## Volunteer Workshops August and October

Thank you to all the volunteers who took part in the workshops held in August and October. They were most successful and I was really pleased with the attendance. Outlined here are some tips on Listening skills, which were covered in both the workshops. Given the amount of time we, as volunteers spend with patients, clients, residents and families, I feel it is an important communication skill that we should all strive to develop.

#### FOCUS on LISTENING:

- 1. Stop talking! Let the other person speak and resist the temptation to interrupt. Allow them to finish what they are saying
- 2. Show interest in what the other person is saying
- 3. Listen with your body- eye contact, head nodding, arms open etc
- 4. Try not to form a response while they are talking
- **5.** Ensure the environment is quiet and there are no distractions
- 6. Only give advice when it is requested
- 7. Ask open-ended questions
- **8.** Reflect back to the person- re-phrase what they said to ensure you understood correctly.

# Sexual Harassment Laws now apply to Volunteers

On 1 August 2011 Victorian law about sexual harassment extended to include volunteers. Organisations will have a new responsibility under this law to make it clear to their volunteers that sexual harassment is not acceptable.

#### Rights all round

In the past, sexual harassment laws did not apply in volunteering situations. So if a volunteer was harassed, it was not against the law - even if the same behaviour directed at paid staff might be considered unlawful. All that changed on 1 August 2011 when Victoria's *Equal Opportunity Act 2010* comes into force. Volunteer workers will have **the same rights and protections** as paid employees— even if everyone in an organisation or group is a volunteer themselves.

Of course, this change doesn't just protect volunteers from harassment; it means volunteers too must abide by the law.

#### On your watch

Under the new legislation, every organisation with volunteer workers will be required to make sure volunteers know sexual harassment is **not OK**.

Organisations will need to do what they can to create a culture in which sexual harassment is not acceptable in any form. This includes setting up processes to respond appropriately if it does happen. Organisations that do this will in most cases meet their responsibilities under the legislation. But if you turn a blind eye and harassment occurs, the organisation and the people in charge may be considered **liable**.
