

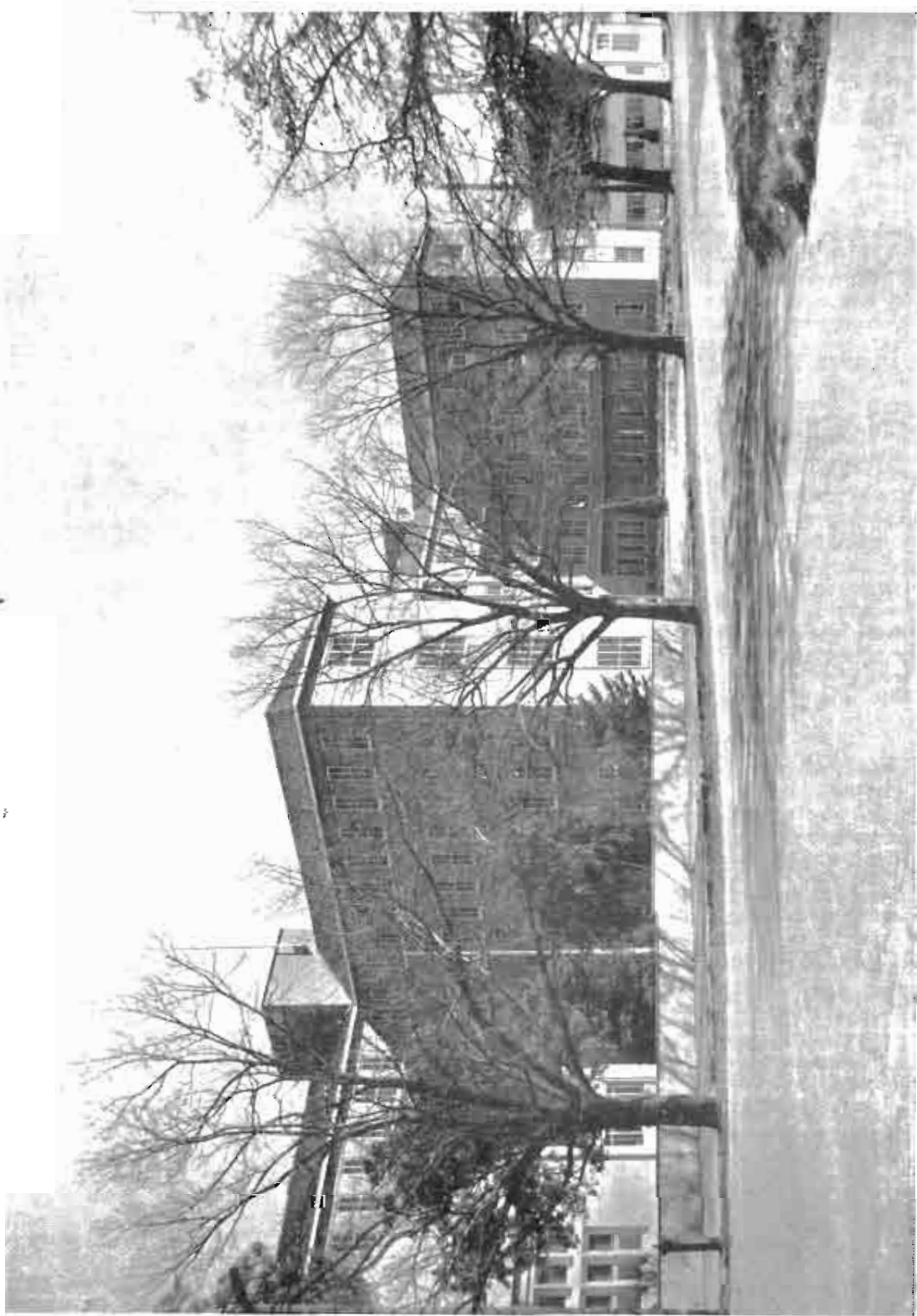

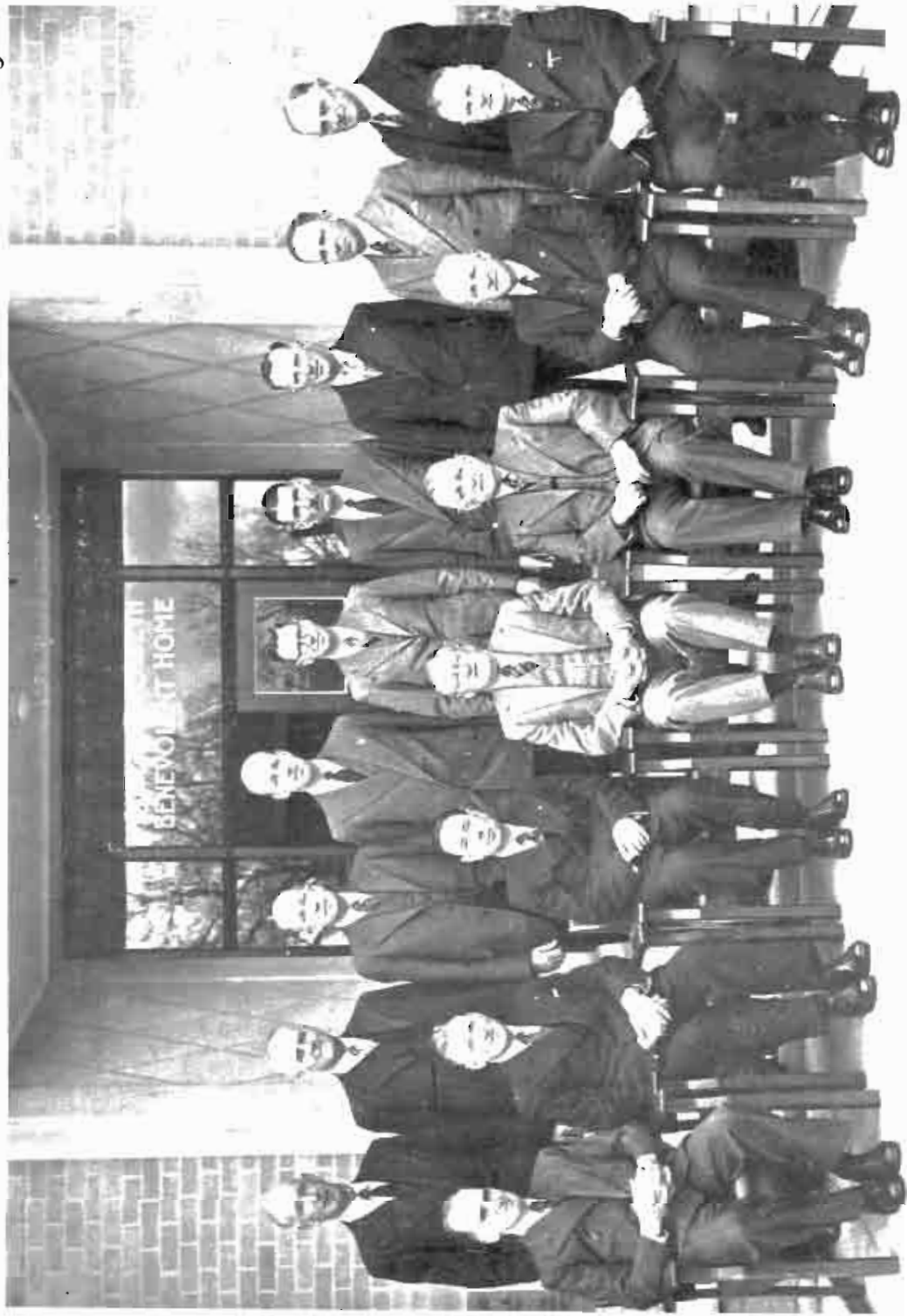

The Ninety-Third Annual Report  
of the  
Board of Management  
For the Year ended 30th June, 1950

TO OUR CONTRIBUTORS.

Ladies and Gentlemen,—

Your Board has pleasure in presenting its Ninety-Third Annual Report on the general development of and community service provided by the Home during the period under review. Our Contributors will remember that the financial year of the Home now ends on 31st March. Accordingly the statements of Accounts submitted with this report cover the year from 1st April, 1949, to 31st March, 1950.

A SURVEY OF THE YEAR'S WORK.

**FINANCIAL.** The statements of accounts set out the position very clearly and there is little need for further amplification. Contributors will notice that in spite of your Board's policy of economy consistent with efficiency and the comfort and welfare of the patients, the average cost per head has increased from 7/9 per day to 8/9 per day. The total ordinary expenditure for the year was £93,151/10/11. This has been brought about mainly by the steady rise in wages and the increased cost of commodities. The total ordinary income amounted to £95,906/17/6 and of this sum £75,337/4/8 was contributed directly or indirectly by Commonwealth or State Governments.

Your Finance Committee is assiduous in the performance of its duties as defined in the By Laws and it views with concern the upward trend in expenditure. The increased cost of commodities is becoming more noticeable and the implementation of penalty rates for week-end duty has still further inflated costs. The income derived directly or indirectly from State and Federal Governments is greater than that of previous years and still further increases will be required to meet the expenditure for the coming year.

Many kind and generous friends have materially helped the Home during the year and the list of contributors is printed at the back of this report. Special mention, however, should be made of the successful efforts on behalf of Charity conducted by the City Bowling Club's Electric Light Tournament Committee and the Ballarat Travellers' Social Club. We also record our grateful appreciation of the contributions of our many annual subscribers and express our satisfaction with the work of our Collector, Mr. C. A. Young, whose total collections have shown steady increases for every year he has been engaged.

**RADIO APPEAL:** The Directors of Ballarat Broadcasters Pty. Ltd. (3BA) have generously offered to sponsor a Radio Appeal for The Queen Elizabeth Home on Sunday, 17th September, 1950. On your behalf the Board expresses grateful thanks to the Managing Director, Mr. J. H. Davcy, O.B.E., and his co-Directors for their kind interest. A preliminary office organisation has been set up and we are confident that this appeal will receive the generous support of residents of the area served so well by this Home.

In order to make citizens better acquainted with the Home and its services a series of Sunday afternoon visits has been inaugurated, and representatives of local organisations and societies invited to attend. Since 30th April, 1950, a weekly average number of 60 persons has been shown through the Home by Board Members. It is felt that these visits will arouse wider interest in the Home.

**PATIENTS:** The By Laws define the objects of the Home as follows:—  
 “(a) To afford charitable relief for the aged or permanently disabled poor or destitute persons, or infirm persons of any age, or persons who, through illness, are unable to provide for themselves, and to secure for all such persons a Home, and afford them lodging, food, clothing and medical treatment, nursing and other necessaries.  
 “(b) To minister according to the means at the disposal of the Home to the necessities of all such persons without regard to their religious belief or nationality.”  
 and your Board has never deviated from its aim to provide for the aged, infirm and chronic sick. Everything possible is being done for the welfare of the Old Folk.

The Queen Elizabeth Home is well equipped, and efficiently staffed so that the inmates may spend the evening of their lives in an atmosphere of comfort, contentment and kindly care.

Your Board receives many letters expressing grateful thanks for the kind treatment of patients and the courteous attention to relatives and friends, and it feels that reference should be made to the reputation that the Home has earned for its service to the Community. This is not due to the efforts of the Board or any individual member of the staff but to that team work and happy relationship which characterises the staff as a whole.

The daily average of occupied beds for the year ended 31st March, 1950, was 578.6 although the planned capacity of the Home is only 500. The accommodation of this extra number of inmates has been made possible only by sacrificing some of the recreation rooms.

**BUILDINGS, PLANT AND EQUIPMENT:** In order that the Home may function efficiently throughout the 24 hours of each day, week after week, year after year, a highly skilled maintenance staff is necessary. The Board is pleased to record that your valuable buildings and equipment are in first-class order and their condition has been favourably commented upon by many official and other visitors. In addition, the maintenance staff has made minor alterations which have added to the comfort of the inmates and convenience of the staff.

The interior of the building has not been neglected and a repainting programme is being followed—ward pantries have been improved by the addition of refrigerators and new stainless steel sinks are now being installed.

The Dictograph intercommunication system referred to in our last report has now been installed. This equipment has increased efficiency, and has eliminated much unnecessary movement on the part of staff. The Night Staff particularly finds the installation very helpful.

**KIOSK:** This Department is a very busy one. A most attractive and spacious cafe has been added by our own staff. This has been admired by visitors and is extremely popular with the old people who can enjoy their morning and afternoon coffee and biscuits under pleasant and comfortable conditions.

**GARDENS AND GROUNDS:** Additional buildings have further encroached upon the limited area formerly available for vegetable culture.

Your Board felt that there was a special need for beautifying the area still available, and most of this has been laid down in lawns or flower beds. The Bowling Green and its surroundings made a beautiful picture during the summer and autumn. The Courtyard between the Ormond Lounge and the Laundry has been laid out in lawns and flower beds and what was formerly a rather drab and depressing area is now a bright and pleasant spot.

**BOWLING CLUB:** The Club has had a successful year. Many of our ambulatory males enjoy the pleasant hours on the bowling green. Members of the staff are supporting and encouraging our bowlers.

It is with deep regret that we refer to the death of the late Mr. D. Stenning, who had been honorary instructor, organiser and friend of the Club since its formation.

#### DEVELOPMENTAL.

**NURSES' HOME ADDITIONS:** Although at times progress was disappointingly slow, the additions to the Nurses' Home are nearing completion. The Buildings and amenities have been thoughtfully planned and the furnishings selected with care. This new block which will provide accommodation for twenty additional resident nurses, is to be named "The George D. Hailey Wing" in appreciation of the legacy bequeathed by the late Mr. George Douglas Hailey.

**NEW WING:** Your Board has strenuously but unsuccessfully pressed for permission to add an additional 250 bed block; however, it has now been encouraged by the Hospitals' and Charities' Commission to plan a new north wing which will contain 100 beds. Much time and thought has been devoted to this proposal, and the Architects have been diligent in producing a series of sketches for consideration. A sketch plan has now been approved by this Board and has been submitted to the Hospitals' and Charities' Commission for approval. This plan envisages the exchange of Edward Wilson male patients with the patients now accommodated in the Margaret Hoare and Argyle Wards, an entrance from Dana Street, and a well planned recreation and garden area for the ambulatory female patients who will be accommodated in the Edward Wilson Ward and the ground floor of the new building. The first and second floors will be designed for infirmary or ambulatory cases according to the demand. The third floor will be constructed as a series of two-roomed suites and bed setting rooms for aged couples. This is, perhaps, experimental, but your Board knows of the very real need for such accommodation and has a very deep sympathy for the aged couples who on entering a Benevolent Home, are perforce, separated. While any further details would be premature at this stage, your Board is confident that approval will be given.

In its previous report reference was made to a long range developmental plan. Your Board is convinced of the urgent need for additional accommodation to meet the future requirements of Ballarat and district. Its Architects are now working upon a general developmental plan which will embody not only the proposed north wing, but also the east and west additions to it, and the final stages of building which will bring the ultimate capacity of the Home to approximately 850 beds.

**THE GROUP LAUNDRY:** The Group Laundry Committee set up by your Board has made intense and exhaustive enquiries into the proposal. Very careful estimates of the output for the years 1955, 1960 and 1970 have been made and various makes of machines inspected and valuable data has been collected. It soon became obvious that the present laundry site would be unsuitable. Under the long range plan, the Group Laundry building will probably be erected on the site of the old bath house north as far as the gardener's hot house. The Boiler House will be extended and additional boilers installed. Workshops will be situated adjacent to the Boiler House and the present laundry will be converted to a store, which being close to the Kitchen, will be a most convenient arrangement. The construction of the laundry and installation of the most modern equipment is urgent and your Board is prepared to accept this work as one of the first priority.

**HOSPITALS AND CHARITIES COMMISSION:** The advice and encouragement given by the Chairman, Mr. C. L. McVilly, and the members of the Commission and its officers are sincerely appreciated. They have all shown a very special interest in our problems. We feel that our hospital and allied service will under their administration, develop along modern and sound lines and that the existing shortages of beds for both acute and chronic cases will soon be overcome.

A Home which accommodates nearly 600 aged, infirm and chronic sick people requires efficient management. It is only those intimately associated with the Home who fully understand the volume of detailed work involved in handling the pensions allowances, managing patients' individual trust funds, dealing with the correspondence which ranges from enquiries regarding a patient's health to matters of policy and building development. The Home has earned a reputation for efficient management and courteous attention to all and your Board congratulates and thanks the Staff for loyal and efficient services. Credit is due to the Administrative Officers, Departmental Heads, and the members of the Staff generally. There has been an absence of staff troubles and the relationships between the management and staff are particularly happy.

#### GENERAL ADMINISTRATION AND MANAGEMENT.

**SEWING ROOM SUPERVISOR:** The sewing department has grown considerably and the work includes hemming new sheets, etc., mending and patching, making of pyjamas, nightgowns, dresses for women, nurses' uniforms, etc. It was decided to appoint a supervisor to control and direct the sewing room staff and the patients' clothes store staff. This arrangement has increased efficiency and effected some economies.

**CATERER:** For some years your Board has felt that the food service could be improved and, with that object in mind, it has appointed a Caterer who will select, order and check all food supplies, supervise its preparation, cooking and distribution, plan a more varied menu and train all employees associated with the preparation, cooking, distribution and serving of food.

**QUEEN ELIZABETH HOME LADIES' AUXILIARY:** Special reference must be made to the wonderfully kind interest of the Ladies' Auxiliary. The great personal interest shown by these good ladies has earned the love and esteem of all the inmates. The Christmas Tree was splendidly organised and each patient received a package of gifts. Mr. J. Keith acted as Santa Claus for the 21st time and the grateful inmates presented him with several framed photographs of the Home. On this occasion, Mr.



Keith was assisted by Messrs. G. B. Cutter and F. J. Hurren. The Annual Picnic was another very special day in the lives of the Old Folk. Glorious weather and an interesting motor tour contributed to the enjoyment. A sumptuous tea wound up a delightful day. Special treats and birthday teas were also provided frequently. For the entertaining of the inmates the Auxiliary donated a Pyrox Wire Recorder. This marvellous machine has enabled patients to hear reproductions of concerts, addresses, talks and greetings in their own wards at convenient times.

#### VICE-REGAL VISIT.

On Thursday, 24th November, 1949, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, General Sir Dallas Brooks, K.C.B., C.M.G., D.S.O., R.M., Lady Brooks and Miss Jeanette Brooks, accompanied by His Excellency's Private Secretary and his Aide (Colonel R. W. Spraggett and Captain Taplin respectively) visited The Queen Elizabeth Home. After the President's welcome and address of loyalty to the Throne, the Board Members and Senior Officers of the Home and their ladies were presented to His Excellency and Lady Brooks. The personality of His Excellency and the charm of Lady Brooks won the hearts of the visitors, staff and patients. Before leaving, Sir Dallas left a recorded message for the patients, and this, although impromptu, is inspiring and shows his very complete understanding of human nature and his warm sympathy for those who are unable to care for themselves. A few months later His Excellency graciously granted his Patronage to the Home, an honour which will give great satisfaction to contributors and friends of the Home.

**OBITUARY:** It is with the deepest regret that your Board records the passing of three Board Members:

*Mr. Lazarus (Will) Lederman* was appointed to the Board in 1902. In 1907 he served as President. He was elected Honorary Treasurer in 1912 and held that office until the date of his death on 2nd March, 1950. The late Mr. Lederman gave wonderful service to the Home and under his wise guidance, reserves were accumulated, which enabled your Board to meet most of its share of the cost of the magnificent buildings which are so much admired. His life was one of service, and his death was deeply regretted.

*The late Hon. A. J. Pittard, C.B.E.*, was appointed to the Board in 1907, served as President in 1914 and was a most enthusiastic member until his death on 16th May, 1950. The late Mr. Pittard had been a member of the Charities Board of Victoria from its inception until it ceased to exist in November, 1948. His kindly nature endeared him to all and he is deeply mourned.

*Mr. E. N. Kent* was elected to the Board in 1939 and served as President in 1947. He was deeply interested in the welfare of the Inmates and progress of the Home and his death on 10th June, 1950, was sincerely regretted.

**NEW BOARD MEMBERS:** During the year, the deaths of three members caused vacancies on your Board and Messrs. W. H. Heinz, Jack Lonsdale and James A. Thomas were temporarily appointed to fill the vacancies. These gentlemen are imbued with the desire to serve their less fortunate fellowmen and they will prove acquisitions to the Board, particularly in the next few years when the major developmental works are in progress.

**HONORARY OFFICERS:** Valuable professional services are given gratuitously by our Honorary Medical Officers, Drs. G. T. James, W. A. Spring and Wm. Sloss. The last named was granted leave of absence during the period of his tour abroad, and his

son, Dr. W. Lister Sloss, was appointed to relieve him. Dr. S. A. Wilson, our Honorary Dentist, has been extremely attentive to the patients and so have our Honorary Optometrists, Messrs. Wastell & Cutter. Mr. H. G. Morrow, Honorary Solicitor, has been called upon for advice and our Honorary Architects, Messrs. P. S. and G. S. Richards, have prepared working drawings for a number of minor building works in an entirely honorary capacity. To all of these gentlemen we tender grateful thanks.

**BY LAWS:** The By Laws of the Institution has been revised and, following approval by the Hospitals' and Charities' Commission, came into operation on 1st February, 1950.

**MEDICAL OFFICER:** Our Medical Officer, Dr. Mervyn Robinson, has been giving sympathetic attention to the patients, and his directions have been faithfully followed by Matron, Sisters and Nursing Staff. Our Dispenser, Mr. J. L. Russell, has given most efficient service.

The Board has approved of the appointment of Dr. A. L. Anderson as Deputy to Dr. M. Robinson to relieve when the latter is on leave or unable to attend at his regular hours.

**NURSING STAFF:** An innovation which has undoubtedly fostered an "esprit de corps" was the presentation of service badges to the members of the nursing staff who had served for longer than 12 months. These were presented by your President, Mr. G. B. Cutter, at a ceremony held in the Amenities' Room, after appropriate addresses were given by the President, Matron and Manager.

**GENERAL WELFARE:** The religious life of the Inmates has not been neglected. Our Chaplains of the Anglican, Methodist, Presbyterian and Roman Catholic Denominations have been most attentive to the religious welfare of the inmates, and Clergymen of other denominations have been equally attentive to members of their denominations. Many groups and religious bodies visit frequently and give spiritual comfort to the inmates and it is with sincere regret that we refer to the fatal accident which befell the late Mr. H. F. Deutscher. Regular services by all have been held in the Chapel.

The Library is functioning very well indeed and your Board expresses its appreciation of the honorary services of Mr. C. W. Murray. To all who have donated books, magazines and periodicals, we also express grateful thanks, for the inmates are most appreciative of these gifts.

The talkie shows and inmates' concerts held on alternate Wednesdays are still very popular. The concerts are organised by the Ladies' Auxiliary with Mrs. R. Page as accompaniste and Mesdames G. Flack and E. Morison as comperes. The latter is on a trip overseas.

In conclusion, your Board desires to gratefully record its appreciation of the help and support so generously given by many benefactors and friends. It faces the coming year confident of continued support and it is encouraged to persevere in its efforts to provide more accommodation for the aged and chronic sick. It is impossible to mention all our friends and supporters in this report, but we conclude by again expressing grateful thanks to all who, in any way, assisted the Board in its service to the old and helpless.

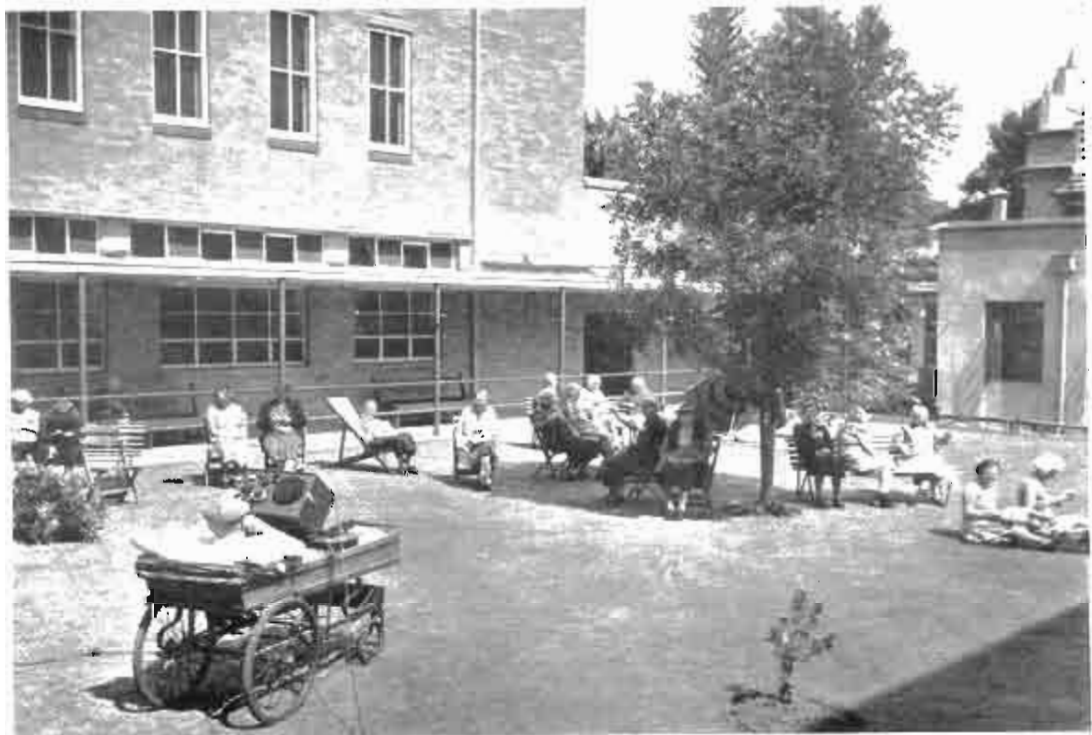
