



Eighty-Seventh Annual Report of the Board of Management For the Year ended 30th June, 1944

TO THE CONTRIBUTORS.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

The Board of Management has pleasure in presenting its Eighty-Seventh Annual Report and audited Statement of Accounts for the year ended 30th June, 1944.

FINANCE.—The complete and clearly set out statements of all Accounts included in this report makes further comment quite unnecessary. Increases in wages, prices of commodities, etc., were covered by larger Government grants, greater public support, and several very generous donations and legacies. The average annual cost per occupied bed was £79.5, compared with £92.1 for the previous year.

STATISTICAL.—The daily average of inmates was 538.128, and the number of inmates in residence on June 30th, 1944, was 549, an increase of 41 on last year's figures.

There has been a gratifying increase in the contributions and donations from our generous supporters. Last year's figures are given in brackets. Annual Subscriptions, £1,219 (£1,011); Entertainments, £200 (£43); Ballarat Sunday Charity Fund, £146 (£115); Donations in Cash, £894 (£627); Donations in Kind, £139 (£284).

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT.—The undermentioned members of the Board retire by effluxion of time and are eligible for re-election: Messrs. C. N. Eyles, G. H. Hamner, J. Keith, A. W. Nicholson, and the Hon. A. J. Pittard, M.L.C.

In March, 1944, the Government Nominee (Mr. A. R. Hamilton, A.I.C.A.) resigned, owing to the heavy calls upon his time. The Governor-in-Council appointed Mr. K. S. B. Archer, A.I.C.A., as Government Nominee on our Board for a period of three years from 6th March, 1944. Mr. A. W. Nicholson, always a regular supporter of the Home, was elected to the vacant position on the Board.

RENOVATIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS.—Following its policy of keeping the buildings, plant, furnishings and equipment in good repair, the Board through its Building Committee planned the work of our artisan staff. Visitors are always impressed by the good repair, cleanliness, and general appearance of both the new block and the older buildings. Very good progress has also been made with the garden lay-out in front of the main block. By the end of the coming year the building will have an appropriate setting.

It may now be said that our Institution is in satisfactory working order. The process of settling over 550 old and infirm patients into the quiet routine of what is in fact a Hospital for the Infirmary was a gigantic undertaking. That this has been done with a minimum of disorder, and with tender care for the well-being of our charges, is a striking testimony to the capability and forethought of our Manager (Mr. Keith Mackay), our Matron (Miss Mandeville Halls), and our Sub-Matron (Miss M. Zachariah), who were loyally supported by the staff of nursing Sisters and employees in all the departments of this large establishment.

We had an official visit by the Hon. Ian Macfarlan, M.L.A., K.C., Minister of Health and Attorney-General, who was accompanied by the Hon. T. T. Holloway, M.L.A., Deputy Premier and Minister of Education, Dr. Bell Ferguson of the Health Commission, and the Secretary of the Health Department, Mr. W. L. Rowe. At the conclusion of the tour of inspection the visitors expressed their pleasure at the manner in which our old folk are accommodated.

By the courtesy of Cr. A. King, O.B.E., a member of the State Health Commission, Dr. Featonby, the Chairman and the Members of the Commission came to Ballarat to inspect our Home. They were deeply impressed by what they saw and complimented me, as your President, on the appearance of the Home and its equipment, and the evident comfort of the patients.

On 8th September, 1943, we were honoured by an official visit by His Worship the Mayor of Geelong, Cr. Dr. F. H. Wallace, who was accompanied by the Mayoress Mrs. Wallace, and the Acting Town Clerk, Mr. Jas. Anderson and Mrs. Anderson.

His Worship the Mayor has had considerable experience in Hospital work, and he made a close and detailed inspection of all the services we operate. In thanking me for the opportunity of inspecting our Home, Dr. Wallace expressed unbounded pleasure at all he saw. Before leaving he made a handsome donation of £21 to our funds. In addition, on his return to Geelong, he conveyed to Geelong residents his high appreciation of the manner in which the patients under our care are treated.

Reference must be made to the generous donation of £500 from Cr. and Mrs. Percy Baxter, of Drumcondra, Geelong. This handsome gift is highly appreciated by us. Our Board of Management has appointed Cr. and Mrs. Baxter Life Governors of the Home.

Many local organisations have visited the Home throughout the year. These include the Mayor of this city, Cr. J. Pryor, and the Mayoress, Mrs. Martin, accompanied by the Town Clerk, Col. G. F. Morton and Mrs. Morton, and several Councillors and their ladies. The Mayor and Mayoress of Sebastopol, Cr. and Mrs. J. E. Tuppen, the Town Clerk and his wife, Mr. and Mrs. E. M. Wills, and several Councillors and their ladies. The Presidents and Councillors and their ladies of the Shires of Clunes, Grenville, and Buninyong also officially visited the Home. Other visitors included representatives of the Legacy Club, Rotary Club, Apex Club, and Travellers' Social Club.

It was a very special pleasure when we were visited by the President and Members of the Committee of Management of the Melbourne Benevolent Asylum on November 3rd, 1943. Our association with what I may be permitted to call our eldest sister institution has always been agreeable. The President, Mr. E. P. McMaster, and his colleagues did us the honour of highly complimenting us on the arrangement of our building and its equipment.

The Ballarat Charity Community Singers have been actively engaged in helping charitable institutions financially in recent years. As a result of their efforts they made a donation to our funds of £200. In recognition of this fine service the Board has presented Mr. Blackburn, the organiser, with an Honorary Life Governor's Certificate. Mr. Blackburn and his assistant, Mrs. Newitt, have been appointed Life Governors.

Our Public Relations Committee has initiated a Special Appeal, and this is meeting with encouraging support from many organisations in Ballarat. The Special Appeal will be held in September, when it is hoped that citizens will respond freely. Our Institution has not approached the citizens of Ballarat in this way for many years, and a great deal of encouragement has been given already by a number of our good friends in the city and the Ballarat district.

The Ballarat Travellers' Social Club has always been a generous contributor through their annual Gala Charity Appeals to our funds. This body of energetic and original workers are now adding to our indebtedness to them by installing a new Aga Cooking Stove in our kitchen. This will be a useful and much appreciated addition to our equipment. We will, no doubt, have an opportunity to meet the members of the C.T.A. on the occasion of installing this new stove, when there will be an opportunity to personally thank this active and public spirited club. Our thanks are also due to the Travellers for their generous gift of furnishings for the men's Library and Reading Room.

In a report such as this, it is not possible to mention all who have shown their goodwill by gifts of clothing and produce. Will they all please accept our deepest thanks for their expressions of goodwill. Our thanks are due to Sister Zachariah for her sustained efforts in collecting funds for the purpose of improving the appearance of the wards. The Kiosk is one of the outstanding results of her activities, and it is serving a most useful purpose in supplying many extras. It is evident that our inmates greatly appreciate the service given by the Kiosk. The Board has appointed Sister Zachariah a Life Governor in recognition of the sum of £450 resulting from her efforts. The Charity Sunday Annual Collection has, this year, been more than usually successful, and Mr. John Keith was in the happy position of handing to our Home £145, the largest amount received from the Charity Sunday Committee in any one year. Mr. Keith is to be congratulated on this success. The Hon. A. J. Pittard, M.L.C., is Hon. Treasurer of this Committee.

Mr. N. F. Spielvogel, President of the Historical Society, has compiled a history of the Benevolent Home and presented it as a gesture of goodwill. This is a valuable contribution, and it will be printed and circulated among interested persons. Our thanks are due to Mr. Spielvogel.

The Library is now in use and is functioning well. It provides much reading matter which is distributed throughout all the wards as well as among ambulatory inmates. Gifts of books, magazines and papers are greatly appreciated.

The Victorian Hospitals' Association has been of invaluable assistance by enabling us to purchase many of our requirements in food and wearing material, etc., which, during these difficult war years, have become unpurchasable in ordinary trade channels. The Association has fully justified itself and deserves the grateful thanks of us all.

On the conclusion of the war, which we hope will soon be a satisfactory and complete victory, we should be able to approach the proper authorities with the request for permission to change our name to that which has been selected, viz., "Queen Elizabeth's." Possibly the Governor-General designate, H.R.H. the Duke of Gloucester, may be induced to assist in this if an approach is made in the correct manner at the right time.

The spiritual needs of our old folk are cared for by the representatives of the Churches regularly and satisfactorily. The Chapel is appreciated and services are well attended.

The Ladies' Auxiliary continues to give womanly consideration to the men and women in the hospital wards and also to ambulatory inmates. Their services are fully appreciated both by the recipients of their care and also by the Board of Management. It is pleasing to know that the President of the Ladies' Auxiliary, Mrs. P. C. Rees, has recovered from her serious illness, and it is hoped that she may now enjoy good health. Her services in many worthy causes in this city are greatly valued. Mrs. Rees and Mrs. Tompkins continue the monthly concerts, which are eagerly anticipated and enjoyed by the old folk. Mrs. Tompkins has assisted at concerts at the Home regularly for over forty years. The Home is greatly indebted to Mrs. Tompkins. It is also pleasing to record the recovery from a serious illness of Mrs. J. Cole, Immediate Past President and for many years Secretary of the Ladies' Auxiliary; we wish her continued good health.

Our patients and my Board are grateful to the many individuals and organisations such as the Presbyterian Girls' Fellowship, the City Band, the Soldiers' Band, and the Highland Pipe Band and many other good folk whose presence at the Home is always welcome.

The Egg Appeal was again responded to by the pupils of the State Schools. A total of 338 dozen eggs was received and, in the circumstances of the short supply of recent times this donation is of great value.

Our Manager, Mr. Keith Mackay, continues with great good nature, his big task of controlling over 550 aged folk, mostly invalids, and also the financial and clerical work. I have to express the appreciation of the Board of Management and our recognition of his invaluable services. While the staff enjoys regular hours with a day of rest each week, Mr. Mackay is constantly on duty—seven days a week and many nights also. His is an extremely exacting responsibility. Fortunately, he is assisted by an admirable and kindly Matron, Sister Mandeville Halls, and a most enthusiastic Sub-Matron, Sister Zachariah. We are fortunate in the services of our Accountant, Mr. C. C. Fitzgerald, who has an intricate and comprehensive system of accounts under his control. To these and the whole of the staff of Sisters and Nurses, as well as the male and female attendants and employees, I wish to record the Board's acknowledgment of their valued service.

Mr. C. A. Young, our Collector, continues to show tact and efficiency and his returns show satisfactory improvement. This is the more creditable now that transport difficulties prevent country visits. The Board appreciates Mr. Young's efforts.

Mention must be made also of the devoted services of the Medical Officer, Dr. W. A. Spring, whose daily attendance and unremitting care are a source of comfort to the patients as well as to the Management.

The Honorary Staff is always available and place their highly skilled knowledge at our service. Perhaps it may appear invidious to single out any one of the Honorary Officers, but in mentioning Mr. H. G. Morrow, the Honorary Solicitor, I feel justified by reason of the many calls which are made on his time and great legal knowledge. We thank Mr. Morrow for the willing service he so cheerfully gives.

My term of office as President has been greatly helped by the courtesy and loyal co-operation of the Board of Management. I appreciate the great interest all the members of the Board have in the well being of the old folk who are in our care. This is a spirit which can never be obtained by the payment of fees. It is helpful to the patients and the reward, though intangible, is nevertheless very real. I wish the members of the Board of Management to accept my sincere thanks.






