H. G. Morrow, of Messrs. Cuthbert, Morrow, Must & Shaw.

MEDICAL OFFICER.—Dr. Mervyn Robinson, has given regular and sympathetic attention to our patients. His Deputy, Dr. Alex Anderson left Ballarat during the year and Dr. D. Alexander was appointed in his stead. The Board feels that the Home and its inmates are very fortunate in having such attentive and experienced medical attendants.

VISITS.—During the year many kindly people visited the patients, engaged them in friendly conversation, gave them encouragement and sympathy in their afflictions and often handed them little gifts.

Several organisations and societies have official visitors and your Board places on record its appreciation and thanks to all who have helped to brighten the lives of the aged and sick people in the Home. The Ballarat Branch of the Australian Red Cross Society has in the persons of Miss Marjory Glenny (Hospital Visitor) and Miss Betty Brown (Handcrafts Officer) done much to cheer and interest the patients. Our many former Servicemen receive regular gifts of tobacco and cigarettes from Miss Glenny in addition to the magazines, periodicals and papers which she distributes. At Christmas time each ex-Serviceman receives a Red Cross Christmas Parcel.

CONCLUSION.—It is impossible to convey our grateful thanks to all kind friends and supporters individually, but through the medium of this report your Board tenders its thanks and appreciation to all who contributed to the funds or assisted the Home or helped and comforted the inmates.


